# Cardiff v. Neath

SATURDAY, 12th SEPTEMBER, 1987 KICK-OFF 3.00 p.m.

Here we go again so it's a welcome, albeit somewhat belated, to season 1987-88. The great Robert Burns certainly knew his onions when he wrote "Nae man can tether time or tide." Even so the speed at which time seems to pass gets progressively faster and faster. It seems but a few weekends ago that Alan Phillips was holding that Schweppes Cup aloft yet again to signify another year's tenure at the Cardiff Club. Incredibly however it was four months ago and what a stupendous four months it has been.

Firstly there was the World Cup with all its implications as to how the old, well established and traditional laws on amateurism will survive the call from some quarters for change. More important at this point in time however is the marvellous contribution to the Welsh cause made by Cardiff's 'Magnificent Seven'. Let's pay tribute to the splendid efforts of Adrian Hadley, Mark Ring, Wally Blackmore, Jeff Whitefoot, Bob Norster, Gareth Roberts and finally Alan Phillips who rose like the mythological phoenix from the ashes of wilderness to put himself right back in contention, just where he belongs.

On the debit side of things however, is Mark Ring's departure. Mark's flair, ingenuity and adventure will be sorely missed and it's sad to see someone who has been so prominent on the Cardiff rugby scene as a schoolboy, youth and senior player leave for fresh fields. Nevertheless we wish Mark good luck in his new venture.

On the credit side of the formula we can feel very happy about the fact that Malcolm Dacey has decided to throw in his lot with us. Malcolm is an extremely versatile player who is very experienced at both club and international level with 15 caps to his credit. His reception and distribution of a fast moving ball is a model for schoolboys to watch. His all round ability and experience to read situations should be invaluable to the expansive type of game we all like to see so much. So it's welcome to Mark Dacey and also all the other new players who hope to establish themselves for the season.

Now to the other changes that have taken place since last season. After two very successful seasons, Alan Phillips has stepped down as captain and the reins have been taken over by Bob Norster. Alan did a great job and the relish and enthusiasm with which Bob accepted the job signalled his intention to carry on in the same manner. He certainly has the credentials for the job. Currently the most senior Welsh international, a British Lion and a great technician in his lock position. Primarily Bob's hopes are to continue our superb cup run but also add a little more consistency to our form outside the cup games. On this score we wish Bob all good luck for a happy and successful period of office.

The Rags have also had a change of captain with Chris Webber taking over from Matthew Hadley. Chris is a very experienced and versatile player and can play anywhere behind the scrum. This is a useful attribute for the Rags captain and will help Chris in his job of keeping the Rags players primed up and knocking on the first team's door. We wish him well for a happy and enjoyable season also.

On the admin side of things Mervyn John continues as Chairman. A change of selection sees John Evans take over from Garry Davies and joins C.D. Williams and John Nelson in the onerous task of getting the teams on the field every week. Another change sees Terry Charles come on to committee now that he has hung up his boots after many years of very dedicated service. He replaces David Havward.

A very disappointing feature and sad break with tradition will be the absence this season, for all but four big games, of St. Albans Band. This is due to the unavailability of musicians on Saturday afternoons. Hopefully it is only a temporary situation and next season they will be back with their pre-match entertainment since their first appearance

in season 1919-20. More of that in a future programme though.

Now on to today's business. It's a rather belated but nonetheless very warm welcome to The Welsh All Blacks — Neath, who are certainly in the headlines these days. After all the ballyhoo of the Jonathan Davies defection come the rumour and counterrumour concerning Stuart Evans. By the time these notes are read we should know one way or the other regarding the latter. If Stuart does decide to depart it would be a hammer blow to Neath even more so than the loss of Jonathan Davies. Neath's drawing power however is quite tremendous and acknowledgement of the fact that 15 man rugby is their constant aim. Testimony of this is confirmed by the fact that all their stand seats had been sold prior to the start of the season. This is an unprecendented situation as stated by Neath's long standing secretary Allan Benjamin. The Neath style is also appealing to players and no fewer than four of the recent under-19 squad to New Zealand have already trained at The Gnoll.

In all we have met on 182 occasions with 110 wins to us and 55 to Neath with 17 drawn games. Points wise we have scored 1,969 to the All Blacks 1,199. No doubt manager Brian Thomas will be urging his boys on today because besides being the rock on which they have floundered in the cup on three occasions in the 1980's, they have to go back to September 1972 to enjoy the taste of victory at The Arms Park. A win here today would certainly put them in good spirits for the long hard season to come. To Neath

Now a happy note to savour. David Hayward that extremely erudite and literary scribe is not completely lost to us. He will be contributing to these notes from time to time which will spare you the labour of reading my scratchings.



# **QUIDNUNC'S COLUMN**

WHAT WITH THE ABERAERON and Cwmtawe Sevens and all, and that other minor event that took place down under, there does not seem to have been a close season this alleged summer. 





# **KNOW THE LAWS**

By J. E. MALCOLM THOMAS

1. QUESTION: Does a scrummage end when the front row of the defending team cross their own goal line, the ball being in the field of play at the feet of the attacking No.8?

NO. The requirement of "a minimum of five men to form ANSWER:

a scrummage" and the "three front row men being in the field of play" is concerned with LAW 20(4) i.e., the formation of a scrummage. It is the ball on or over the

goal line which ends the scrummage.

2. QUESTION: Can a referee disallow a try after the intervention of a touch judge under LAW 26(3), (Misconduct and

Dangerous Play).

YES, after consultation with the touch judge. A penalty ANSWER:

kick after touch judge involvement should be at the

place of infringement and no option given.

Foul play after a try has been awarded should be a penalty at the half-way line on the re-start of the game.
