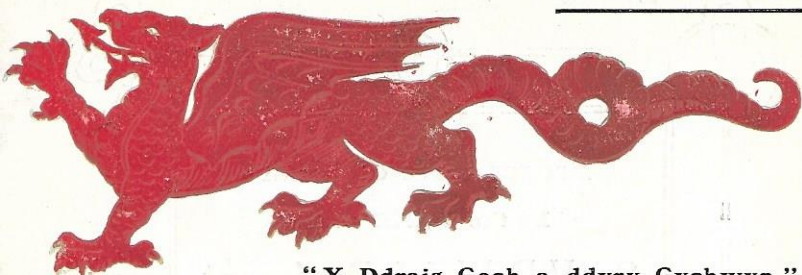


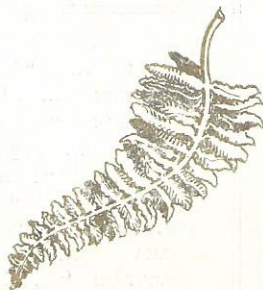

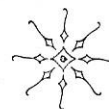


Land of my Fathers.

Men who Pile on Points for New Zealand.

G. Gillett.—The full-back of the team is a fine type of player, cool and unerring, a splendid kick, and sound tackler.

D. M'Gregor.—This three-quarter is very fast, and can run round the majority of backs in New Zealand.

R. G. Deans.—A player in the full vigor of youth, who got the first two tries against Ireland. Despite his weight of 13st. 10lb., Deans is very speedy, and a difficult man to bring down.

W. J. Wallace.—This player may well be bracketed with Arthur Gould as the greatest three-quarter-back that ever wore a football jersey. Wallace plays on the wing, where he shines on attack.

W. J. Stead (Five-eighths).—This is the player who captained the New Zealand team which defeated the British team captained by Bedell-Sivwright last season.

J. Hunter.—A speedy and resourceful player, who makes good openings for his three-quarters, whom he does not neglect with the ball.

J. Roberts (half-back).—The only player chosen for that position in the present team.

J. O'Sullivan.—A convincing forward, who puts plenty of dash into his play, is always on the ball, and never tires.

G. Tyler.—This player will share the honors of the front rank in the scrum. He has been chosen specially for the position. Clever at hooking the ball, he is also good with his feet in the dribbling game.

S. Casey (Ottago) is one of the hookers in the front row. Sturdily built, this player is a good man for the position, in which his duties are to hook the ball in the scrums from the feet of the opposing forwards.

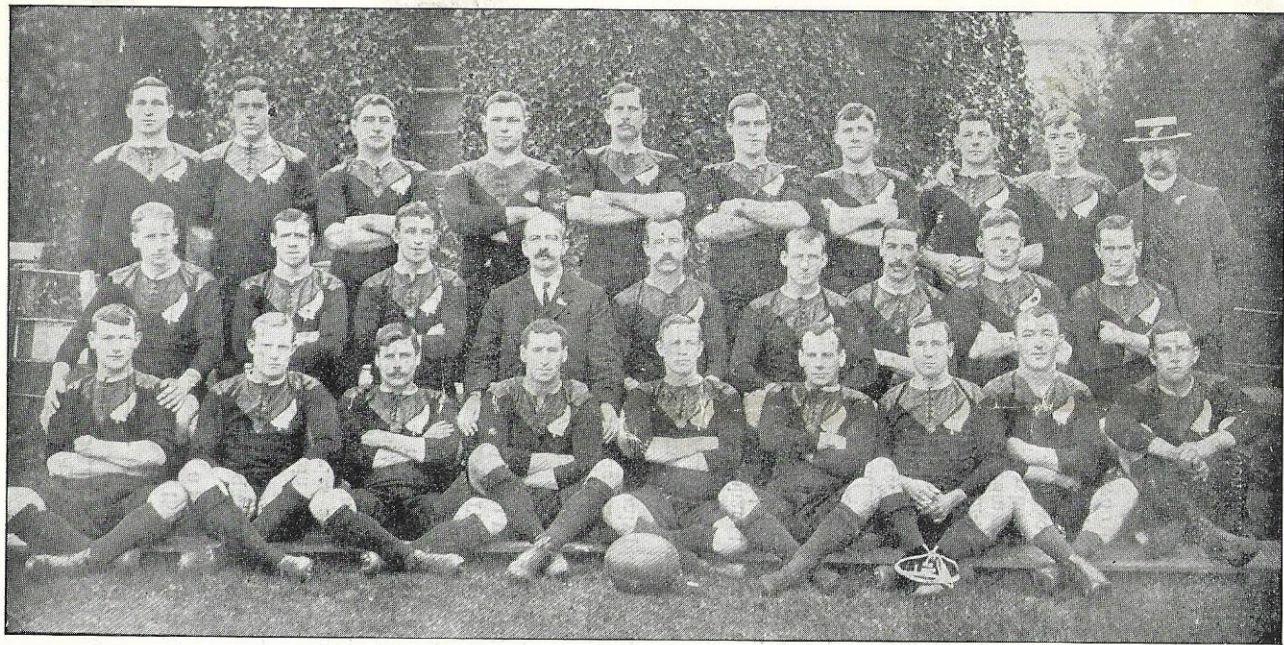
F. Newton.—This is the player who locks the scrum. The heaviest man in the team, 14st. 6lb.

F. Glasgow.—One of the best all-round forwards in the team. Plays a hard game from start to finish.

A. M'Donald.—A player who shines alike in the thick of the play or the loose. Follows up smartly, and is always on the ball.

A. Seeling.—One of the finest all-round forwards in the team, and a player who excels on the line-out, the loose, or the tight.

D. Gallagher.—The wing forward whose methods have caused so much heated discussion in the Rugby world. A powerful forward, and the best winger in the team; a fiery free-lance, whose dart on to the opposing half-back is sudden and unerring, and whose grip is certain.
