Cardiff v. Wasps

Know the Laws

Back to 'That Game', just for a moment. But merely to look at the way that one of the Laws in particular was used to good effect by Roy Bish in the coaching sessions.

'Line-out'. Back of the line-out, actually. The phase from which the All Blacks have habitually gained so much good possession.

The Laws provide that only two men from each side, the thrower/and opposite number, and the scrum halves/on each side, or a player assuming that position are permitted within the privileged 'non Offside' area — between the 5 yd., line and the touch line and within the 10 yard from line of touch.

On their throw in, Roger Beard came out from the line and assumed a scrum half position at the rear; Gareth came up to protect the front; Wayne Lewis or John Bevan then retired behind that 10 yard line.
