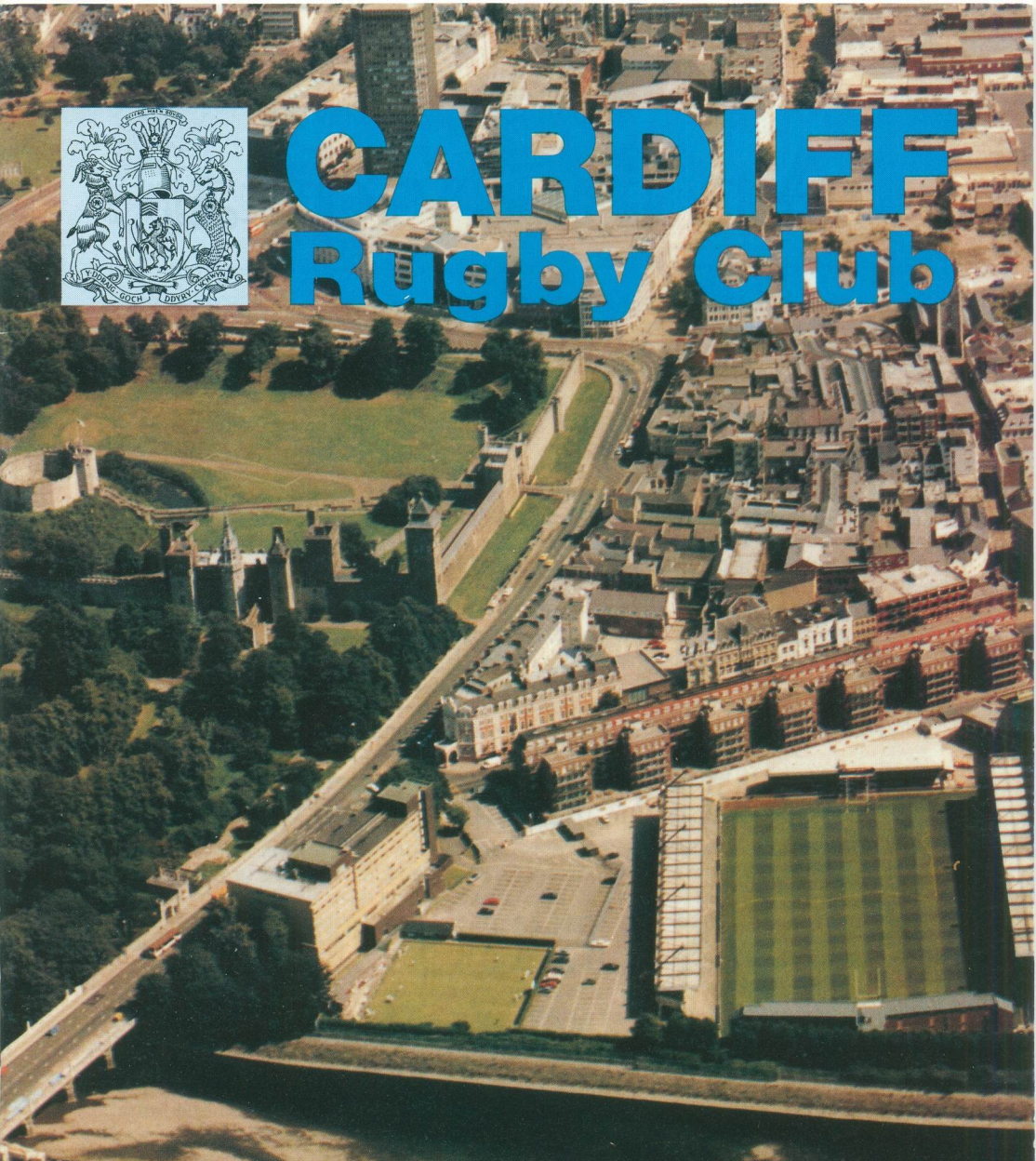

THERE WAS a hum and a buzz around the pubs and clubs of Cardiff on Saturday night and Sunday morning; six second-half tries against Pontypridd clearly enabled our followers to glimpse a light at the end of the tunnel, without fearing, as has sometimes been the case in the past season or two, that the light was that of the Llanelli, Swansea or Neath express heading towards us.

New captain Mike Hall quite correctly, nevertheless, gives a warning. "The Cardiff members and supporters have a right to expect good rugby but not necessarily the right to win everything, even though that is what the players may wish.

"The season has started quite well with two wins but the new structure is not aimed at instant success, even though that is also an ambition. It may take two or three seasons but one thing is certain: there is a more positive approach both on and off the field."

Certainly, there will be no complacency this afternoon for the visit of Newbridge, to whose committee, players and followers we give our usual warm welcome.

By their own standards, they have had a disappointing start, losing at Swansea where they were denied only by a couple of hairline refereeing decisions, and then at home to Aberavon through David Love's last-kick penalty. Their dramatic successes in pre-season Sevens tournaments, however, should be a warning that there is talent a-plenty in the side.

If Cardiff need any warning, that is: Newbridge have, after all, played us four times in the Heineken League and won all four.

They were unhappy during the close season to lose Hemi Taylor, the New Zealander who is of course now at the Arms Park, and Steve Sutton, the Welsh international, to Swansea. But they in turn have acquired new players in centre Mark Egan from Llanelli, Carwyn Lewis, the Penarth scrum-half, flanker Paul Pook from Cardiff along with Justin Burnell, and the Glamorgan Wanderers hooker Mark Wysocki.

And if the last named is potentially a commentator's nightmare just try a centre who has joined the Gwent club from Fiji: he is called Philip Qotunikarawa-Rokotuni.

Earlier this week, too, the club was anxiously looking at its injured list: flanker and former captain Steuart Griffiths, prop Simon Jenkins and lock Andy Collins were all injured against Aberavon last Saturday.

For the statistically minded, and including those four Heineken League matches, Cardiff and Newbridge have met only 26 times over the years. Cardiff have won 16, Newbridge 8 with two matches drawn. The points tally is 411-279 in Cardiff's favour.

Talking of Newbridge also, eagle-eyed spectators may spot changes in the fixture list. As the result of a Welsh team training session in early January, the designated away fixture at Newbridge will now be played on November 14, when we were due to meet Ebbw Vale in a friendly.

There are changes, too, at the back end of the season which involve the quarter- and semi-finals of the Welsh Cup – and not only for those who reach those rounds. The alterations, because of the running of the Hong Kong Sevens among other events, also involve the rescheduling of league matches.

In the leagues, our own Adrian Davies is the early leading scorer with 37 from the two games. Jason Williams of Abertillery and Hywel Jones of Llandoverly both have 32 while Colin Stephens of Llanelli and Byron Hayward of Newbridge have 27 in the First Division.

Llanelli top the try scoring so far with 15 while Newport are on 13. The two clubs meet this afternoon at Rodney Parade: the other League One matches today are Aberavon v. Maesteg, Pontypool v. Pontypridd, Bridgend v. Neath and Swansea v. South Wales Police.

The Cardiff Athletic side has excelled itself in the past few days. A 56-16 win at Pontypridd on Saturday was followed by a staggering 82-7 victory over Bedwas at the Arms Park on Tuesday.

Competition for first team places is clearly hotting up. At Ponty, Geraint Lewis led the point-scoring with a try, five conversions and a penalty. Ian Jeffrey scored two tries and Graham Davies, Simon and Tim Crothers, Gareth Roberts and Mike Budd also crossed. Against Bedwas, Arthur Emyr ran in a hat-trick, while Ceri Thomas, Adam Palfrey and Geraint Lewis all scored twice. Ceri Thomas converted five of the tries.

The Cardiff Youth side has had a less joyful start with successive defeats by Llandaff North and Leicester but these are early days yet, just as they are in Division One, on which we must now concentrate as Cardiff attempt to exorcise the ghost of those four Newbridge league defeats.

KNOW THE LAWS

Season 1992-93 has started with a number of law changes. Below, to act as a reminder for the first few matches, is a potted version of the major changes.*



- A try value is now five points.
- No dropped goals allowed direct from free kicks.
- After a tackle, any other player (not involved in the tackle) must be on his feet when he plays the ball.
- In general play, off-side players cannot advance until put on-side.
- Scrum half cannot take action to suggest ball has left scrum.
- Hooker allowed to raise foot when ball leaves scrum half's hands.
- Illegal to lift an opponent intentionally off his feet or force him up out of scrum.
- Front rows not to form down until referee indicates place and must advance to one arm's length of opponents.
- Five-metre scrum takes place opposite where ball becomes dead, not where it crosses goal-line.
- When a penalty is kicked direct to touch, team kicking will also have throw-in.
- Player kicking for touch from free kick may only punt or drop-kick.
- Quick kick may be taken, either penalty or free kick, without waiting for players to retire behind ball, provided those players do not become involved in play.
- Ground cannot be gained by running back from outside 22 to within 22 to kick to touch.
- Quick throw-in may be taken from any point as long as it is nearer player's goal-line, provided player uses same ball and retrieves it himself.
- From kick-off, if ball crosses opposing team's goal-line without being touched by defending team, that team to have right of scrum at halfway. Kick-off after scores to be by drop-kick.
- Replacements increased from three to four for each team.
- Twelve penalty provisions reduced to free-kicks include intentional knock-on, lifting, moving beyond end of lineout, handling or picking up in scrum or ruck, and time wasting.

EXPERIMENTAL VARIATIONS *(These to be reviewed after 1992-93 season)*

- When ball becomes unplayable in an maul, team NOT in possession at start of maul will put ball into ensuing scrum.
- Same will apply to ruck, except when referee is unable to determine team responsible.
- In lineouts, space of one metre necessary between lines of players, but rule of one metre between players of the same team is not deleted.
- When jumping in lineout, players must use both hands or inside arm to catch or deflect ball.

KNOW THE LAWS

J. E. MALCOLM THOMAS explains and interprets the laws of Rugby Football in his regular series. This afternoon, he examines the new laws in the line-out.



LAW 23. THE LINEOUT

- (a) "Each team must line up at a distance of half a metre on its side of the line-of-touch **so as to leave a clear space of one metre between the two lines of players**". This experimental variation, on the formation of the lineout, means that the distance of one metre for the clear space is between the shoulders of the players when standing upright.
- (b) "**When jumping for the ball a player must use both hands or his inside arm to catch or deflect the ball.** The act of jumping for the ball may include a step in any direction provided it takes the jumper up to but **not** across the line-of-touch".

Except when jumping for the ball or peeling off, a clear space of one metre must be left between the two lines of players in the lineout until the ball has touched or has been touched by a player or has touched the ground.

The changes to the lineout, especially the insistence on the one metre gap between the players, seemed to have less impact in the recent televised matches from Australia, New Zealand and South Africa. It seemed to depend very much on the interpretation of the referee who seemed to be much busier about the lineout than before.

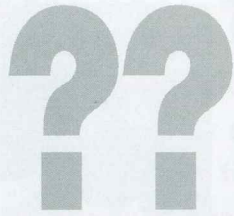
The one metre gap seemed to disappear very quickly and the insistence on using the inside arm did not appear to have made the ball more readily available. But these are early days.

The most interesting feature was the "**assisting of the jumper**". "Assisting" seems to be a polite word for "lifting", or "**Supporting the jumper once he is airborne**". The Australian tactic has been to help hoist the jumper and hold him aloft for a split second or two. Everyone will join the parade soon. **This season players are allowed to move in quickly on the jumper to "assist" or "hold up"**.

- (c) "**When kicked directly into touch from a penalty kick, the ball will be thrown in at the line-out by the team which kicked the ball in touch.** "Directly" is taken to mean "**without touching another player**".

I think this is an important change for, if line out throwers do their work accurately, the team awarded a penalty will enjoy considerable possession of the ball and win territory.

MIKE HALL

QUIDNUNC'S COLUMN

MIKE HALL hates to lose. Particularly at go-karting, one of his latest hobbies. I say "one of" because he is also deeply into white-water kayaking and gorge-walking (a terrifying combination of climbing, abseiling and other feats of bravado undertaken only by the extremely fit, the extremely mad — or both).

But back to the karting. Three times in four races recently he went for a gap that wasn't there ("something like my rugby", he confessed) and left the track. In the not very copious free time, you might just find him — in the company of the long-suffering Rachel — watching Porridge or some kind of comedy and eating fish or chicken (except perhaps on Saturdays when he will indulge himself at an Italian restaurant and have a drink or two).

The boys, allowed to relax on Saturdays, took part with enthusiasm at a players' karaoke evening after the Pontypridd match. Mike was to be heard giving a curious rendering of, aptly, *I'm the Leader of the Gang* — with try hat-trick star Adrian Davies the revelation of the evening. A talented musician, our Adrian, apparently: Quidnunc will uncover more about this in the future.

There is a new team spirit abroad, it seems from out here. Quidnunc is not sure whether or not it is typified by a story he hears from the pre-season Plymouth training visit. Hemi Taylor, a quiet man from all accounts, picked up a bucket of water after a particularly rainy session and chucked it over the captain. Far from putting a damper on proceedings, it caused good-natured banter. "I wouldn't mind," Mike, who incidentally now has 21 caps, was heard to say, "but I'd hardly spoken to the guy at that stage." Frivolity off the field can lead to much teamwork on it.
