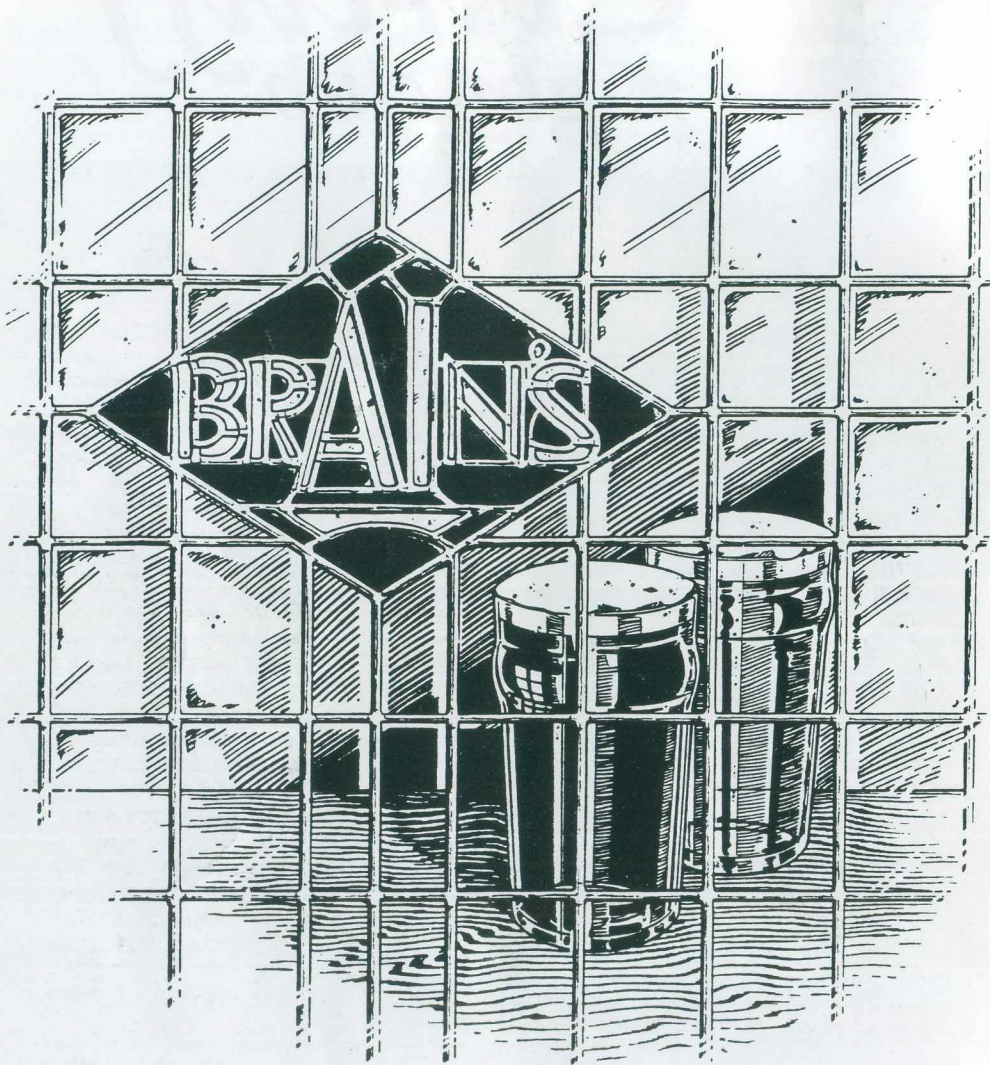

## **Cardiff v. Newbridge**

**SATURDAY 28th APRIL, 1990**

**KICK-OFF 3.00p.m.**

Who could have thought at 4 o'clock on the 14th October last that we would finish the season with the worst record since the second world war. We had just put up a magnificent performance against New Zealand which ultimately provided the narrowest victory of their tour. Indeed the 10 points margin on the day could well have been less and had we taken all our chances we could well have caused the biggest upset ever by beating the men from the Antipodes. What a shock that would have been.

We had reasonable cause to expect a fair run for the rest of the season but what has transpired, has been disaster. The writing appeared on the wall in our very next game after the All Blacks when we met the Wasps. It was a game of good open rugby but we made far too many mistakes and we allowed them to sneak the game away from us by 25 points to 22. This game seemed to set the seal on the remainder of the season. We were as good if not better than most sides but we seemed to give games away to our opponents rather than them winning on their own merit.

Mind you many things contrived to work against us and there was not one occasion when we were able to field the same side for two matches running. Injury, international training and games, transfer troubles you name it and it's plagued us throughout the season. And this in a season that was to precede the introduction of league rugby. Fortunately our two previous seasons were of far better quality so this appears to have carried us into the Premier Division but it's been very much touch and go over the last few months. This again has primarily arisen from the fact that we have lost to sides whom we should have well beaten. Let's be thankful for the fact that Premier Division status is to be ours though because this will at least put us in a far more stable position than we have enjoyed this year. For example we won't be in the situation whereby we have to play an important game days before an international.

In looking back over the season if only we could have applied our commitment in the same way as we did against New Zealand and Llanelli in the cup, things would have been very different indeed. These were certainly performances of rose like quality amongst quite a few which could only be described as rather thorny. All this despite the hard work that coaches Alan Phillips and Peter Manning, captain Tim Crother and senior selector Terry Charles have put in is a source of grave disappointment to us all. It is incredible how much time they have put into the season. If rewards were automatically aligned to hard work, those guys would have seen us amongst the best this season.

Consistency has to be the name of the game these days. We showed the complete opposite recently when we lost to Ebbw Vale, then beat the Barbarians but then lost immediately after to South Glamorgan Institute within the space of six days. Mind you won't see this sort of congestion from now on in. This season for instance we have played some 46 games and with today's it will be 47. Next season we will play 36 games including up to the quarter finals in the cup, the stage at which we were knocked out this year. Hopefully this reduction in fixtures will give us the chance to achieve this consistency which is going to be so important next season.

In speaking of consistency what a marvellous season our adopted Cardiff Schools U16 side have had. Their season ended on Easter Monday when they



annihilated their Nottingham counterparts by more than 60 points. It was sheer delight to watch a performance of such a positive display of superb rugby. Their team work in backing up and tactical awareness is first class and it's no wonder they have produced such results. Well done lads, we hope that each and everyone of you sees Cardiff as your club when you come to play senior rugby.

And now after all the moaning and groaning can we say it gives us great pleasure to welcome Newbridge to The Arms Park once again. This will be their 12th visit to Cardiff in a series which reaches 22 games today. Of the previous 21 we have won 15, lost 4 and drawn 2. Points wise we have notched 368 to their 219. Of those 21 games 3 of them have come in the cup competition, none of the 3 have been played at Cardiff however. 2 of them were on their ground while the 3rd was the semi final of the competition in season 1981/82 at Newport. All 3 went Cardiff's way. Of their 4 wins 3 have come in Newbridge 13-3 in 1968, 12-6 in 1984 and 31-13 last season. Their single victory in Cardiff came with an 11-10 win in October 1982.

Their win last year at the Welfare ground by 31-13 was by far the biggest hammering they have inflicted on us. Their previous highest score against us was 15 which they achieved on two occasions. Paul Turner orchestrated their efforts in that game and no doubt Newbridge must have been a very disappointed club when he decided yet again to return to Newport. He has been a terrific points scoring machine for them over the years and he still holds the club record with a massive 405 in season 1983-84. He was in the game for a long time before he won his international cap however. I will remember him talking to Neil Kinnock in what looked like a very serious conversation during the Newbridge centenary dinner. It was later referred to by Brian Wellington, Newbridge Secretary, that Paul was instructing the leader of the opposition in the virtue of patience. After all said Brian, "Look how long it took Paul to get into No. 10". Will Byron Hayward fill Paul Turner's boots. He has already scored over 200 points for them since joining Newbridge.

There has been quite an interchange of players between the Welfare Ground and Cardiff Arms Park. Steve Crandon was the latest to move back but there are quite a few players who have drifted between our clubs including Peter Goodfellow (the young one that is), Paul Evans, Terry Shaw, David Wright, Alan Glasson and Peter Crane.

Paul Evans of course is still there in charge of coaching but no doubt we will miss his colleague Clive Davis who has had to pack it in. They have done a good job in this the year they designated as one of rebuilding. They have steered their side into the Premier Division of next year's league with quite a bit to spare. Although they were unexpectedly knocked out of the cup by Aberavon their results otherwise have been very impressive. They will be coming today with every intention of keeping up their winning ways. A win today would give them two on the trot and that's something they have never achieved before.

Welcome then Newbridge we earnestly hope you have an enjoyable day.

Now here's a bit of nice news. The Guide Dogs for the Blind Association wrote to thank us for your great generosity in their recent collection which raised just over £500. For this they will be able to purchase and train a dog. They asked us to choose a breed and also suggest a name for the dog. Without hesitation and on your behalf we nominated a golden labrador and it was to be called 'Bowesie'. Now isn't that great. If that dog serves humanity as well as the man who's name he has taken he will be a good 'un'.

Finally today we would like to thank Barlow Handling for their generous sponsorship of today's game. We trust Mr Colin Howe and his guests will enjoy the occasion.

## KNOW THE LAWS

### WHY NOT APPLY THIS AMENDMENT AT SENIOR LEVEL?

This season there has been a few experimental changes for players 16-19 years old. The aim was to try and improve the ruck/maul area of the game and to try and keep players on their feet after a tackle. In other words, try and teach young players the right attitude and correct techniques.

There is no doubt, at senior level, at the moment, that too many players are trying to play the game on the ground causing too many pile ups, and too many referees compromising with the situation. The inevitable result is inconsistency — a scrum or penalty. The game has become one of stops and starts full of set pieces with little continuity.

The **experimental Tackle Law at 16-19 level states that:-**

“any other player must be on his feet **WHEN** he plays the ball”.

The intention, therefore, is to keep players on their feet and so after a tackle any other player must be on his feet **WHEN** he plays the ball. **No player can now dive on the ball after a tackle, he must play it while he is on his feet.**

Rugby football would benefit greatly if this amendment was applied to all senior rugby.
