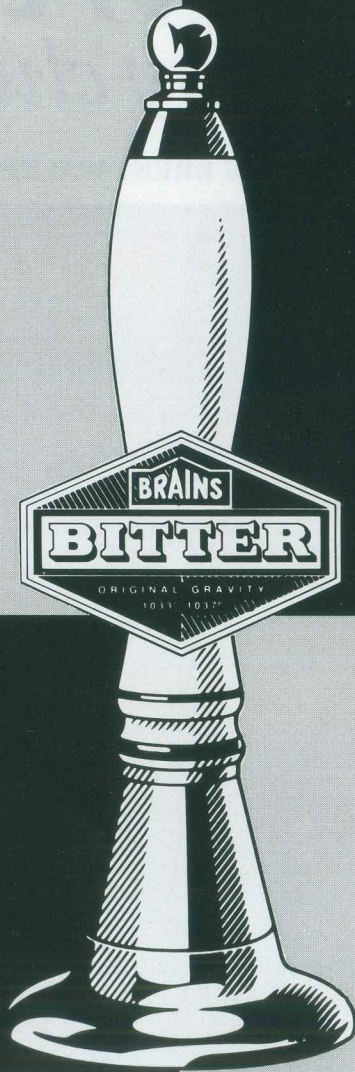

Cardiff v. Nottingham

SATURDAY 28th SEPTEMBER, 1991

Although today sees only our second home game, a month of the season has already and quite unbelievably, slipped by. Indeed after today we can just about forget all the preamble and hype that has been written about The World Cup because it will be just about time to get down to the real nitty gritty. The hopes and predictions will soon become reality and subsequent elation for some and dejection for others.

Where do Wales stand in this scenario. Well the new management team of our own Bob Norster and Alan Davies have met with general approval thus far, but the gloves come off come Sunday week. An extremely confident Western Samoan side will be Wales first opponents and 3 days later The Red Dragon will do battle against Argentina, both games, fortunately on The Arms Park.

Those few short days are going to mean so much to Welsh Rugby because anything but two wins and progression to the quarter finals of the competition will be very hard to stomach. So to management and players particularly our own, we say good luck and may you enjoy the best of fortune.

Now perhaps you may next ask about tickets. Well I did read somewhere that if you knew how to get a World Cup ticket you deserved it. Seriously however at this point in time we are still so unsure of the whole issue of ticket distribution that a call to the office for the latest information is the best bet. For instance if Wales progress to the quarter final it will be played on Saturday 19th October at Murrayfield but what tickets we have will not be in our hands until the Wednesday prior to the game. You can see the chaos this may well cause.

Life after the World Cup is not going to be easy for the Northern Hemisphere players either. After the 1987 tournament which was held in late May & June of that year, at least the players had a few months rest before plunging headlong into their own domestic season. Its going to be a far different cry this time out however because the first Saturday after the World Cup finishes sees the start of our Heineken League programme. Furthermore every Saturday from that first league game on will be either league cup or a Five Nations International until the extended season ends in Mid May. I tell a lie, there is one respite in those 28 Saturdays and that falls on December 28th which is free of all such commitments. Now that by any stretch of the imagination is a very tall order particularly for clubs heavily committed to the National Squad and those who progress to the final round of the cup competition. I can just see the boys in our squad saying "Beam me up Scottie".

Will life ever be the same either during or after the World Cup? We shall soon see. Even referees are being subjected to fitness and law interpretation sessions. I hear that they will be signalled as to when they can recommence a game after half time. This will ensure that ITV will not miss any perhaps early score direct from the kick off whilst their viewers are watching a coffee advert. It seems that every knee has to bend to the almighty dollar these days.

Last Saturday's opening of the new hospitality suite was quite a grand affair and well in keeping with the standards of The Cardiff Club. The Bath officials present were very impressed with the whole set up and it is their wish to have a ground of similar proportions once they get planning permission from their local authorities.

As for the game, itself it seems that we overspent our quota of good fortune in the Bristol match because we certainly haven't had the rub of the green since then. The game at Leicester was certainly within our grasp but we let it slip. Then last Saturday we

should have been home and dry by half time but it wasn't to be. Even at the very end that penalty could have made it the perfect day but it just sailed wide. It was a very encouraging performance however seeing how Bath had previously put Llanelli and Pontypool well and truly to the sword. The pack particularly are beginning to shape up which augurs well for our Heineken League challenge.

Today we have another stern task with the visit of further English opponents Nottingham. Our association with the men from Robin Hood territory is very much in its infancy. We first played them at Nottingham in March 1988 a game which they won by 2 tries, a conversion and 2 penalties 16 pts to 2 tries, 2 conversions and a penalty 15 pts. They then paid a visit to the Arms Park for our second encounter a month later in a game which we won by 23 pts to 12, with a 4 to 1 try score to us.

Our 3rd meeting came in April 1989 at Nottingham with victory going to the home side by 18 pts to 12. They came back to the Arms Park 12 months later when we inflicted quite a heavy defeat on them to the tune of 47 pts to 18, the try score in that match being 8 to 2 to us. So the present record shows the stats as reading played 4, 2 wins to us and 2 to Nottingham with a points total of 97 to us and 64 to them.

Although the series is only 4 games old, Nottingham's record is quite unique because no other club whom we have played more than once can boast of an even 50-50 record as can Nottingham. I'm sure they will be all out for victory today to take the lead in the series.

This afternoon will be their second visit to the Principality in a fortnight having crossed swords with Pontypridd at Sardis Road two Saturdays ago. They certainly gave a Ponty side, playing with renewed confidence these days, a bit of a scare. After being 9-7 up Nottingham could not quite manage to contain The Sardis Road side who finally ran out winners by 14-9. Last Saturday was a different story when Nottingham had the mighty All Blacks of Neath as their visitors. With skipper Andy Sutton well to the fore they rattled Neath whom they put on the defensive right from the start. They had the Neath scrummage in all sorts of trouble and at half time the home side lead by 22-9. Neath came back into things somewhat in the second half and prevented Nottingham adding to their score. The home side hung on however and come the final whistle they ran out very worthy winners by 22-18, a good result against Neath by any standards.

Nottingham come today minus Simon Hodgkinson and Andy Gray who are involved in World Cup preparations. Obviously their star goal kicking full back is a great loss to them but having taken Neath's scalp last Saturday they will be, no doubt, very anxious to do the same to us here at The Arms Park this afternoon.

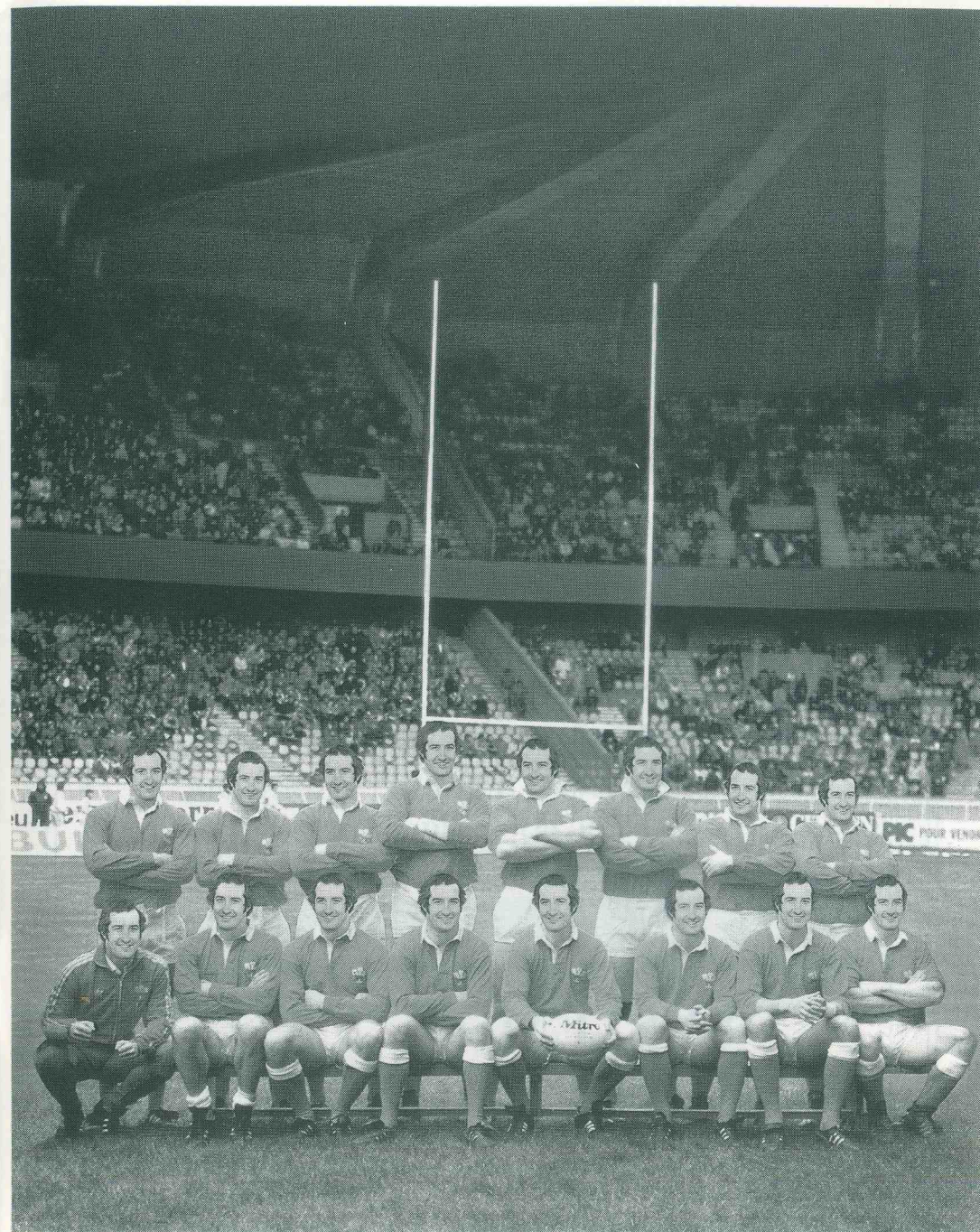
If the Welsh Mangement team would have been present this afternoon the first rift in their short association could have occurred. Bob Norster would obviously have been rooting for Cardiff. Alan Davies however would certainly have been cheering Nottingham, the side he has coached so successfully now for quite some time.

Come what may however we welcome Nottingham to Cardiff Arms Park for this their 3rd visit to our ground. We welcome them and hope they have an enjoyable afternoon.

The Rags lost at Bath last Saturday by a 3 point margin 27-24. It was their first defeat in 5 games but considering it was a game that they could have won it was still a good performance in Bath. The Rags have arranged a few more games than shown on the fixture list. They will be away to Glynneath on Wednesday next and on Saturday, when the 1st team travel to Aberavon they will be home to Hirwaun. As I've said before the Rags are always a good bet to watch when they play on The Arms Park.

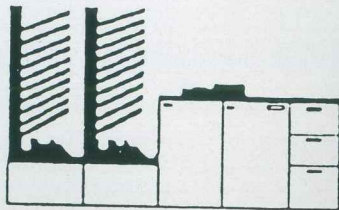
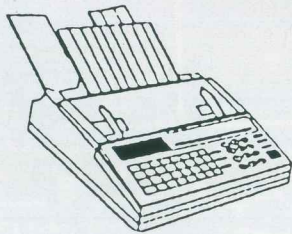

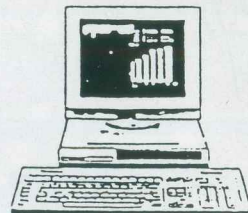

KNOW THE LAWS

CONTROVERSIAL DECISION

Last season's Ireland v France international in Dublin refereed by World Cup panel referee Derek Bevan certainly raised some interesting points of law.

A quickly taken top penalty by French scrum half Pierre Berbezier right in front of the Irish posts was disallowed by the referee. Why? Were French players in front of the ball when it was taken? No. In fact all the French players were behind the ball.

The real explanation was that Serge Blanco, the French captain, had indicated to Derek Bevan, the referee, that he wanted to attempt a kick at goal.

Law 27 Penalty kick states that "The Kicker... if he has indicated to the referee that he intends to attempt a kick at goal... he must not kick the ball in any other way."

As Blanco had indicated a kick at goal the referee had no alternative but to award a scrummage to Ireland. Despite press criticism the referee was again correct.

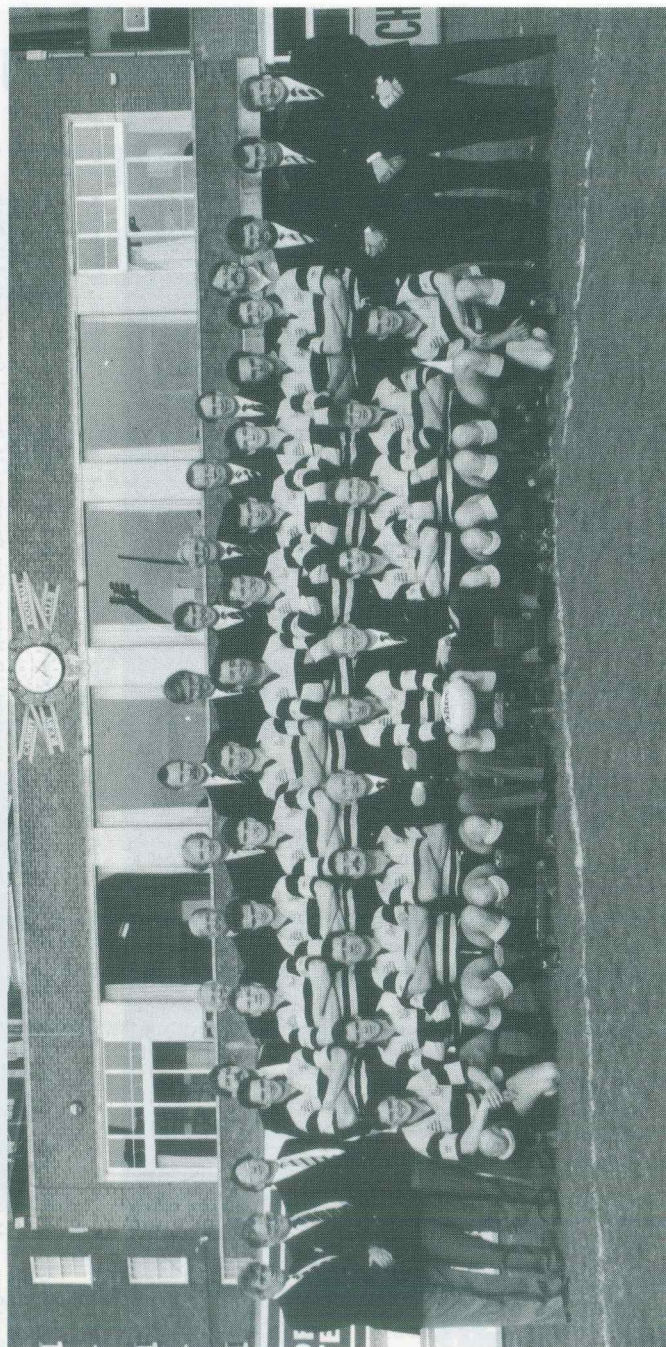
