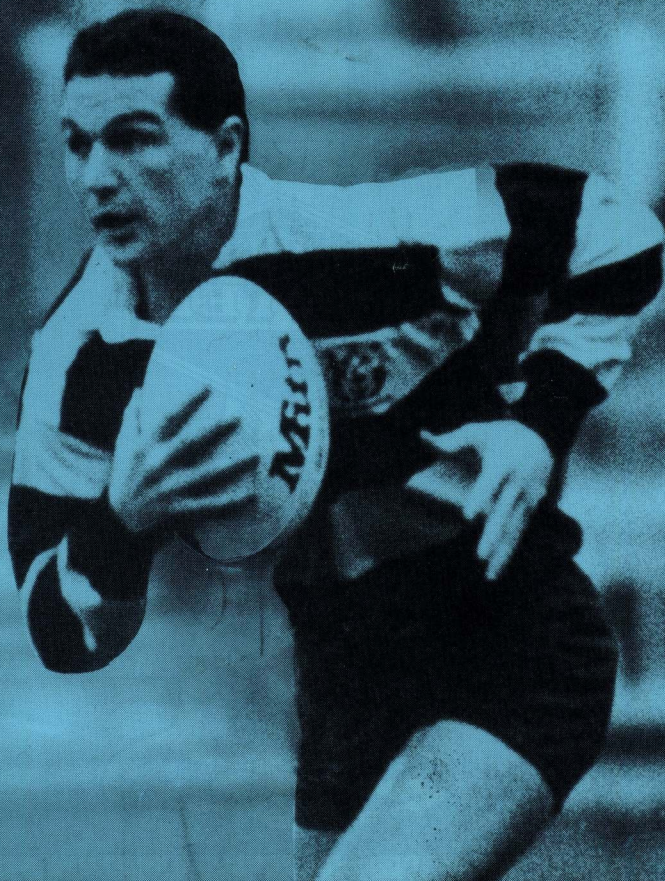

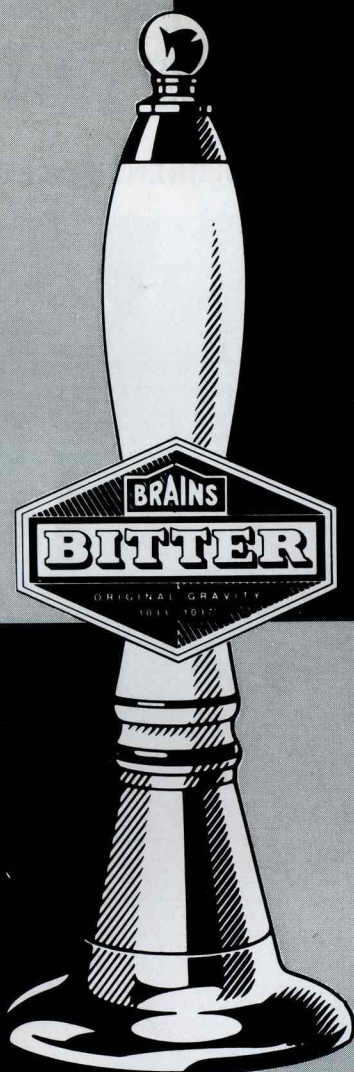

## Cardiff v. Barbarians

SATURDAY 30th MARCH, 1991

KICK-OFF 2.30 p.m.

Today, it gives us the greatest of pleasure to welcome the Baa Baas to Cardiff once again and especially so in this their centenary celebrating year. One hundred years of Barbarian visits will doubtless conjure up many many wonderful reflections on the game and all the marvellous tradition that has ensued.

The timing of today's visit is just a sensation short of being absolutely perfect because the first time the Baa Baas ran out on to the Cardiff Arms Park was on 31st March 1891. It's a shame that the calendar hasn't seen fit to make it the exact one hundred years but one day out in a century isn't bad going.

Danny Davies in his wonderful history of the club chronicled that very first Baa Baas visit as follows: "The 1890-91 season was most notable for the beginning of an unbroken sequence of fixtures with the Barbarians and Cardiff so happily retained until this present day. Both these clubs in their history have done much to create the real spirit, camaraderie and tradition for the game of Rugby and in so doing have gained the respect of the whole rugby world. The Barbarians arrived at Easter time playing the club on the Easter Tuesday 31st March 1891. The match followed those with the powerful Blackheath Club the previous Saturday and New Brighton on Easter Monday. In this founding season of the Barbarians three Cardiff players were made Baa Baas — R. B. Sneet-Escott, D. W. Evans and R. T. Duncan. They played for them against Devonshire on 1st April 1891 all three having played against the Baa Baas at Cardiff on the previous day".

Since those far off days the Cardiff Barbarian association has continued its unbroken sequence to this very day. In all the intervening years a season has never gone by without a Cardiff player representing the famous nomads in at least one of their games. This has all added up to the fact that over 100 Cardiff players have made well over 300 appearances for the Baa Baas. This is surely a record which no other club can claim and we in Cardiff are very proud of it.

Over the last hundred years we have played 106 games in total. For the record we have won 68 to the Baa Baas' 33 with the remaining 5 drawn. We have scored 1652 points to their 1063.

Behind these stark statistics however is hidden an abundance of sheer joy and excitement in conjunction with the type of rugby that has invariably been served up. There has been victory and defeat for both sides but very rarely has their been disappointment because both sides have always endeavoured to keep the ball moving rapidly from hand to hand with scoring tries uppermost in mind. Indeed over the years the term Barbarian style rugby has been coined to describe the fast handling type of game.

We've had more than our fair share of that over countless Easter holiday encounters and to think at one period in our history used to luxuriate in two fixtures a season against them. As we all know their present Easter tour has been somewhat shortened with the Penarth and Newport fixture going by the board. What a store of memories the very word Penarth opens up for generations of Barbarian players though. The old Esplanade hotel became their home over the previous four match tour. Indeed it was something more than a home because proprietress Mrs. King and her staff were tolerance indeed and turned a blind eye to the never ending horseplay that occurred during their stay. The 'Esp' and the Baa Baas had a 70-year association between 1901 and 1971 before the old place

fell to the demolition gang. Nowadays their stay at the Royal Hotel here in Cardiff who I am sure are delighted that they don't have to put up with some of the skylarking that went on in the Esp. (Oh happy memories).

From our point of view however it's the game on Saturday afternoon that matters and we certainly have some marvellous recollections on that score. In all our 106 games there has never been a no score draw and our scoring record is quite remarkable because we have failed to score on only 3 occasions in 1892, 1957 and 1959. For our own part we have managed to keep our line intact on 16 occasions. The highest score achieved by the sides is 40 to the Baa Baas in their 40 points to nil victory in 1957 and 52 to us in the 52-16 win in 1984.

Perhaps of all the marvellous games played however the 1976 game must rank as the most remarkable. Early into the second half we were 24 points to nil down and it looked that the result was a foregone conclusion. Our forwards began to win some decent ball and at last our back line began to move a little. Gareth Edwards scored a try and then Gareth Davies turned on a bit of blue and black magic and tries came from Chris Camilleri, John Davies and Alan Phillips. The Baa Baas had scored another try however and in the dying moments the score stood at 28-26 to the visitors. Gareth Edwards then produced a magnificent drop goal from a quickly rucked ball and to the delight of an ecstatic crowd we had squeezed home by one point 29-28. That certainly is the game that stands out in my memory but there have been many more down through the ages that have given other generations so much enjoyment.

The Baa Baas have been celebrating their centenary year with the great style associated with the club. They have already accounted for Wales and Argentina here in Cardiff and only suffered a very narrow defeat against England by 18 points to 16 at Twickenham. Their celebrations extend into next season when they play Scotland at Murrayfield in September and then they make a short tour to Ireland. Their recent centenary dinner was a glorious occasion and will be well remembered by all who attended. For a club with no ground, no club house, no subscriptions and virtually no money they do a magnificent job in retaining the great traditions of our game. Long may this last and hopefully our association will be as strong and fruitful over the next hundred years as it has been over the past hundred.

To President Mickey Steele-Bodger and all his players and alickadoos we say welcome again to Cardiff and we hope this centenary visit is a particularly enjoyable one.

Let's hope we can repeat the sort of form today that we put on last Saturday against Llanelli and again against Pontypridd last Tuesday. We will certainly need to because the Baa Baas have undoubtedly picked a very strong squad for this Easter visit. No matter what side they put out we will certainly have our work cut out to keep our present four wins on the trot sequence going.

The Rags fell from grace lately with defeats at Blackwood and Bridgend Sports. They regained their winning ways at Pentyrch against Tonyrefail last Monday however when after a very workmanlike display they ran out winners 32-6 in the Glamorgan Silver Ball play offs. They now meet Tondy on April 8th at a venue yet to be decided. After their excellent run in the Schweppes Cup, Tondy and the Rags will provide a very interesting tussle.

The Youth are also well on course for honours. They won their semi-final game against Neath Colts in the Esso Cup by 9 points to 5 and now meet the winners of Pontypool United or Abertillery Youth in the final at The National Stadium on April 17th next. Well done lads your great efforts over the season deserve what we hope will be the ultimate reward.

Finally, today we thank our game sponsor **SCOTTISH AMICABLE** for their support — they are also sponsoring the Barbarians during their Centenary Year. We trust that they and their guests have an enjoyable day.

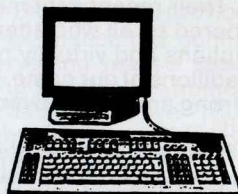

## QUIDNUNC'S COLUMN

IT'S IRONIC, isn't it, that the very moment when Quidnunc sits down to write about Mr President, alias Haydn Wilkins, the victim is sadly stricken with a throat problem. Irony because Haydo, for thus he is known to friends and family — I've searched diligently but failed to find anyone who could even remotely be termed as an enemy — is inevitably associated with singing. We shall have to wait a while to hear again his rendition of 'My Way', which, believe you me, is in greater demand in rugby circles than that provided by Mr Francis Albert Sinatra.

Over the telephone certainly, Mr William Haydn Wilkins currently sounds more like Louis Armstrong — which once more is an ironic twist insofar as 'What a Wonderful World' is another of his hit requests. It will indeed be a final irony if Haydo misses today the wonderful world of the Barbarians — and of Cardiff if the splendid flowing rugby which has produced 13 tries amongst 62 points of the two home games in the past eight days is anything to go by. If you are better and back on duty today, Mr President of Cardiff Athletic Club, welcome back; if not, I am sure we all wish you a speedy recovery.

Haydo was born on Christmas Day (somewhere between 1915 and 1917 though he would rather the exact year was not mentioned) in Neath, a place of which he is proud while viewing with suspicion the aggressive repetitive chant of the name by their current followers. He was educated at (whisper it low) the Gnoll School (before the current hairstyle associated with the Gnoll was in vogue) and at Neath County School (later to become Neath Grammar and then Neath Tertiary College).

He came to Cardiff in 1935 to work for Glamorgan County Council and first became involved with the Athletic Club when he joined the cricket section in 1938. Alas, as with so many promising sportsmen, the career was halted during the crucial years by a German who appreciated the niceties of neither cricket nor rugby football. "I joined the TA in February 1939, went to camp for a month in August 1939 and returned more than six years later," Haydn recalls laconically. There was little scope for sporting expansion at that time for a member of a Royal Engineers technical unit in Cairo, on the Suez Canal and in Italy.

The war over, his cricket contribution to the club was enormous. True, as a utility back, Haydn had a number of first-team rugby games (even scoring a couple of tries in season 1946-47) but the main appearances were with the Rags until broken ribs and collar bone brought an end to rugby football. On the cricket pitch, however, he captained Cardiff for four seasons, played for Glamorgan Seconds, served on the Glamorgan County Cricket Committee and represented Glamorgan on the Test and County Cricket Board for several years (he is a member of the M.C.C.).

One of his big rivals on the cricket field was C. D. Williams, very much a St. Fagans man. "CD" recalls with relish one particular match between the



clubs when Derek came in to bat after Haydn had taken three or four quick wickets with his inswingers. C.D. struck the first two balls he received right down Wilf Wooller's throat. The sad thing for bowler Wilkins, however, is that the redoubtable Wilf was standing well outside the boundary at the time.

Elected to the Cardiff RFC Committee in 1953, Haydn stayed on it for 35 years, serving variously as senior selector, fixtures secretary, hon secretary, hon sec of the Centenary Celebrations and twice chairman. He also served on the CAC management committee for many years, and was CAC chairman for 10 years before being appointed President of the CAC in January this year.

"He is," says his son Alan, who this afternoon is covering the match for BBC Television, "a highly energetic committee man". Yet there's still time for Haydn to pursue other interests. He plays golf (and, indeed, was captain of Radyr Golf Club in 1989), likes a mean game of bowls with such worthies as Wilf Wooller, and manages to supply his family — there's the supportive and long-suffering wife Anne (known as Nan), son Howard and daughter Marian as well as Alan — with constant fresh vegetables from his allotment.

Somewhere along the line also he managed to fit in a professional career as a local government officer, health service officer and, in his copious free time in retirement, did a stint on the parole board at Cardiff Prison.

With his glowing, almost ruddy complexion and the constant twinkle in his eye, Haydn unsurprisingly has been a paternal figure to many of the club's younger players; he won't tell you but it was he who spotted Gerald Davies playing in a Scottish Border sevens tournament while at Loughborough College and was instrumental in bringing him to Cardiff. Gareth Edwards and Barry John also have cause, among others, to say thank you.

Away from rugby, nothing pleases him more than to watch a Western film ("There's no such thing as a bad Western", he is said to have remarked, "only good ones and better ones") and Morecambe and Wise or Laurel and Hardy. He is an avid reader and enjoys a pint or two of beer.

As Cardiff secretary, Haydn was with the Cardiff side which toured Rhodesia in season 1971-72. He, team manager Colin Howe and coach Dai Hayward — the mind boggles, doesn't it? — feel they were a shade fortunate to survive the trip — and not for reasons you might suspect. Haydn sliced deep into the long grass during a game of golf and our intrepid heroes strode confidently after it only to withdraw very smartly when a hostile, hissing snake expressed its venomous disapproval at being disturbed. Nevertheless, Haydn has maintained happy links with Zimbabwe ever since.

It was Colin Howe, in fact, who dubbed our President the Al Bowley of Cardiff Rugby (who he? ask your grandfather), such is the attraction of the voice. One of Haydn's favourites is the Eli Jenkins song from Dylan Thomas's Under Milkwood, entitled Every Morning when I Wake. That title is typical somehow, as with What a Wonderful World. For every morning when Haydn awakes, he finds something worthwhile to do in what he clearly regards as a wonderful world.

## KNOW THE LAWS

**QUESTION 1:** A player taking a penalty kick, holds the ball with both hands, touches it with the foot and passes it out. Should play continue?

**Answer: No.** Law 27 on the Penalty kick is quite specific — **the ball must leave the hands.** The referee should order a scrum, non-offending side's ball. This season, at both international and senior levels, too many players have been allowed to get away with this infringement.

**QUESTION 2:** At a static scrummage the ball is at the flanker's feet. He is in front of the No.8 and the scrummage has not wheeled. He unbinds from the scrummage and picks up the ball. What is the correct decision?

**Answer: Penalty.** The law states that 'he may not play the ball as it emerges if he is in front of the offside line'. This 'offside line' is a line parallel to the goal lines through the hindmost foot of the player's team in the scrummage.

**QUESTION 3:** During a quick throw-in, the thrower-in plays the ball **before** it reaches the five metre line. What would your decision be and why?

**Answer:** It is a quick throw-in and a line-out has not been formed. The referee should **offer the opposition a choice of a throw-in or a scrummage.**

**QUESTION 4:** At a kick off, if the ball travels directly into touch, may the non offending side accept the kick and take a quick throw in? (The Law only refers to a lineout).

**Answer: YES.** It should take place at the half-way line.
