**NOTES AND TOPICS**

It is somewhat early to correctly assess the capabilities of the Cardiff side although we have had ample evidence of its potentialities from the results to date with a sequence of four wins (one away at Neath) and a total of 78 points for—18 against—very creditable going indeed for the first month in the first post-war season. And more satisfactory even than a mere win has been the avowed determination of Captain and colleagues alike to play the game in the traditional Cardiff style, thus providing the spectators with those thrills which have won for the Blue and Blacks a reputation which has commanded admiration wherever they play. And after all, that is real rugby is it not?

Today's first post-war encounter between Cardiff and Newport is fraught

with interest and speculation, and it is certainly a severe test for both sides. It will revive that spirit of rivalry for which the pre-war games was pronounced—often too pronounced. We recall great games when the will to win was characterized by that abandon which was a sheer delight to watch. Will that standard be maintained at today's meeting? It is not too much to hope that those great qualities which so helped to win the war, i.e. good comradeship and sportmanship will continue to animate players and supporters alike and that uninterruptedly so that our great manly game may be raised to a higher plane than ever in our midst. Petty differences are best buried in "No man's land." In this direction Cardiff
