

# CANTON WIPED OUT

## CLEVER CARDIFF RESERVES

### Stan Williams in Form

Cardiff Reserves played their third match of the season on the park this afternoon, their opponents being Canton. Ross, a Senghenydd man, who played in the three-quarter line for the Reserve last Saturday, was to-day given a trial at outside half. Both teams fielded at full strength, and the Reserves, who have not been defeated in the two previous matches, hoped to gain another victory. The teams lined out as follows:—

#### THE GAME.

Jones kicked off for Canton towards the town end. In the opening stages, the reserves played exceedingly well, and for the first ten minutes all the play was in the visitors half. After play had been in progress for about quarter of an hour, Scanlon picked up in the loose, and put in a drop for goal, which, however, fell short, but Police-constable May, who followed up smartly, got possession of the ball, and ran over with a clinking try. Spencer added the extra points. The Canton forwards made several good rushes, but Spencer, the reserves full-back, was always on the spot, and his touch-finding was really excellent. From a scrum in mid-field, Ross got the ball for the Reserves, and transferred to Jones, the latter giving out to Stanley Williams, who ran in fine style along the touch line, beating several men, and scored a really magnificent try. Spencer failed to add the extra points. The Reserves were now playing a much better game than the opposing XV., and kept Canton strictly on the defensive.

It was not long before another nice opening was made by T. Williams, when he gave out to C. B. DAVIES, who ran over with the third try for the Reserves. SPENCER took a kick which was in front of the posts, and easily added the extra points. A few minutes afterwards P.C. May, who was always in the picture, picked up in the loose, and, after a nice round of passing, DAVIES went over with another try. Spencer failed with the kick. The Reserves were showing fine form, and outclassed Canton in every department. On the Canton side there was far too much kicking and too little passing. From the neutral line STANLEY WILLIAMS got the ball, and ran in splendid style along the line, beating man after man, and scored an unconverted try. Immediately following JONES went over with another try, and this time Spencer added the extra point. SCANLON, the skipper of the Reserves, picked up in the loose and ran over, and this point was converted by Spencer.

The remaining scores were got by Ross, Stanley Williams, T. Williams, and Kehoe. SAUNDERS converted the latter.
