Further tries from Frank Jacas and replacement Martin Jones sealed the victory.

Meek on his fine performance for Wales B against England-North.



WELCOME, CARDIFF

Today we welcome to Pontypool a Cardiff side that has been rejuvenated under the new coaching team of ALEC EVANS, TERRY HOLMES and CHARLIE FAULKNER, and who, but for an unlucky defeat at Stradey Park, would have today been defending a one hundred per cent Heineken League record.

As long as I have been associated with Pontypool RFC, Cardiff has always been "the"club that players have "bust a gut" to play against. A victory against Cardiff had more value than a victory against any other team in Wales, and the most memorable game that I ever played in was a midweek club match at the Arms Park. In September 1974, Pontypool hadn't beaten Cardiff at Cardiff for 19 years, and therefore a 15–19 win in my first visit to the Arms Park, as a skinny, raw 18-year-old, gave me a feeling of elation I have experienced only very occasionally in my rugby career.

The match itself was dominated by Pontypool scrum half Dennis John, and it was typical that Dennis himself scored the try which secured victory. Playing toward the clubhouse, and from a lineout on the halfway line, Dennis hoisted one up to Cardiff full back John Davies, later of South Wales Police. I feel sorry for John now in retrospect since, although he was a brave player, Dennis' kick was in the air long enough to sing three choruses of "God Save The Queen", and when he finally received the ball, he received with it Ivor Taylor, who was known to enjoy the odd bit of tackling. BASH! – John Davies flattened, the ball spills into Dennis' hands for a try under the sticks. Conversions were never any trouble to "Big Bertha", Robin Williams, who also back-heeled three penalties over to lay the Arms Park bogey that had dogged us for nearly twenty years.

Mind you, one Cardiff bogey over, another was about to begin – Cardiff in the Cup. There were some heartbreaking cup defeats at the hands of Cardiff before we were able to lay that little bogey – the year we actually won the Cup, 1983. Who will forget the match that we absolutely dominated, only for GERALD DAVIES to leave his mark on the game with four scorching tries.

Cardiff's resurgence as a force in Welsh Rugby can only be good for the game in Wales. Their style, although influenced by brilliant backs such as GERALD DAVIES, BARRY JOHN and GARETH EDWARDS, has always been based upon the good solid forward play of players like MIKE KNILL, ALAN PHILLIPS and IAN ROBINSON. Their current upsurge in fortunes appears to be based upon the same principles. The good work up front of the likes of MIKE GRIFFITHS, PAUL KAWULOK and STUART ROY bein capitalised upon by the very impressive MIKE RAYER, former Pontypool favourite MARK RING, and the rest of a very talented back division.

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome all the players, officials and supporters of Cardiff RFC to Pontypool this afternoon, and if this match lives up to previous Pontypool v Cardiff encounters, then we are in for a good afternoon.

Our victory at Aberavon last Saturday was a tale of two halves. At half-time no-one would have put his shirt on a Pontypool win, since we seemed to struggle to come to terms with the Wizards' pack in the first half. The second half was a different story, however, with Pontypool turning in their best display for some time to score four good second half tries. NEIL JONES won a lot of good ball at the front of the lineout and young FRANK JACAS cleaned up at the tail. With this improved source of possession, PAUL YOUNG played well, and generally, if we can sustain the level at which we played in the second half, then we have much upon which to build.






