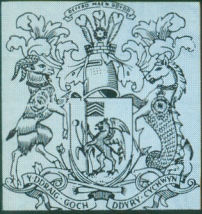

WELL, WHO would have thought it? Fewer than nine months ago, Cardiff Rugby Football Club supporters – and many players and officials, for that matter: were confused, shaken, even fearful.

Now, at the gateway to 1993 – a year is a long time in rugby football – we top the Heineken League First Division, have a flourishing Under 21 XV and there is around South Wales, and in the city in particular, a buzz, a hum not only of optimism but of enthusiasm. Cardiff Arms Park is alive again.

There have been some exhilarating moments since the season began in September, some splendid running rugby as can be gauged from the fact that seven of last Saturday's eight tries against Aberavon came from wingmen.

Among them all, however, that which seems to have sparked off the most discussion was the first try by Adrian Davies last weekend. How long did it take, has there ever been a quicker try?

The videotape made by Tellyads for Alec Evans and his coaching staff, shows by the stopwatch that from the moment of impact when Mark Ring kicks off, nine seconds exactly passes before Adrian touches down.

Armed with that knowledge, we approached the Guinness Book of Records, those custodians of oddities sporting and otherwise. Sorry, they said, but a gentleman called Andrew Brown, playing for Widden Old Boys against the Old Ashtonians in Gloucester on November 22, 1990, scored after only eight seconds.

Exactly who timed this we are not quite certain: but it took priority over the fastest try in an international which was by H L "Bart" Price for England against Wales at Twickenham on January 20, 1923, credited as being "less than 10 seconds after kick off."

Record or not, it was one of the memorable moments of a memorable season to date – and a score which, incidentally, helped Adrian Davies to 177 league points (which *is* a record). He is 41 points ahead of Paul Parry of Fourth Division leaders Builth Wells and exactly 50 ahead of the nearest First Division contender, Swansea's Aled Williams, with Colin Stephens, of Llanelli, on 125. Nigel Walker's hat-trick of tries gives him a league tally of 12, two behind Ieuan Evans.

That is all for now about the leagues. We take a break from those for three weeks – until 1993 in fact – while it is temporarily eyes-down for the fourth round of the newly-named Swalec Cup.

A most warm welcome, then, to our friends from the Old Parish, the Maesteg officials, players and supporters.

Whatever happens this afternoon, there will be an irony for one side or the other: this is the only all-First Division tie in this round or the next (as you can see from the full cup programme in the Miscellany column). Whoever wins will also play at home in the Fifth round: either Narberth or St Peters.

Cardiff, in fact, have never met Maesteg in the cup: nor, for that matter if we dare look further ahead, have we met either Narberth, who look likely First Division



candidates for next season, or St Peters though the "Rocks", as they are known are redoubtable local cup fighters even if they are currently struggling somewhat to maintain their place in the Third Division.

The form book, however, can frequently be cast aside when cup time comes round: the fact that Maesteg have won only once at the Arms Park, by 14-0 in 1926, can be forgotten just as can the stark statistic that Cardiff's highest victory over a senior club is also against Maesteg – by 77-9, 20 years ago almost to the day (it was on December 23, 1972, in fact). There again, Maesteg's best win over Cardiff was 10 years ago when they beat us 31-24 up in the Llynfi Valley.

This "term" Maesteg have given very clear warning that they will fight all the way for their top league status. Despite the blow of losing the highly promising Huw Woodland to Neath, they thoroughly deserved their 18-7 victory over Newport last Saturday.

After the final whistle blows later this afternoon, most of us can then relax and look forward to the traditional joys of Christmas. But not the players who still have serious work to do.

Next Saturday, Pontypridd come down the road to visit us in the annual Boxing Day fixture and then, for many of the Cardiff squad, there's the East v West confrontation on the following Monday which surely has to be an international trial by any other name and certainly an attempt to bridge the club-to-national gap which in England is taken up by the divisional championships.

For a short time, however, the pressure will be off from leagues and cup. All those connected with Cardiff Rugby Club would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas, words which are more eloquently expressed by the chairman, Mr Mervyn John, deeper in the programme.

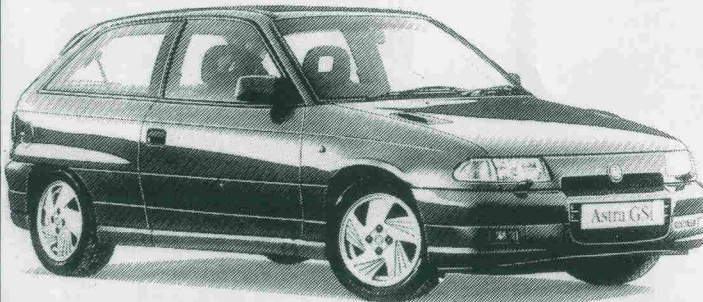

### UNDER-21 STRENGTH

**STRESS** on the importance of the Under-21 team has been made in the Miscellany column before and the performance of the Cardiff team at this level has, in the words of Gwynne Griffiths, "continued to improve".

Members of the side have, indeed, represented Wales, provided the bulk of the unbeaten East District XV and, most significantly, eight of the 21-strong squad have already been called on for the Cardiff first team.

At international level, Huw Harries, who made his Heineken League debut against Aberavon last Saturday, Adam Palfrey and Andrew Lewis played for the Welsh President's XV which soundly beat the New Zealand News XV at Pontypridd and, a week later, Huw Harries gained his full cap against Ireland in Dublin. Huw was, alas, forced to go off through injury

and his absence proved crucial as Wales surrendered their unbeaten record to the determined Irish.

Results for the Cardiff team in the past two months have been Pencoed Under-21 17-11, Cardiff College (Institute) 6-13, Swansea Under-21 44-15 and Cardiff University 25-24.

The strength of the side is somewhat dependent on 1st XV calls and the only defeat, against Cardiff Institute, was on the same Friday evening when five of the team were playing for the 1st in the 58-10 victory at Glamorgan Wanderers.

But the highlight of the recent games has to have been the match at St. Helen's where, using the favoured Alec Evans "negative split" approach, the Cardiff team turned a 13-15 half-time score in favour of Swansea into a magnificent 44-15 victory with 21 points coming in the final ten minutes.

IN THE CLUBHOUSE, there's been a roaring trade in Christmas lunches, among other things, which bears out one of the points chairman Mervyn John makes on these pages.

But the traffic is both ways — which is why Betty, Jeff, Darren, Vera and Angela, along with all the clubhouse staff, have asked for a paragraph to wish members a very Happy Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

### CUP THAT FILLS

TIME WAS, as they say, when the WRU Challenge Cup — as it was initially known — was regarded with the gravest suspicion by many people in the game. It was, they felt, a retrograde step to introduce unwanted competition into the sport.

Now, a little more than 20 years later, it is a major part of the season with the final attracting close to a full house with all the attendant pomp and circumstance.

Certainly, when Cardiff played their first-ever cup-tie on November 18, 1971, there was relatively little fuss — though club chairman Mervyn John, whose Christmas greetings you have just read, should perhaps remember it well.

The first opposition was Pentyrch, who incidentally make the short journey down to the Brewery Field in this afternoon's fourth round and who in 1971 forsook the home advantage of the draw to come to the Arms Park.

In the event Cardiff won 29-7, with Mervyn John scoring two tries and others coming from Alex Finlayson, Neil Williams and Roger Lane. Martin Pengilly kicked a penalty and converted three of the tries.

We went on to beat Tonyrefail and Pontypool away before scraping through perilously by 7-6 over Cardiff Training College in the quarter-final.

We then lost 16-9 to Neath at Bridgend in the semi-final. For several years, indeed, the cup was not the most successful of events for Cardiff, but we finally won the cup by beating Bridgend in the 1980-81 final.

This was the start of the golden cup era. Bridgend were beaten again in the final (on a try count after a 12-12 draw) in 1982, and, although, we made little progress the next year, we beat Neath in the final of 1983-84, lost to Llanelli 15-14 in 1985 and won the cup again in 1986 (against Newport) and 1987 (against

Swansea).

For three consecutive years, Neath then halted our progress at various stages before Newport beat us 12-4 in the sixth round last season.

There is no such thing as any easy cup-tie as several senior clubs can bear witness.

Cardiff, certainly, have had their moments of fear at the hands of the so-called minnows. There was that first-year struggle with Cardiff Training College, as we have recalled, but anyone who saw the matches at Garndiffaith (we won 9-0) in 1977-78, at Treorchy (in 1986-87 when we won 14-7) and at Ystradgynlais a year later (12-9) will confirm that the wee ones can't wait for the chance to topple the big boys.

As it happens, Cardiff have never played Maesteg in the Cup, now known as the SWALEC cup. There will be no complacency. And nor, if they win, will they relax in the next round despite a home draw against the winners today of the high-flying Second Division side Narberth against St Peters.

Among the players, the most popular suggestion for a present was for Owain Williams to receive a wardrobe. Not the piece of furniture, but something to wear which actually matches.

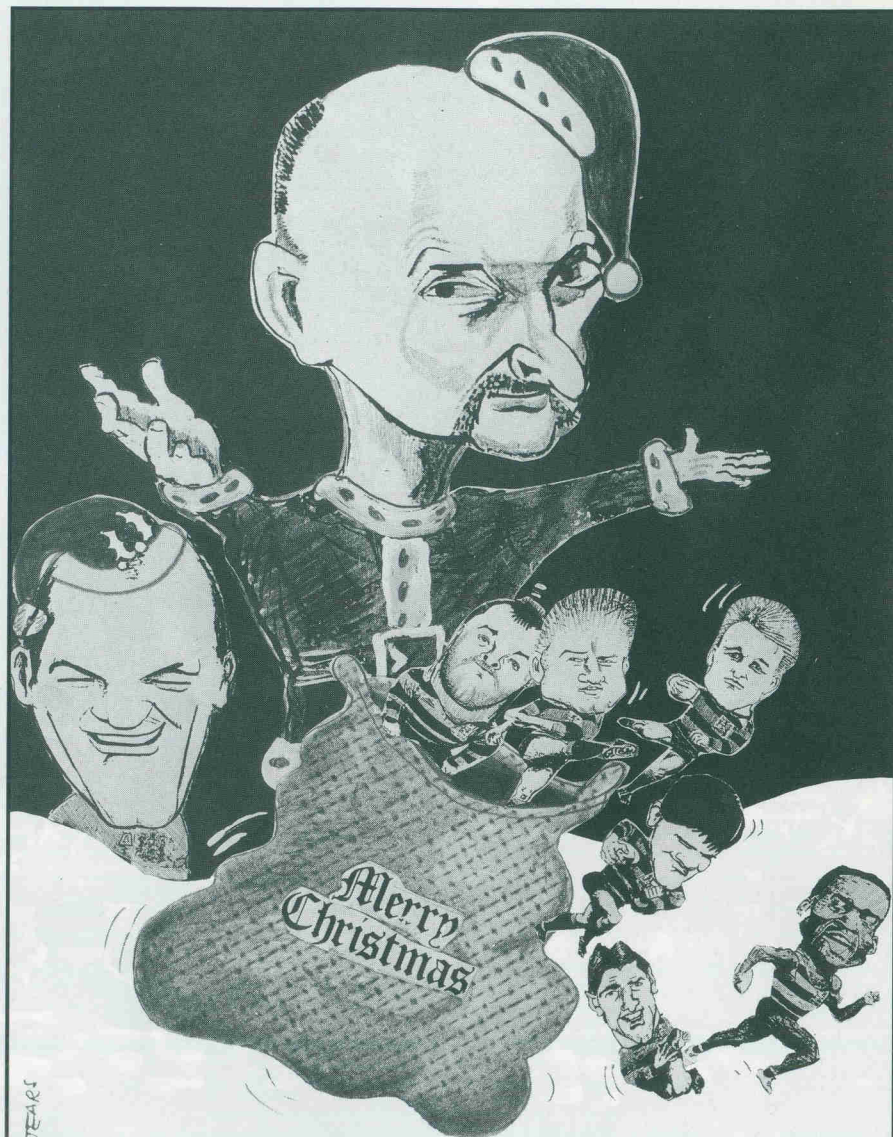

## KNOW THE LAWS

J. E. MALCOLM THOMAS

explains and interprets the laws of Rugby Football in his regular series.

This afternoon, he looks at life in the line-out.



### THE LINE-OUT – “JUMPING FOR THE BALL”

When jumping for the ball a player **must use both hands or his inside arm** to catch or deflect the ball.

If a player raises both arms equally while jumping for the ball and the “outside arm” deflects the ball, play should continue. What is important, in this situation, is the jumper having both arms in the air.

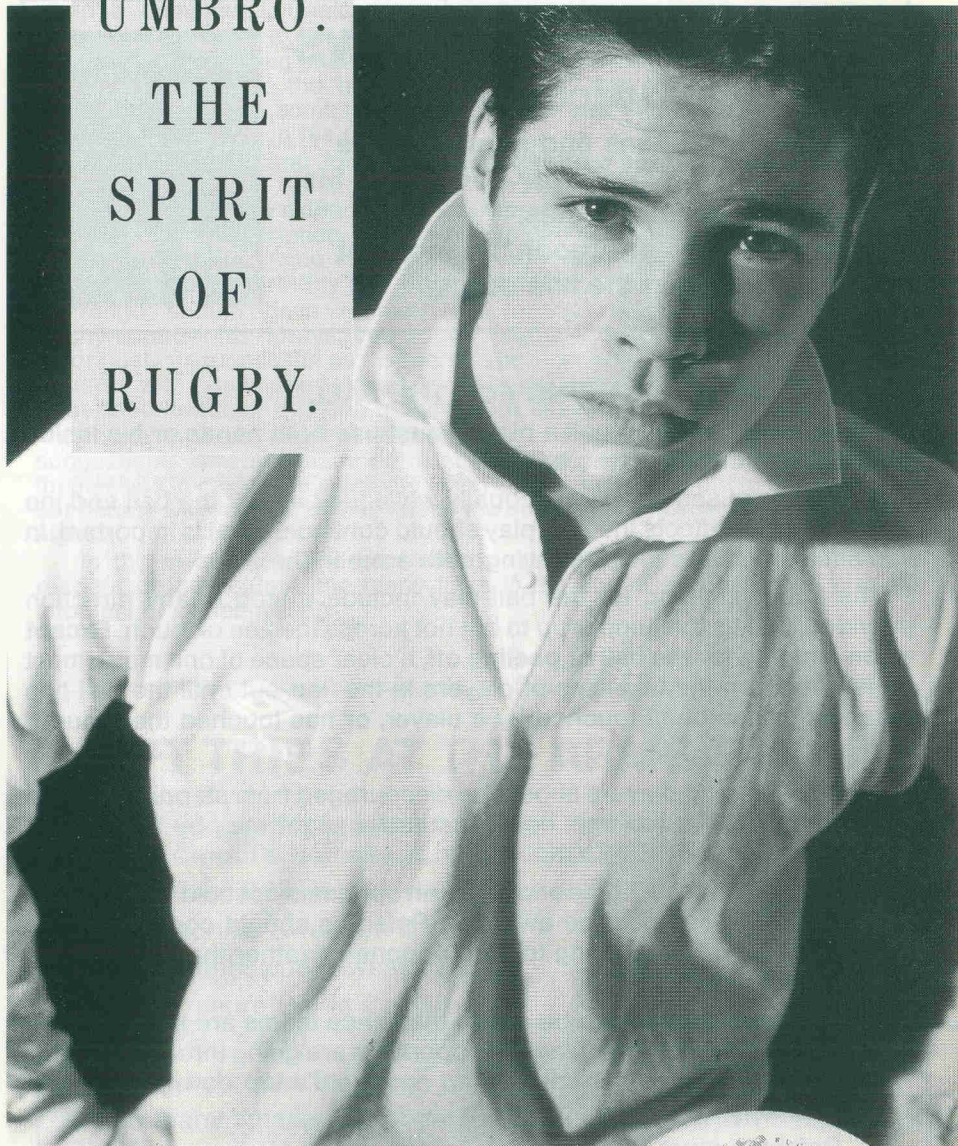
The act of jumping for the ball may include a step in any direction provided it takes the jumper up to but not across the line of touch. **Except when jumping for the ball or peeling off**, a clear space of one metre must be left between the two lines of players in the line-out until the ball has touched, or has been touched by a player, or has touched the ground.

Therefore:

1. Non jumping players should be discouraged from stepping into the gap until the ball has been touched, caught etc., by the referee awarding a **FREE KICK**.
2. If a player binds, holds or pushes an opponent not holding the ball – a **PENALTY** should be awarded. Referees should concentrate on what players are doing to their opponents rather than support for their own teams.
3. Referees should also be aware that since teams are lining up one metre from their own players, opponents are going through the line-out early. If a player catches an opponent’s tap down, he should definitely be **penalised for offside**.
4. Referees must be far stricter on opposition players who advance through the line-outs too quickly. Back row players, in particular, are being allowed to ruin three-quarter play because they are allowed through illegally by the referee. They should be **penalised for offside**.

Referees must be more concerned with the action of players towards the opposition than to their action to their own players.

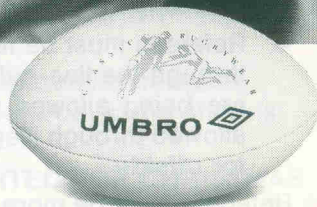
