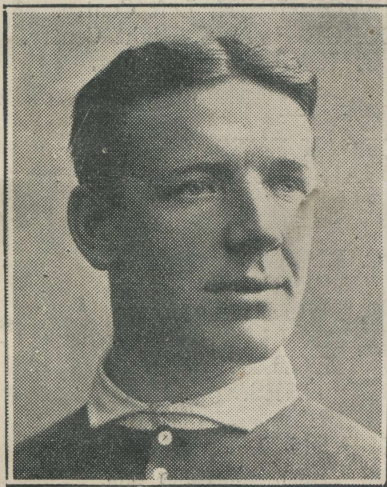

Curiously enough Neath have only won one game on the Park in the past ten years. That was four years ago, when they had a particularly strong side, and won by a penalty goal to nothing.

On the other hand, if I remember rightly, Cardiff have only won twice at Neath in the same period. They were victorious in the first year of Percy Bush's captaincy, and also a month ago.

One of the best forwards in the Past v. Present match was D. Westacott. It was stated by a member of the committee that Westacott is even now only 26 years of age, but as he got his cap eight years ago this is surely wrong. Westacott, I believe, is 31.

We are all sorry to see an old player who has served the club well lose his form, but there is no question that W. Spiller is not playing at his best this season. Now that the committee have placed him on the wing let us hope he will do better. Spiller ought to make a good wing. He has all the qualifications.

Bobby Williams received a slight injury at Gloucester. That was why he didn't turn out in the Past v. Present match.

C. B. Davies was the first choice for the three-quarter line by the Glamorgan County committee on Thursday for the match with Monmouthshire. Davies is undoubtedly a coming three-quarter, but he is not yet the equal of Tom Evans, let the county committee think what they will. Evans' two tries, which saved the faces of the Present team on Wednesday, were of international quality.

ABOUT THE NEATH MEN.

Glyn Gething obtained his Welsh cap against France last season. Most of his performances as custodian, notably that against Newport last Saturday, have reached a high standard of merit.

Owen Hopkins, who deputises T. Owen on the wing for Neath, is a Glyn-Neath forward. But he is a very useful substitute as wing three-quarter, possessing as he does a safe pair of hands and a good "kick." His tackling, too, is above suspicion.

George Evans and T. O. Jones formerly played for Treorchy. They are sound threes, and both dangerous when least expected.

Morgan Rees, formerly performed for Amman United. It has been erroneously stated that he and Tom Jones were club mates for Ammanford. Rees has done some good things this season, vide his clever tries against Llanelly and Newport.

Little but good is Edgar Thomas, the outside half. Off and on he has played several seasons for Neath. His nippy try against Newport last week was one of the best individual features of the match.
