CARDIFF v. NEWPORT

NOTES.

Newport entertain Cardiff at Rodney Parade this afternoon in the second of the season's meetings between the Clubs. Cardiff were worthy winners of the first encounter at Arms Park in October, by 11 points to 3, and there will certainly be a spirited attack on Newport's ground record, this afternoon, where the last visiting success was gained by Cardiff themselves on March 4th, 1950. If Newport have fallen back a little from the remarkable standard they set themselves last season, their playing record to date, with defeats only by Cardiff and Cambridge, is still a very fine one, and to-day's meeting can well inspire the necessary tempo for the greatly anticipated South African match here, in January.

If both sides field as selected, five of the Welsh back division to oppose the South Africans next Saturday will be on view—Bleddyn Williams, Cliff Morgan and Rex Willis in the Cardiff side, and Ken Jones and Malcolm Thomas of the Newport threequarters. It is also interesting to note that not one forward in the Cardiff or Newport teams is included in the Welsh XV, and it must be many years since the latter has not contained at least one man in the pack from either Club. It must be borne in mind, however, that injury alone would have ruled out the selection of R. T. Evans. The Newport Captain has been playing splendid football this season, and there will be general sympathy at the misfortune which loses him another "cap."




