The Big Match!


By THE EDITOR.

Cardiff has five internationals on view and Newport three. Both sides are unbeaten at the moment, although Newport drew their first two matches against Penarth and Bristol.


After the match, Newport will set off for Ireland where they will play two matches in a short tour against Lansdowne and Dolphin. May they have a happy trip!


