Know the Laws

The questions yesterday. Here are the answers. All straightforward. Tick them off. See me in the bar if you had them all correct.

- I. The new pitch marking introduced for this season were lines 15 yards in from touch to restrict the length of the line-out.
- 2. You knew the 'in-goal' maximum of 25 yards. Did the minimum make you think? It should have as there just isn't any stipulated. Merely that it should be as near to 25 yards as space permits.
- 3. Of the eight flags usually on the field there can be ten if the dead ball is included, the only ones that have to be on the line are the corner posts where the touchlines and goal lines intersect. This is necessary as the lines are out of play and touching the post means that the ball is dead. In touch in-goal. Where flags are placed to show dead ball these can be on the line where practicable.
- 4. The mandatory distances between the players in the line-outs, new this season are: at least I yard from the next player of his own team in the line-out and a clear space of at least 2 feet between the two lines until the ball leaves the hands of the player throwing in.
- 5 & 6. The occasions when 'Advantage' cannot be allowed are:
 - * When, at a kick off the ball is not kicked from the right place or the right type of kick.
 - * When the ball emerges from either end of the tunnel at a scrum.
 - * When, at a drop out, the kick taken is not a drop.
 - * When a free kick is void.
 - * When the ball or a player carrying it touches the referee.

You were asked to give TWO.

- 7. There is no limit to the number of players forming a scrum providing that the front row does not exceed three.
- 8. The minimum number of players required to form a line-out is two. There is no maximum.
- 9 & 10. The 'Offside' line for a scrum and a ruck is a line parallel to the goal lines through the hindmost foot of the player's team in the scrum and ruck.

The 'Offside' line at a line-out, for those not in the line, is ten yards behind the line of touch or the goal line if that line is nearer than ten yards from the goal line.
