

SID JUDD-

AN APPPRECIATION

SID JUDD was a great footballer and a brave man. It is fitting today that his colleagues on the field of play, should honour him by appearing so readily in this attractive match. Like the many thousands of Cardiff followers, they are more than ready to help swell the Memorial Fund, which will ensure that the family will not suffer as a result of Sid's untimely death.

Like his former colleague in the Welsh team, Len Davies, of Llanelly, Sid's career was cut short by tragic illness, just as it was flowering into maturity. He had all the qualities and physical attributes which go to make an outstanding back-row forward. His knowledge of the Game was considerable and his love of good rugby immeasureable.

As a schoolboy he was a "giant," and a real power in the Cardiff High School pack. He soon caught the eye of the Welsh Secondary Schools' selectors and played four times in 1945 and 1946. In the same Secondary Schools side were Glyn Davies, Malcolm Thomas and Clem Thomas. Thus he was hall-marked for senior fame, and soon graduated to the Cardiff Club.

He did his national service in the Army and entered Trinity College, Carmarthen, to qualify as a teacher. It was while he was a student that he was first honoured by Wales against England at Cardiff in January, 1953. He was at once a success and gained ten caps before his illness, then unknown, reduced his extreme mobility and caused him to lose his place.

However, before that occured the Cardiff Club honoured him in 1954-55 with the captaincy of the 1st XV, a job he did well, and it was a just reward for he had served as vice-captain to Rex Willis and Bleddyn Williams in the previous two years. However, it is for his inspired work and play as vice-captain and pack-leader in 1953-54, that Sid will be remembered in the Game. It was a magnificent year for him.

He was a back-row forward in the Cardiff and Welsh XV's which defeated the Fourth "All-Blacks" at the Arms Park. He scored in each match as a result of his brilliant anticipation, and there will be a spot in the "in-goal" area at the Westgate Street end between the posts and the right corner flag which will ever be called "Sid's spot." One great player, R. W. H. "Bob" Scott, of New Zealand, will never forget Sid, the one back row forward who got the better of him.

Few followers fortunate enough to watch these two matches will forget easily the work of the Cardiff pack, and the efforts of Sid under Bleddyn William's command. Such deeds hall-mark great players and Sid was such a man.

Sid fell ill in 1955, but because he had courage, he fought against his illness, and little realised that he was destined to die a young man, he fought to return to the Game he loved. He was told he would never play again, but in 1955-56 he returned to the Athletic XV and actually played for the 1st XV. At the time of his death on February 25th of this year he was an active and hard-working member of the Club committee.

He will be missed by Rugby men everywhere—but never forgotten. An incredibly brave man—a real rugger man.



*HADYN MORRIS.

A real flyer who, if given half a chance this evening will show the "Present" a clean pair of heels!

*DR. JACK MATTHEWS.

Toured with the Lions in 1950 where he was known as the Iron Man. A crash tackler with a tremendous burst of speed.

*REX WILLIS.

The Captain of the Past Team. Toured with the Lions in 1950. If he had kept in training could still have been playing first-class Rugby this season. One of the Club's most loyal and popular members.

STAN BOWES

Stan says they will have to shoot him before he will retire from the game. He now plays for Llandaff where he has imparted a great deal of his knowledge to the youngsters.

*GEOFF BECKINGHAM.
