



Cardiff v. Oxford University

WEDNESDAY, 7th NOVEMBER, 1990 KICK-OFF 7.15 p.m.

It's becoming something of a novelty to see a game under our floodlights these days. In previous seasons we would have already played a hatfull of Wednesday fixtures. League rugby has put an end to that situation and not before time many people say.

On the bonus side though it gives us the opportunity to give some of our up and coming young players a game against first class opponents. We will be doing just that tonight with the side showing nine changes to that which played at Stradey last Saturday. It's good to see Mike Hall's name back on the team sheet again too. Hopefully his disappointing period of injury is now well and truly behind him and he can get on and concentrate on getting his form and international place back as quickly as possible.

Besides seeing some of our young starlets tonight we will also be able to see our own Andrew Moore amongst the Dark Blues. Andrew began his studies at Oxford last month and has quickly established himself in their side. His main aim now will be to show the sort of form that will ensure his inclusion on the team sheet for their annual battle against their Light Blue counterparts at Twickenham next month. On that score we wish him every success.

Tonight's game brings the Cardiff v. Oxford series up to 57 and of the previous 56 we have won 38 to their 15 with the remaining 3 drawn. The Oxford boys must like Cardiff Arms Park because tonight's game is their eighth visit here on the trot. We haven't paid a visit to their ground since October 1982, but Oxford are happy enough to travel so it also suits our purpose.

It gives them a good workout before the Varsity match at Twickenham. Now that particular day is uppermost in their mind because regardless of all other results, a win against their deadly rivals means its a very successful season. The Light Blues are at this point 3 games ahead in the 108 match series with 49 wins to Oxford's 46. A feature of the forthcoming clash next month is the prospect of Andrew Moore crossing swords with another Cardiff player in the shape of Andrew Booth, who of course is a regular in the Cambridge side.

On their last visit to us a year ago we won by 18 points to 3. The Dark Blues had a bit of a purple patch before that game when they won both the previous two games. Those two wins ended a string of ten defeats we had inflicted on them in succession.

To Oxford University then, we say welcome to Cardiff yet again, we hope they enjoy their visit. We also wish them well at Twickenham on December 11th next.
