



Cardiff v. Llandovery

SATURDAY, 10th FEBRUARY, 1990 KICK-OFF 3.00 p.m.

The Schweppes Cup is certainly a trophy that can create elation one minute and then a kick in the teeth in the next. Take our own situation at this point in time. After the great and very satisfying win against Llanelli a fortnight ago we now find ourselves in the disappointing situation of not being able to play Newport today. As our oldest and most played opponents these games are always eagerly anticipated and usually generate a special kind of atmosphere. Their twice delayed tie in The Schweppes Cup however takes precedence so hopefully we will be entertaining The Black and Ambers later on in the season. This will not be easily arranged however because last Saturday's game at Ebbw Vale which fell foul to the weather also needs re-arrangement.

It was no easy task either to get a game hurriedly arranged for this afternoon. The RFU cup ties this afternoon left several English clubs at a loose end but they had all rearranged prior to Newport's second washout last Saturday. Accordingly we were very pleased when West Wales club Llandovery said they

would be only too pleased to plug the gap.

A quick look into our records show that although Llandovery are one of the founder member clubs of the WRU we have not met at first team level prior to today. Indeed the first Welsh XV to be fielded after the WRU was established in 1881 contained two Llandovery players — E.J. Lewis and T.A. Rees. The records do show however that we did meet Llandovery College on one occasion when we clashed in the old South Wales Challenge Cup in 1879.

At present Llandovery are in fifth position of Section A of the West Wales League having won promotion from Section B this season. They are very keen to maintain this position or even climb the table because the top five clubs will be part of National Leagues when they are introduced next year.

The Schweppes Cup have given them the opportunity of a crack at the big guns and indeed their victory over Pontypridd in the second round of the 1984-85 competition ranks amongst their most memorable victories. This year they lost to Bridgend in the last round but still it gave them the satisfaction of being in the last 16 for the first time.

Present day top players who were once associated with the club are plentiful but perhaps the best known are Carwyn Davies of Llanelli and Aled Williams of Bridgend. The latter of these is the son of the president of Llandovery Dr Tyssul Williams.

To Llandovery then we extend a very warm and grateful welcome for filling in at such short notice. Due to extenuating circumstances today's programme is a rather abridged version but it in no way dilutes our thanks and welcome to Llandovery. We sincerely hope that everyone who journeys to Cardiff today will enjoy their visit

Finally today I'm sure you would all like to wish Dai Young every success in his new career. His stay at Cardiff wasn't all that long but his contribution was enormous. What a great pity he could not have stayed until after our next cup round. Although only 22 he was renowned the world over and for a prop, that's amazing. To Dai then we say all the very best of luck both on and off the field in your pastures new.
