

CARDIFF TEAM IN PARIS.

GOOD COMBINATION TO MEET THE STADE FRANCAIS.

A Cardiff team made up from players of the first and second fifteens will play the Stade Francais in Paris this (Monday) afternoon. Mr. D. L. Evans has been responsible for the organisation of the trip, which was arranged through the good offices of M. George Mergault, of Nantes, who plays for the Cardiff Reserves. The majority of the players left Cardiff on Saturday night, and were joined in London by the members of the premier team who are taking part in the match, and who journeyed down from Leicester after the game in which the blue and blacks lost their record. It was hoped that Percy Bush would be able to make the journey to Paris, but he had already promised to take a team to Penygraig to-day to play a benefit match on behalf of Mr. Moses Jenkins, who has had a long and serious illness, and who was for many years captain of the Penygraig club.
