



Cardiff v. Newbridge

WEDNESDAY, 30th OCTOBER, 1985 KICK OFF 7.15 p.m.

It's the end of October and that heralds the beginning of the end of Wednesday night fixtures. With only two to be played in November, it brings some merciful relief to the hard slog of the Saturday-Wednesday pattern that has persisted since the season began and tonight sees us play our 17th game. Many have been saying that this is far too many at this early stage of the season but in terms of quality it is the norm and in fact by this time in season 1983-84 we had 19 games behind us. Having said that however, it has been recognised that we are playing too much rugby and fixture secretary Brian Mark has been given a mandate to prune our list with particular emphasis on reduction of Wednesday evening games. This will prove to be a very difficult job indeed and will also cause much disappointment to some of our present opponents.

There is no doubt about the fact that we would all have liked to see such opposition as Bristol, Bridgend, Pontypool, Bath and Newbridge on Saturday afternoon. The ever increasing difficulty of fixture making however and the particular restriction placed on us with the ever increasing use of the National Ground on Saturdays make this pruning operation to produce a regular and balanced list a very onerous task indeed and one which may take some years to finalise with its fair share of blood, sweat and tears.

Beside the quantity, the quality of rugby in Wales at the moment is also very much under the microscope. The general pattern existing seems to have been reflected in the result of the Wales B last Sunday week when their French counterparts gave our boys a bit of a roasting. What has changed then since only last season. The same players, more or less, are around the same referees as last year when practically every game we saw on the Arms Park was top quality entertainment, indeed some were pure magic. Dare it be said then that what has changed are the laws of the game.

Without doubt, players are finding it hard to become fully acquainted with the new tackle law to know what is within the law and what is not. Referees too are also striving hard to arrive at a uniform interpretation of the changes. Some of the scrummaging I've seen this year leaves a lot to be desired also. Many of the players would need to have shoulder pads in their jerseys bigger than those of Linda Evans in Dynasty in order to bring their shoulders up to the level of their hips. But rest assured however both players and referees are doing their utmost to adapt themselves and maybe before long, with a little tolerance and patience, we will be back to the high entertainment situation of last season and praising the law makers for the changes.

On to tonight now however and we have to be on our toes to reverse the defeats we have suffered on the previous Wednesdays of this month against Bridgend, Pontypool and finally Bath last week. Newbridge, at their best, have achieved some splendid victories this season and none better than a win at The Knoll over Neath. They also had another good win away to Gloucester, whilst at home they have accounted for the likes of Bridgend, South Wales Police and last Saturday a 25-12 win over Maesteg. Consistency seems to have eluded them however and they have gone down to Ebbw Vale, Abertillery, Aberavon, Saracens, Newport and last Wednesday to all conquering Pontypool.

Newbridge are very much infants of our fixture list as we first played each other in 1963. This of course was their halcyon era because in season 1964-65 they won the Welsh Club championship. Even in those days there seemed to be a bit of an interchange of players between our clubs. Names such as Cyril Evans and Les Hewer played for them in the sky blue and black after playing in the cambrige blue and black of Cardiff. Up to the present time this lease lend is continuing and in their ranks are the likes of Peter Goodfellow and Jeff Howells whilst we have been on the receiving end of Terry Shaw and more recently Alan Glasson.

In all we have played Newbridge 17 times of which we have won 12 to their 3 with the remaining two drawn. We have collected 273 points for with 158 against. Over the last few years we have met with fair regularity in the Cup with three encounters over the last four seasons. Of their three wins, one of them came in Cardiff in 1982 when they won by 11 points to 10 so they obviously would like to make it a second tonight. Ex-Cardiff player Peter Goodfellow has now well established himself in their side, is their top scorer with 102 and has made a big contribution to their good wins of late. This was very much so in their come back from the dead situation against South Wales Police when he spearheaded an amazing revival to achieve victory in a game that was looking to slip away from them. So welcome Newbridge, we hope you enjoy a pleasant evening at Cardiff Arms Park.

KNOW THE LAWS

"KICK-OR-KICK"

It is illegal for any player who is not running for the ball wilfully to charge or obstruct an opponent who has just kicked the ball.

The referee should give the non-offending team the option of taking the penalty kick,

- (1) at the place of infringment, or,
- (2) where the ball alights.

If the ball alights in touch, then the mark for the penalty is 15 metres from the touch line through the place where it went into touch.

If the ball alights within 15 metres from the touch line, then the mark for the penalty is also 15 metres from the touch line in line with the place where it alighted.

If the ball alights in-goal, touch-in-goal or over or on the dead ball line, then the mark for the penalty is 5 metres from the goal line on a line parallel to the touch line through the place where it crossed the goal-line or 15 metres from the touch line whichever is the greater.

If the player is obstructed after kicking the ball and **the ball strikes a goal post**, the optional penalty should be awarded where the ball alights after bouncing off the post.

PAST PLAYERS CORNER

EVAN 'IANTO' JONES

lanto Jones is as Cardiff as Queen Street. Born in Llandaff North he attended Hawthorn School until he left at fourteen. He then spent four years at sea before settling in the building industry. Prior to joining Cardiff he earned his spurs with Cardiff and District having played against Cardiff. He joined Cardiff in 1936-37 season and rapidly established himself as a very good wing forward. He won his 'Rags' cap in his first season with the club and then gained his first team cap the following year. His versatility was such that he played in many positions both inside and outside the scrum.

Perhaps his best claim to fame was on 22nd April, 1939 when he was one of the team that won the Middlesex Sevens. It was Cardiff's first venture in Sevens rugby and a particularly fine win considering the expertise and experience of the opposition. The winning side of that day consisted of Wilf Wooler, captain; Gwyn Porter; Graham Hale; W.R. Davies (Cliff's brother); Les Spence; Selby Davies and of course lanto.

The war made a large hole in his rugby career and he served in The Royal Artillery. He played many war time games on the Arms Park and resumed full time at the end of hostilities. In all he played in 55 first team games before finishing in 1946-47.

Where is he to be found these days - not very far away I'm glad to say. He is in fact one of our happy band of doormen in the Club foyer. He guards the downstairs lounge against non members as vigilantly as he hunted outside halves in his playing days. And long may this continue.




