

It would be interesting — and by taking up space, save me a hell of a lot of writing, to print the teams that played on that historic occasion.





It was a pretty formidable Cardiff pack with Welsh Internationals and British Lions in Howard Norris, John O'Shea and Keith Rowlands and goodness knows what Big Jim might have achieved had he resisted the tinkle of the gold pieces. We have had very few better pairings than Cliff Ashton and Lloyd Williams at half-back and plenty of running in the backs, with Maurice Richards, probably the most clinical of finishers we have seen. Incidentally Cardiff won that game 24pts-3, and we have succeeded in winning all the subsequent games. In 1967, 16-0, 1968 17-3, 1969 by 30-0.

So we look forward to a game played without the pressures of League Rugby, and an opportunity to run free, to show all the skills, and enter into the spirit of the Festive Season. We know that the Accies will — it is a large part of their 'raison d'etre'. (If you had gone to Mountain Ash Grammar School in 1920 you would know what that meant. I don't — I went to Newbridge Grammar School in 1950). I only hope that our boys will respond and that they haven't forgotten the finer skills in which we all revel. So let's all join the revelries on and off the field, pass your hip flasks around, lob out the Havanas, tackle the mince pies, kick the blues, and finally say a fond farewell to 1991. Not the best of years — when you think about it.







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KNOW THE LAWS

Question 1 An attacking player with the ball in his possession crosses the goalline near the touch-line and whilst running to get nearer the posts he brushes against the referee and continues his run eventually grounding the ball near the goal posts. What is the correct decision?

Answer A try should be awarded where the player touched the referee.

Question 2 An attacking player close to the touch line kicks the ball ahead into his opponents' in-goal area. He follows up the kick by running into touch. He grounds the ball in the in-goal area but when he does so his feet are in touch-in-goal.

What should the referee award?

Answer A try should be given for the law states that 'a try may be scored by a player who is in touch or in touch-in-goal provided he is not carrying the ball!

Question 3 An attacking player with the ball in his possession in his opponents' ingoal area is so held that he cannot ground the ball.

What action should the referee take?

Answer Award a scrum 5 metres from the goal line opposite the place where he was held, with the attacking side to have the 'put in' into the scrummage.
