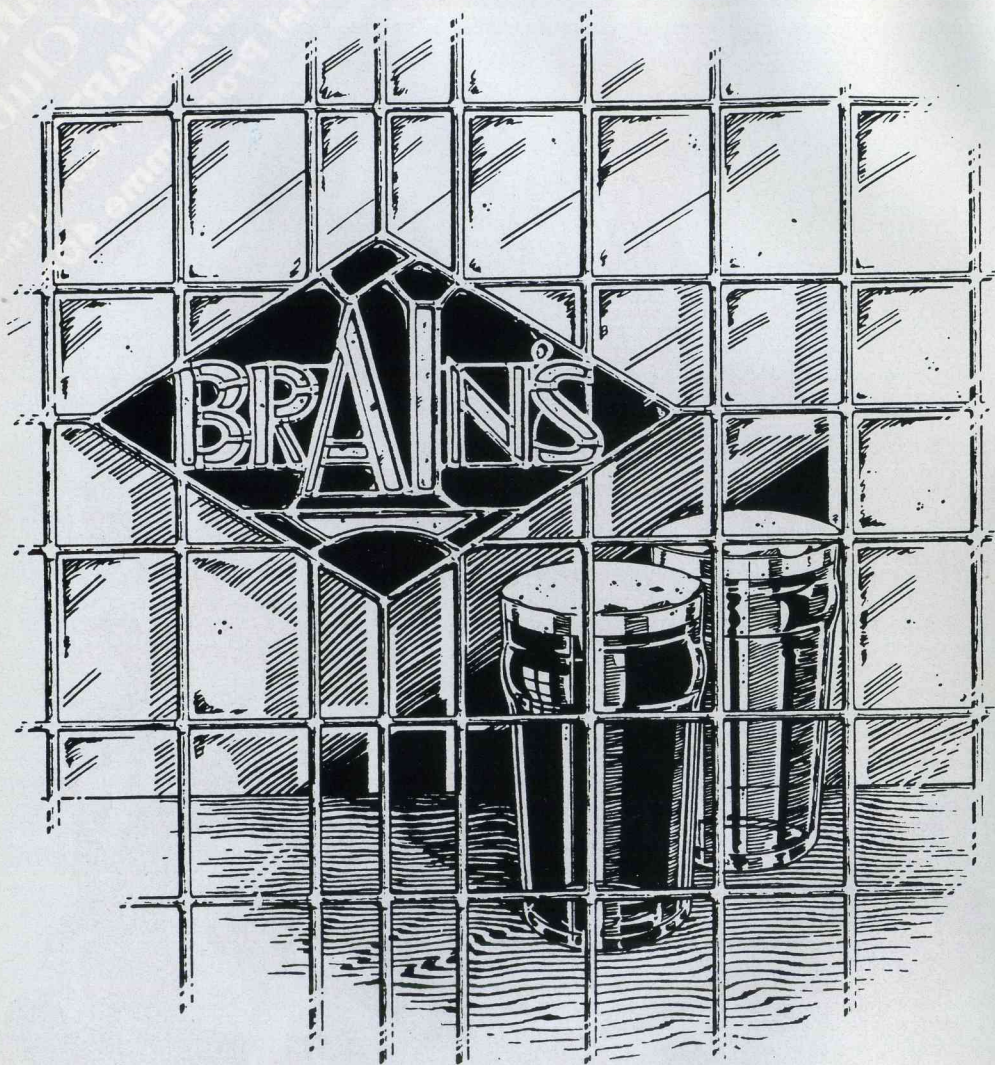

Cardiff v. Penarth

WEDNESDAY, 15th FEBRUARY, 1989

KICK-OFF 7.15 p.m.

By the time these notes are read all will have been revealed on the content of the national side to do battle at Parc des Princes on Saturday. It will mean jubilation for some but misery for others. Let's hope that on the jubilation side we will have cause to rejoice on at least the inclusion of Bob Norster. Bob has now got three games under his belt and hopefully his injury problems are behind him for this season. It will be some return for him however because Paris has become a bit of a nightmare venue for Wales these days. Without aligning with the doom and gloom brigade however it's going to be a tough proposition to come home with a win. Perhaps though, we might be able to capitalise on the French indecision as to whether their tradition running game should prevail or should they again go all out for steam roller domination up front. How a side can have any doubts as to how they should play the game after their second half performance against Ireland is hard to fathom. To score such brilliant tries against an Irish side, 21 points to 9 up, in front of a Dublin crowd showed the flair and artistry of the type of back players that France possesses. Let's hope for the best then because what a boost to the present drooping spirits of Welsh Rugby that a win would be. Also let's hope for Bob Norster's inclusion to keep Cardiff well up in the record stakes. Statistician extraordinary C. R. G. Harris tells me that of 386 games Wales have played in their history, Cardiff have not been represented on only 20 occasions. Now that's not a bad record is it?

The game in Paris on Saturday will be watched with more than usual interest because another defeat will set the scene for an escape from a whitewash when England pay their biennial visit to the National Stadium on March 18th. England will themselves be under close scrutiny in Dublin on Saturday too. Their damp squib performance at Twickenham against Scotland left them a very disappointed side because so much had been expected of them. Indeed if they don't produce the goods against Ireland on Saturday we could well see the England-Wales encounter as one to decide who occupies the basement position in the Five Nations Championship. The mediocrity of the championship to date must be giving the Lions selectors a bit of a headache too. There appear to be very few players around who can be certain of selection and it will be interesting to see if those besieged gentlemen will go outside the National sides to complete their selection.

There is no let up in the pressure however because as soon as Saturday's game is over the quarter Final round of the Schweppes Cup will then be very much in mind. Our particular mission appears to be the Llanharan answer to their prayers. They have a marvellous cup tradition and competition at this stage of the cup is no stranger to them. They have always dreamed of meeting Cardiff on their own patch and now the opportunity has been presented to them they are determined to make the most of it. National live coverage on television will be another boost to their aspirations and will put more pressure on us to produce a tip top performance. Anything less would spell disaster. Our previous encounter in the competition is very well known and it would be only fair to admit that on the occasion we were a very lucky side to survive to compete in the following round. What better motivation could our players want than to put that right by producing a first class performance. A very difficult tie but it could have been infinitely worse, and one which should be within our capability.

On that particular score it was good to see Roger Bidgood back in action last Saturday and we now hope his injury troubles are well and truly behind him. He deserves some good luck now and his return is certainly a big boost.

On to this evening now though when it gives us great pleasure to welcome the men of Donkey Island - Penarth. Tonight will be the 141st encounter between the clubs since the very first in March 1887 some 102 years ago. Of the previous 140 games we have won 121 to Penarth's 9 with the remaining 10 drawn. As you can clearly see Penarth's success rate is nothing to write home about with victory in Cardiff very scarce indeed. It has happened on only four occasions in 1932, 1929, 1912 and 1894. Their 5 other wins came in 1926, 1928, 1931, 1948 and 1957. The latter of that second sequence was the last time they recorded a win.

Penarth have always struggled to maintain a top class side and we in Cardiff are to some extent responsible for such a situation. Any really top class player within their ranks has always found it hard to resist the attraction of a bigger and more successful club. Many players would have made

the journey from Penarth to Cardiff, including the likes of Danny Davies, Frank Trott and John Llewellyn.

One has to admire Penarth however for the sheer tenacity of their make up. It's always a constant strain to field a side but they never fail to do so. Indeed I was looking through The Playfair Welsh Rugby Annual for season 1948-49 the other day and this is what it said about Penarth's season: "Often the club's secretary spent Saturday morning at the telephone plugging the gaps in his side caused by players being unable to make the grade through injuries sustained on the previous Saturday. Yet they always fielded a completed side and were ever ready to help others if possible. An admirable spirit!". An admirable spirit indeed but has anything changed, it doesn't appear that way.

Penarth come tonight in what must be a happy frame of mind for them after their efforts of last Saturday at Newbridge. The home side, one of the best in Wales at the moment, were cock a hoop after their mid week victory over none other than the mighty Neath. They probably thought they were in for an easy ride with Penarth as visitors but an injury try just saw them home by 16-12. Well done Penarth.

To the seaisiders then, we say welcome to The Arms Park once more. We hope you enjoy your visit.

Last Saturday's victory at Newport created a new record in as much as the 31 points scored was the highest number we have scored in something like 180 odd visits. It also beats the best score of 29 that Newport have managed on the Arms Park.

Amongst the Rags' latest victories resulted a very pleasant visit to Llangennech. It was a special game and the side contained some 1st XV players including Bob Norster and Mike Rayer. After the game a portrait of the great R. T. Gabe was presented for hanging in our clubhouse. He was a native of Llangennech who are very proud of his association with their club. We in turn regard him as one of the greats of our club and this portrait will be a very welcomed addition to our portrait gallery.

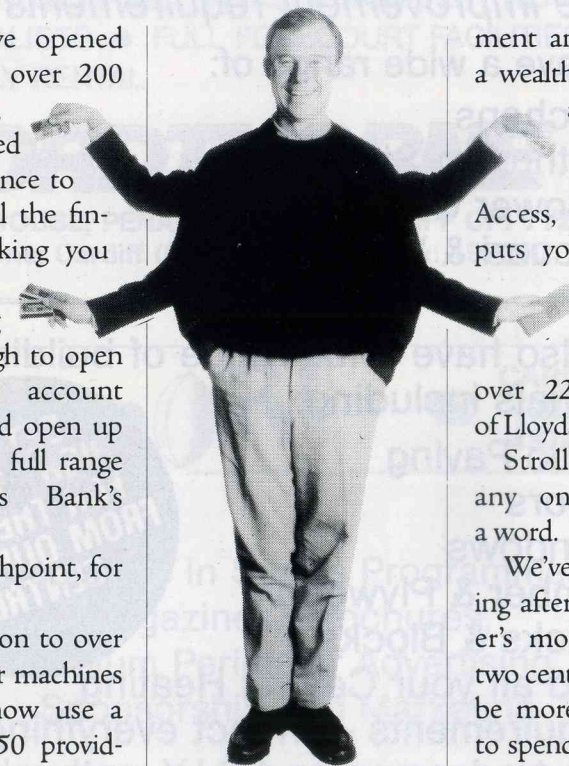

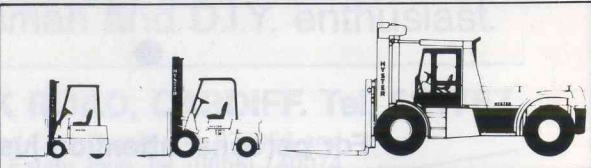

KNOW THE LAWS

KNOCK-ON

With the Wales v. Ireland international still fresh in our minds let us clarify what constitutes a knock-on –

A knock-on occurs when the ball travels forward towards the direction of the opponents' dead-ball line after:

- a player loses possession of it, **or**
- a player propels or strikes it with his hand or arm, **or**
- it strikes a player's hand or arm.

Therefore, in law, the crucial Irish try was scored after a knock-on.

The notes to the law state that a knock-on should not be judged an infringement unless it is clearly so under the law. To thousands it was clear but, unfortunately for Wales, the referee was unsighted or missed it. If there is any doubt, play should be allowed to proceed. This was so and it had a vital effect on the result.

However, the referee was correct in disallowing Paul Thorburn's try in the left hand corner in the first half. Before the fullback crossed, John Devereux juggled with the ball and **regained possession after the ball had touched an Irish defender. It was a knock-on.**

It is **not** a knock-on if "the ball is knocked on one or more times by a player who is in the act of picking it up or losing possession of it, **and is recovered by that player BEFORE it has touched the ground OR another player.**"

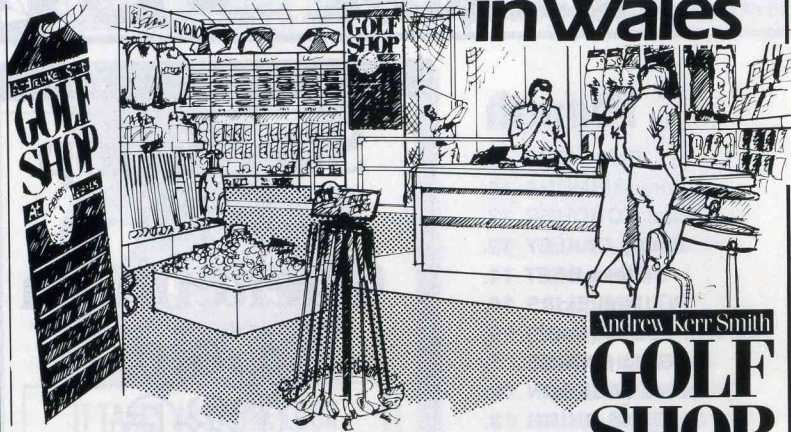

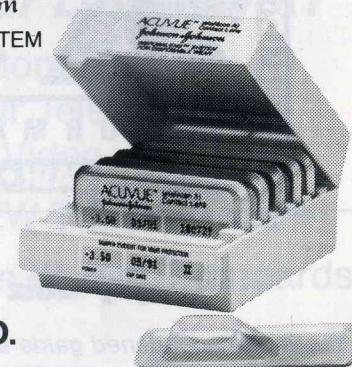

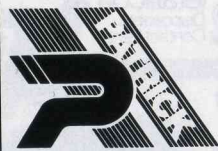

A Look Into The Past

Of Penarth's nine victories in the series perhaps the most famous came in March 1948 at their ground. It was one of Cardiff's greatest ever seasons under the captaincy of Haydn Tanner. Of the 27 games prior to the game only Pontypool had lowered Cardiff's colours.

Although on the day nine of our players were performing for Wales in Ireland the reserve strength was such that victory was still expected. Penarth thought otherwise and won the game 15 points to 6.

All 13 of the following games were won that season to give an overall record of Played: 41; Won: 39; Lost: 2; Drawn: 0; Points For: 803; Against: 161.

Now that's something of Penarth's past that they can really savour with great relish.

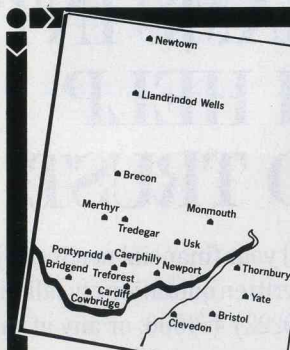
