



## Cardiff v. Nottingham

SATURDAY 7th APRIL, 1990 KICK-OFF 4.00 p.m.

Will Welsh Rugby ever get back to normality after what has been one of the most traumatic seasons in its long history? Our own season has followed on much the same lines. After our very creditable performance against the exceptionally strong New Zealand tourists we had fair reason to believe that a good season would ensue. Unfortunately however injury, unavailability and a score of other circumstances have now contrived to put us in the situation whereby it looks as if we are about to suffer our worst season since the war. Let's hope the Richie Collins injury sustained in Hong Kong last weekend is not about to become another miserable statistic in this season of disappointment.

Today is yet another example of the unforseen niggles which have beset us all year. This afternoon's game with Division One English opponents Nottingham should have had the undivided attention of the Cardiff public. Our governing body saw fit to stage one of the cup semi finals next door however so it means we had to push our kick off back an hour to 4 O'Clock. It's the first time we have played on our ground straight after one on the National Ground so it will be interesting to see how the arrangements cope with the situation.

Last Saturday's game against Llanelli provided some very good moments but unfortunately these were outweighed by the poorer periods of play from both sides. Richard Jones suffered a groin injury which could side line him for the remainder of the season. So with Mike Rayer also out Ceri Thomas will probably fill the bill at full back. It was good to see Ceri along with Matthew de Maid and Tony Orrell play in the Wales under 21 game last Wednesday, well done lads. It's also congratulations to Mike Griffiths on his selection for the British side against the Rest of Europe for the Rumanian Appeal Fund. Mike has done well in being seen as one of only two Welshmen in the side.

Life goes on however and today we are very pleased to welcome Nottingham to the Arms Park for only their second visit to our ground. The series is just 3 games old — the first coming in Nottingham in March 1988 which they won by the odd point 16-15. The next came very quickly the following month — April 1988 on the Arms Park. That ended in a home victory 23-12. The third game came in Nottingham in April 1989 which they won 18-12.

Nottingham then have a very unique record because I can't think of any other club side who have beaten us more than we have beaten them. This record of played 3 won 2 and lost 1 give them that distinction

and victory for them today could stretch that a little further. Unfortunately though it looks as if the series will come to an abrupt end this afternoon because our League commitments next year will see several of the English clubs disappear from our list. This is all very unsatisfactory but inevitable.


Nottingham has put itself on the rugby map of late and last season they finished in fourth position in Division One. This was a good improvement on the English League's inaugural year 1987-88 when they finished in 8th position. This year their grip has slipped a little and their present record of 5 wins and 5 defeats from their 10 games played sees them in 7th position. They must have been disappointed to lose their first two League games against Rosslyn Park and Bristol both of whom are now below them in the table. Their other 3 defeats came at the hands of Leicester away, Wasps away and Orrell at home. Their wins have come against Saracens home, Bedford home, Moseley away (those latter two sides have now suffered relegation to Division 2) but recently and far more creditably they have achieved excellent wins over Bath home and last Saturday over Harlequins in London.

They have a tough job on their hands in their last League game of the season when they entertain front runners Gloucester in Nottingham. Although the game will be only a week before the Cherries Twickenham cup final against Bath, Gloucester will need a victory to claim a cup and league double. In those circumstances Gloucester will probably field their best side so it would be a big feather in Nottingham's cap if they could also claim the scalp of the other cup finalists. It should be some game.

Nottingham have cause to be very happy about their involvement at national level too. With Brian Moore and Simon Hodgkinson ever present in the England side and Chris Gray doing likewise for Scotland they had a foot in two camps. There was, no doubt, some good old fashioned leg pulling going on about that Murrayfield encounter in the Nottingham dressing room since Scotland's epic victory.

To Nottingham then we say you are very welcome visitors to Cardiff Arms Park, we hope you enjoy your afternoon out. We certainly hope our brief encounter will not end today and that we can meet again in the not too distant future.

Can you really believe that it's nearly Easter again? And of course that means the BaaBaas are our next visitors. We will also be repeating our festival day once again on Easter Monday. The emphasis will again focus on youth with Cardiff under 14s and 15s, will play against the counterparts from Bristol while the under 16 side will play Nottingham. The U14 game will take place at Blackwier while the U15 and U16 games will be played on the Park prior to our game against South Glamorgan Institute. It should be a smashing day out.

## **KNOW THE LAWS**

#### SITUATION 'A'

Are players running back allowed to play the ball which has just been released by opposing players?

In open play, in this situation, there is no off-side.

But if a Ruck or Maul was formed the player running back to get on-side cannot interfere with the ball until an opponent has:

EITHER run five metres with the ball, OR kicked the ball.

Remember, that, in this instance a pass does not put the player on-side.

#### SITUATION 'B'

A Welsh player is tackled by an Irish player. As both fall to the ground the Irish player is driven off the Welsh player by other Welsh players. The Welsh player remains on the ground holding the ball and his team-mates drive over him. The Welsh player, still on the ground, passes the ball to his scrum half.

Here LAW 18 (Tackle, lying with, on or near the ball), applies.

The Welsh player when tackled should have immediately passed the ball, or released the ball, got up or moved away from the ball. He did not conform and should have been penalised.



## QUIDNUNC'S COLUMN

AS BEFITS a dispensing optician, Andrew John Sutton is clearly a man of foresight and vision. The 6ft. 5in.,  $17\frac{1}{2}$  stone lock forward known to various sets of team-mates as "Slapper" because of his tendencies to tap the ball down from line-outs has his summer organised: August 4 is the date which Helen has named for their wedding — conveniently between Cardiff's projected tour of America and the start of the first

season of League Rugby.

Andrew, who was 25 just 11 days ago, has packed a number of clubs into those years, a man of considerable experience when it come to initiation ceremonies (though his Cardiff ritual induction is still to come), having successively played at Abergavenny, Ebbw Vale, Saracens and Newbridge before joining Cardiff around Christmas. Without in any way divulging the constituents of the Cardiff ceremony, his requirements for being accepted by the Saracens are likely to pale into insignificance: he was merely required to run down Sidmouth High Street into the sea in his underpants. The horrors of the Ebbw Vale induction are likely to be nearer the mark.

More embarrassing perhaps in rugby terms was the reason why he first missed the chance to play for the Welsh Youth XV. Now Andrew John is not the most violent of men—a gentle giant, some might say, if only slightly mistakenly. His whole club was banned: yes, there were so many players sent off at Abergavenny, that gentle and picturesque town set in the rolling hills of North Gwent, that the club suffered the severest WRU come-uppance. Mr Sutton, I have to add, was one who contributed to this long list of

dismissals. "We were," he explains, "a bit of a wild bunch".

Today, he grins with disarming embarrassment as he recalls it as his worst moment in the game. "I missed playing for Gwent Youth against South Africa because of it — but I fortunately did win Welsh Youth caps later against France and England". He has, of course, also worn the Welsh red jersey since then — for a 'B' Cap against Canada in Ontario last summer.

When you consider his frame, it is not surprising that none of his kit provided for that Canadian tour fitted — except his blazer. The result was that he was summoned before the team court, presided over by Mr Lord Chief Justice Paul Thorburn: his sentence was to drink a pint of lager while standing on his head. Just try it; it is not

simple

It is perhaps unfair to labour drinking stories but, if you ever bump into Slapper, ask him how he enjoyed Venice. He lists Italy along with Florida as his favourite holiday resorts and he has great determination to revisit Venice one day. The sad fact is that, while touring that part of the world with Ebbw Vale (for whom he played while still at King Henry VIII School, Abergavenny, and was therefore somewhat inexperienced in the affects of alcohol), he was led astray as soon as the party set foot in St. Mark's Square. Andrew, alas, has no recollection of the historic, cultural and scenic delights of that unique city.

But these things are all in the past. Working as he does for optician Stewart Greenberg — he qualified for the National Diploma in London which explains the Saracens two-season connection and with whom he won the Middlesex Cup — he is no longer living a misspent youth. He has not, however, given up Guinness.

Nevertheless, it is surprising to learn that his favourite film is The Quiet Man and Eastenders his favourite TV programme — possibly while eating chicken. And,

incidentally, he insists on wearing jersey No. 5.

Just as the Cardiff players are probably yet to hear the worst of his voice — his former Newbridge colleague are somewhat scathing about his vocal offering and recall better his attempts at paragliding on the team coach — so are we spectators yet to see the best of his rugby. But he is now fitting into the Alan Phillips requirement for mobile forwards. Remember (even if you forget much of the match) his hand and hands along with those of Stuart Nunnerley, in those two colourful running tries against Llanelli last Saturday? Who is to say that his ambitions to succeed thoroughly at Cardiff and go on to play for Wales are beyond that long reach?
