HAYDN MORRIS (Cardiff and Wales)—One of the most prolific of try scorers and one of the fastest wings ever to play for Wales—British Lion.

ALUN THOMAS (Cardiff and Wales)—A fine natural centre; the complete footballer—British Lion.

HARRY MORGAN (Newport and Wales)—A strong thrustful centre who gained his "Blue" at Cambridge.

CARWYN JAMES (Llanelly and Wales)—A brilliant tactical kicker with a defence-splitting sidestep. Famous as a drop-kick expert.

REX WILLIS (Cardiff and Wales)—A world class scrum half. Famed for his long accurate pass and his courage—British Lion.

STAN BOWES (Cardiff and Welsh Trials)—A great scrummager and as tough as teak.

GEOFF. BECKINGHAM (Cardiff and Wales)—A lightning striker of the ball and a fine forward.
