#### WELCOME TO THE OLD ILLTYDIANS

The strength of Stan Bowes's Athletic XV is enough to daunt the strongest rivals, but Old Illtydians can consider it a compliment to them as one of the leading local rugby clubs. The Illtydians always look forward to their visit to the Arms Park where they endeavour to give as good a display of skilful open football as do the more powerful home team. Certainly if to-day's match follows in the lines of last season's meeting it will be well worth watching.

Of particular interest in to-day's game is the appearance of Gwyn Rowlands, the London Hospitals wing, who appeared in a Welsh and English trial a few seasons ago. On the other wing, too, attention will be focussed on the appearance of Haydn Morris after his weeks of absence. Strongly favoured to gain a place again in the Welsh XV this season, Morris will be keen to reestablish himself in the forefront as a "cap" contender.

Dudley Owen, though formerly a wing forward with Penarth, has been a hooker of considerable ability in his time and it promises to be a grand hooking duel with the Illtydians' skipper "Paddy" Dee, one of the best in district rugger. Again the battle of the half backs promises to be of unusual interest. It is a duel between the Athletic's young and virile pair, Greedy and Marks, who have shown their best form this season, and the Illtydians' experienced men, Edgar Welch, drop goal expert and former Welsh trialist, and Derek Evans, former Penarth captain and centre.
