



Cardiff v. Bridgend

WEDNESDAY 17th JANUARY, 1990 KICK-OFF 7.15 p.m.

And so the season grinds remorselessly on with only days left before the start of the Five Nations Championship. By the weekend the red, white and blue tricolours will be very much in evidence around the city as the French invasion gets underway. They certainly know how to add a fair amount of colour and atmosphere to the occasion with their Dax Bands as the real show stoppers. Being the first match of the Welsh challenge however, the weather could well be a factor in deciding the eventual outcome of the game. The French normally revel in the open, running game but if needs be the pack they have selected are more than well equipped to make it a tight and close encounter.

From our own point of view it's great to have so many players actually in the side or on the bench. It's certainly going to make life difficult in establishing a premier division place in the forthcoming launch of the league system however. Take this evening for example. Bridgend are very high on the list of our most attractive fixtures. It's bad enough that the game has to be played other than on a Saturday afternoon but to pile on the agony we have to take the field without our international players. Bridgend may well feel peeved that they have no players at all involved in Saturday's big game but that's another story. It does give them the satisfaction of turning out their best side however which offers them some slight compensation for their omission from national representation.

Once again though it will give our players who are knocking on the door of first team selection the chance of showing their paces. They did us proud last week when Bath paid us a visit. The training week abroad had ravaged both sides but Bath still managed to field five full internationals, four of them in the pack. From the outset it looked as if their strength at forward would carry the day for them. It was the youngest side we had put on the field for many a long day and by sheer guts and dedication proved themselves on the day. In the second half Bath rarely came out of their own half of the field but we were not quite able to turn this pressure into points. In fairness to Bath though they defended their line in a very accomplished manner and a bit more experience amongst our very young back line could have swayed the result our way. All things considered though a draw was a good result inasmuch as so many first choice players were missing from the side. A very heartening aspect too was the fact that during the last stages of the game our fitness looked quite a bit better than Bath's and by the final whistle they too were pleased to have escaped defeat and settled for the draw.

With the league system looking very much on for next season it is going to be quite a problem to fix up with English clubs in the future. At this point in time, the Saturdays designated to league encounters will see 14 games played before the end of December and 4 more after. This means we will have to try to rearrange fixtures with the likes of Coventry, Wasps, Cambridge University, Leicester, London Welsh and Harlequins all of whom we should be playing on Saturdays which have now been allocated to league games. There will be only four Saturdays up to the end of December in which to arrange other than league games. You can well imagine then the scramble that will take place between the

Welsh and English clubs to fill these free Saturdays. Who'd be a fixture secretary?

And so on to tonight then when the Cardiff-Bridgend series reaches 127 games. The record of the previous 126 reads 61 to us, 52 to Bridgend with the remaining 13 drawn. Points-wise we have scored 1245 to 1083 against. Considering the first time we played was way back in 1881, 126 games is relatively small. This is due to the fact that between the first ever encounter and 1950, 69 years, we met on only 43 occasions. Since 1950, some 40 years, we have played on a far more regular basis with a total of 83 games ensuing.

In studying the statistics it reveals that Bridgend have just about the best record of any club we play on a regular basis. They are only 9 games behind us in terms of victories. To break through that barrier would be quite an achievement for

them because no other club has managed such a feat.

During the series the best run of success was achieved by us when we won eight games on the trot between 1953 and 1958. Bridgend's best run came with a seven in a row winning sequence between 1978 and 1981. The highest number of points we have scored is 39 whilst Bridgend's best is 34. We have crossed swords on five occasions in the Schweppes Cup with us winning four of those clashes.

At present Bridgend are on a good run having chalked up three good wins against Gloucester, Glamorgan Wanderers and Abertillery since their Boxing Day defeat at Maesteg. Indeed their game against Abertillery last Saturday was a real cracker and had the crowd yelling for more. Our own trip to the Brewery Field at Christmas time ended with a home victory by 21 points to 10. Unfortunately we were below strength again on that occasion due to injuries and unavailability. This is one problem that the proposed league system will certainly sort out. There will be nothing to interfere with the Saturdays scheduled for league fixtures.

Bridgend's overall record for their season reads 20 wins from 28 starts and they have scored 744 points which includes 114 tries. No doubt they will bring as strong a side as they can for tonight's encounter. A win for them tonight will give them the double for the season and reduce the small margin of victories against defeats even further. A repeat of the spirit shown by those who did battle against Bath however will ensure that Bridgend will have quite a fight on their hands. So to our visitors tonight we say welcome to the Arms Park once again, we hope you enjoy the occasion.

Bob Lakin's Rags side have started the New Year in the best possible fashion. Although still without Bob's guiding influence as he is still on the walking wounded list they have recorded two outstanding wins. After the disappointment of one point defeats by Bath, Bridgend Ravens and Rumney they have really hit top form. Firstly last Saturday week they went to Bath and recorded a great 20 points to 4 victory over the West Country side's second team. It was the first taste of defeat that the home side had experienced this season. Then last Saturday they really turned the screw on the always very useful Neath Athletic and ran out winners to the tune of 43 points to 3. It was a great game and hearteningly well attended by a very appreciative crowd who saw some glorious tries scored. Indeed had we seen the likes in an international match they would have brought the house down. And all this from a comparatively young side augurs well for the future.

Finally tonight we would like to thank **Brains Brewery** for their generous sponsorship of tonight's game. We trust that they and their guests have a very enjoyable evening.

KNOW THE LAWS

OBSERVATIONS ON THE FIRST HALF OF THE SEASON

- 1. Not all referees are blowing up immediately a scrummage collapses and the ball is often allowed to be played out of the back of a collapsed scrummage. Referees must blow immediately in order to award a rescrummage or a penalty, even if the ball is emerging. Safety of the players is paramount.
- 2. Referees should not whistle for a rescrummage if a scrum has wheeled only 90° and is still moving while the ball is being played out. The Law requires that the scrum must wheel more than 90° before the referee orders a rescrummage. The intention of this Law change is to provide safety in the scrummage and referees should bear this in mind whilst refereeing the wheeling and picking out, sympathetically and consistently.
- 3. Many players are taking a tapped penalty while opponents are in close proximity and retiring as required. In their haste they are failing to kick the ball as required and referees are reminded that the ball must be kicked a visible distance even if the hand is held on it. It cannot be merely tapped onto the foot while held in both hands. For such an infringement the referee should award a scrummage at the mark.

QUIDNUNC'S COLUMN

IF ALAN PHILLIPS ever has cause to seek a method of winding up Mr Stuart Arthur Nunnerley to a height of motivated anger, he has merely to murmur one magic word; "Tomatoes". The giant, Pontypool-born lock — he's 6ft 4" and weighs 17 stone 10 — tends to become very agitated at the mention of this innocent fruit.

Big Stuart, known variously as Nunners, Nuns or more emotively as Fatso, cannot bear the sight of them, a phobia which goes back to the couple of seasons he spent playing for Pakuranga and College Rifles in New Zealand. "I spent so long picking tomatoes to earn money out there," he explains, "that I am allergic to them". The result is that he believes that all greenhouses should be abolished and that gardening of any kind should be done only by his father.

This anger comes as a surprise because the big man — Heavy Kev Edwards regards him as a personal clone — is a bit of a gentle giant in many respects: current and former teammates are only half-joking when they call him the No.1 sleeper. He'll doze at the drop of a hat — when he is not, that is, finding a good excuse, like a suspect ankle or twinging muscle, during a particularly gruelling training session.

"Alan Phillips is unfortunately aware of this," he has told friends, "and tends not to sympathise. I think he also tends to have a go at me, affectionately of course,

because I am from the valleys".

The subject for this evening's brief symposium and cartoon, fresh from scoring a try at Aberavon on Saturday, is indeed a man of the Gwent valleys, born in Pontypool on January 5 twenty-six years ago, educated at Abersychon Secondary School and living in Pontnewynydd. Married to Hayley, with a 10 month-old son Sion, his first rugby successes came with Garndiffaith Youth when they won the Gwent Youth Cup and he then moved on to Talywain before joining Abertillery for whom he played more than 200 matches.

It was during his happy time there that he also had his worst rugby moment: defeat at Nantyffyllon in a Schweppes Cup match — which makes Stuart even more determined, if selected, to help Cardiff put a stop to Llanelli's ambitions in this area a week on Saturday. On this subject, incidentally, it's good to hear and feel the quiet optimism of Cardiff's players about this match. Not surprisingly, Stuart Nunnerley's

rugby ambitions are to win a Welsh cap and a cup-winner's medal.

While saying that the biggest influence on his career to date has been Richard Tillings, the former Abertillery coach, he admits to regarding Geoff Wheel as his favourite player. "I want," he says, "to be a ripper as well as a mauler, a ball carrier as well as a ball winner". Ironically, he learned much about mauling in New Zealand; while the northern hemisphere was trying to catch up with New Zealand rucking skills, they had moved on apace, keeping ball in hand and staying on their feet.

Off the field, when he's not eating very hot curries, spaghetti bolognaise or gammon mash and parsley sauce, driving his father's car, dreaming about holidays in Tenerife, listening to U2 and waiting for the chance to sing for his new Cardiff colleagues Simon and Garfunkel's The Boxer, he keeps a fairly low profile. A couple of lagers on a Saturday night after a match are the extent of his drinking habits: he's much more likely to be found on the weights in Peter Lawlor's gym with some of the Pontypool players than he is in the Bell or the Forge Hammer Inn. And, one of these days, he's going to be a mean golfer.

And, if he's playing tonight, Stuart Nunnerley is quite likely to make some kind of impact even before the referee starts the match. His major superstition, that of being second out on to the pitch, is shared by others; Nunners is likely to be involved in some barging in the line-up to ensure that he is at the skipper's elbow as

Cardiff take to the field.


Let's hope he's thereabouts also when the Cup is handed over next May.
