"Here Come the Scarlets!"

The fame of the Llanelly Rugby Football Club has travelled to all parts of the globe. They are known as the "Scarlets" and the town of Llanelly is known as "Sospan." Thus the three words, "rugger," "scarlets" and "sospan" are synonymous, and they stand for tremendous enthusiasm and a love for the Game which cannot be bettered in any part of the world.

Right down through the years from the days of Harry Bowen and Owen Badger, Llanelly have

been a great force in the Rugby world, experiencing its ups and downs, yet never failing to play the game with traditional fire.

The song "Sospan Fach" which is now the rugby anthem of Wales, was first adopted by Llanelly supporters in the early days and even now in the middle of the twentieth century—the age of speed and a-bombs—the resounding notes of Sospan Fach spread terrors into the hearts of the opponents of Wales on international days.


