



Cardiff v. Ba-baas

The International season in Wales was completed last Saturday with the French team shattering Welsh championship hopes with a surprising but well-deserved victory. Indeed, on the form displayed against Wales one wonders why France did not clear the International board. Their selectors made many changes from the sides beaten by England, Scotland and Ireland and French supporters in Cardiff last week are of the opinion that the changes were long overdue. It was obviously a case of "watch out for France" next season.

Although the Internationals in Wales are finished for the year, to-day sees an International in miniature with the visit of the famous and ever welcome Barbarians, who in their annual tour to South Wales, bring down a galaxy of talent, the cream of the four countries. In fact, we are usually favoured with much more entertaining and light-hearted rugger from this famous side than we can ever hope or expect from

the same players when they appear in their national jerseys.

Cardiff supporters will not readily forget the terrible drubbing inflicted on their side by the Ba-Baas last Easter and will no doubt be eager to see the Blue and Blacks gain their revenge to-day. This will prove a difficult task, for the tourists with fourteen internationals in their team are a most formidable combination. The only uncapped player is Brian Jones, the Newport centre, and we congratulate him on the great honour conferred upon him by being selected to play in such illustrious

With a great pack of forwards, a very effective looking half-back combination and the incisive running of M. F. Phillips, the English centre, we can look forward

to some thrilling touchline dashes by two of the finest wings in the world.

It is unfortunate for Cardiff that Cliff Morgan is not able to play for them owing to a rib injury sustained against France and aggravated in Monday's fixture at Llanelly. This would have been Cliff's last opportunity to play against the Ba-Baas in the Cardiff colours—he will of course be touring with them as a member of the side to visit South Africa at the end of the season. His deputy to-day, Cenydd Williams, is however, playing well and improving with every match, and with brother Lloyd to "nurse" him at the base of the scrum he should do well even against such strong opposition.

The Club entertains its usual visitors on Easter Monday and Tuesday, when the Harlequins and Northampton play on the Arms Park. It would be difficult to find a more interesting and entertaining trio of teams to fill the holiday bill and we hope the weather will be kind to enable us to enjoy to the full this veritable feast of rugger.

Next week the Cardiff side flies to Cornwall for its annual tour and some wellearned relaxation after what has been a very strenuous but successful season.
