

It seems so long since we last played on the Arms Park that it will be something akin to starting a new season with the advent of this evening's game. Even this is some three days ahead of schedule.

Many a significant event has occurred since we crossed swords at home with Pontypool on the 4th of January. None more so than the results achieved by the national side however which are beginning to show a change of fortune in the task of putting Wales back on top of the pack. The win against Ireland blew a very warm breeze of contentment and relief in the corridors of Welsh Rugby and, prematurely perhaps, the great optimists put a little bit too much on the win. The defeat by France at home was no real shock and at least we marked time on progress rather than digressed. To be twelve points down against France and come back to 12-9 shows that at last the fighting spirit is coming back into the Welsh game which has been very much in question over the past few seasons.

Both the Irish and French games didn't produce what one could call vintage rugby but this was understandable seeing that a winning result was the most important item on the agenda. Wales next outing to Twickenham is going to be something of a watershed, however. England will have played France by then and although it will be a very tough outing for the Englishmen in Paris, the form they are now beginning to show suggests that their meeting with Wales could be their last obstacle in a second consecutive grand slam. If that is the case it will certainly be a test of the new fighting spirit resurgent in the Welsh camp at the moment.

A creditable result there and a win at the Arms Park against Scotland would put the side in fine fettle for the visit of world champions Australia next season. In speaking of the Wallabies visit to Wales, they must be as disappointed as we are in the fact that we are not part of their list on their travels through Wales. As a club they certainly have a score to settle with us because our record against the Australian national team reads played 6, won 6. That of course means we beat them in 1984 but they then went on to a grand slam against the four Home union sides. Now that's not a bad record, is it?

On the home front the league position is now beginning to really hot up with several clubs now in with a shout of finishing in top spot. Pontypool are certainly setting the pace and their victories over ourselves and then Swansea put them top of the pile. Their ding dong game with Newport was no place for the faint hearted and the dismissal of their powerful No. 8 Dean Oswald had a marked result on the game which ended a 10-10 draw. His future absence could also play a significant part in their quest for Division 1 Championship. Their style of play is made to measure in the league structure however and they are going to be tough customers to dispose of.

Since that defeat at home to "Pooler" we steadied the ship somewhat with a creditable draw at Neath. This was not a very pretty to watch game but it was essential that we didn't suffer a further defeat and their object was achieved.

Skipper David Evans has now set his mind on consolidating our position in the league and a good run in the cup. Unfortunately David is going to be sidelined with his knee injury so his on field presence will be sorely missed. Hopefully he can have the appropriate remedial treatment and subsequent recuperation and he will soon be back in action.

The weather of the last month or so has not been that kind to some sides. Pontypridd have been worst hit and they now find themselves in the position of having to rearrange two league games and a cup tie. we have come off relatively lightly. Tonight's game should have taken place next Saturday but Swansea have to play their postponed cup game so they generously offered this evening as an alternative date. This is just about the best rearrangement we could have come up with because from now on in all the Saturdays left in the season are already taken up by league, cup or international games, so we offer Swansea our sincere thanks in being so co-operative in fixing up this rearranged game so speedily.

The resurgence of power at St. Helens is something the Swansea club fully deserve. Their contribution to Welsh Rugby over the years has been immense. They were certainly setting the place alight earlier on and have dished up some top grade rugby when playing at home. We lost our earlier league encounter on their ground by 23-9. During that game they scored 5 tries and a penalty. It was fortunate for us that all 5 conversions were missed or the defeat would have been heavier still. Still the 5 tries gave them an immense feeling of satisfaction because you can count the number of such times that they have scored so many times in a match on the fingers of your hand.


Their success this season has been reflected in the number of players they have in the Welsh squad. Last Saturday for instance they had 6 players in the side that took the field against France. Recently they have acquired the services of Scott Gibbs to add to the already huge amount of talent they have at their disposal. The Swansea pack is also getting a bit of steel about their presentation too and Stuart Davies is probably playing his best ever rugby at No. 8. He has certainly justified his selection in the national side.

Swansea will be looking to get back into winning ways again this evening as they know the competition at the top of the table is beginning to glow red hot. Defeat at this stage of the season pushes you down the table and once you start sliding it's quite a problem to climb back up again. This serves notice on us that they will come here tonight with only one result in mind, so it's watch out Cardiff—you have been warned.

In all we have played Swansea on 263 occasions. Some really great games have resulted and even given the introduction of the league with the consequent tight kind of game all 3 league games we have played have been quite high scoring. last year we won at home by 28-13, lost away 23-15 and lost away again this season by 23-9. The full record reads played 263, won 136, lost 98 and drawn 29. Points for 2,295 and against 1,941.

To Swansea then we say welcome again to Cardiff Arms Park and thank you for your ready co-operation in rearranging the scheduled date.

On the domestic scene the arrival of the very talented Adrian Davies, our forthcoming cup encounter with Newport are very much in mind. The Rags and the Youth sides are also going great guns so I give you more news of all these points in next Saturday's programme.







KNOW THE LAWS

By J. E. MALCOLM THOMAS THE PILE-UP

Referees are advised to arrive quickly at the breakdown and if the ball is not being played out the refereee should whistle immediately for a scrummage or a penalty.

If the ball is being played out, the referee should wait for a few seconds only and again blow his whistle for a scrummage or a penalty if it has not emerged.

The referee should not wait in the hope of it emerging and he should not penalise players belatedly for offside, as this is an "open play" situation.

However, penalties should be given immediately if players on the ground hold on to the ball or prevent opponents feeding it back or if players were offside at the original ruck or maul.

They should also be penalised immediately for "going over the top" or "killing the

It is illegal for any player to:-

- (1) wilfully fall on or over a player lying on the ground with the ball in his possession:
- (2) wilfully fall on or over players lying on the ground with the ball between them or in close proximity, or,
- while lying on the ground in close proximity to the ball to prevent an opponent from gaining possession of it.

CARIWR CLECS

REVEALED EXCLUSIVELY this evening is the background to one of the most controversial decisions in the history of Welsh rugby football: Arthur Emyr's World Cup attempt against Australia to drop a goal - something he had never achieved in senior rugby and a feat which remains a smouldering ambition.

In deference to this major scoop, Quidnunc has had his name above the column translated from Latin into Welsh for Mr. Emyr, as you will no doubt appreciate, tends to value with some fervour

(though not violence) most things Welsh.

But let him take up that fateful moment when the world held its breath and the Australians were

threatened with a unique event.

"I was in the wrong place at the time," says Arthur, "when Robert Jones threw out a pass two feet above my head. I leaped up and thought in fact that I'd done well to catch it at all.

"On the way down from my jump, I saw a human wall of golden shirts. And above them the posts I knew what I had to do. At the moment the ball left my hand, everything was in order but somewhere between there and the ball arriving at my foot all the confidence had dissipated. The rest is history"

It is indeed. Even during the Rags match against St. Peters last Thursday evening when the BIG A, as he is known, was attempting to prove his fitness for possible selection against his former team-mates tonight, a lone and plaintive voice warned the opposition, "Don't let him get within drop

goal range."

Despite the fact that it was a raw, potentially finger-breaking, muscle-pulling evening, Big Aor Gog as he used to be known at Swansea because of his North Walian background - enjoyed himself. "It did take time to become enthusiastic again after the World Cup and a couple of injuries have not helped but, basically, I just enjoy playing rugby."

In view of those injuries Quidnunc - sorry, Cariwr Clecs - asked somewhat unkindly how the slowest winger in Wales felt. "I saw Mike Hall yesterday," said Arthur, "and he was fine" (Sorry,

Mike, it was all in fun: honestly).

Arthur Emyr - he dropped the Jones some time ago: indeed, he took to task the influential Rothmans Rugby Union Yearbook for listing him as Emyr, Arthur (see Jones): its editor, Stephen Jones, is however Welsh also and understood these things) - was born in Bangor on July 27, 1962. His early rugby was at the David Hughes School, Menai Bridge, and he played also for the local club before reading law at Aberystwyth. He represented Welsh Universities before joining Swansea and has won 13 Welsh caps, generating sufficient speed with his 6ft. 21/2, 14 stone 10 frame for him to win a place in the Welsh 4x100 metres relay team when Colin Jackson dropped out. One way and another, his rugby has taken him to 21 different countries, including such exotic places as Fiji, Tonga, Samoa, Hong Kong, Oman, Monte Carlo, Trinidad, Barbados, Kenya - and Brazil.

Ten days into the tour of Brazil with the Penguins, Arthur celebrated his birthday. The team had with them a vellow T-shirt emblazoned with the words "I am the Penguins Chief Chicken Choker," which had to be worn each day from 12 noon to 12 midnight by a team member as punishment and never washed. Not to put too fine a point on it, the shirt stank by Day 12 when the young Arthur had to wear it as birthday boy to a welcoming party at the high class Sao Paulo Athletic Club. Everyone, in short, was in No. 1 gear except Arthur who was introduced to the beautiful Ana Toni, sister of a Sao Paulo player. "Perhaps Ana's English was not too good then, nor her sense of smell," he recalls with a smile. Clearly not: they are now married, and living in Penylan. Ana works for Action Aid and spends much time travelling the world, in helping Third World countries.

They have, in fact, only relatively recently come back from Brazil, where they celebrated New Year's Eve on Cococabana beach - "a sort of equivalent of New Year's Eve in Trafalgar Square except that it's warm and there were about three million people at the party, with an enormous fireworks display."

Off the field Arthur is a broadcaster and TV presenter, having started with Swansea Sound because "the law I read at University and I were not good bedfellows", enjoys watching Spender, listening to Genesis and collecting rugs and carpets from his many travels.

He enjoys also training with sprint coach Gwyn Griffiths (with earphones) and will continue to play rugby until Gwyn gets close to him in any race. And he is to be heard singing "Summer Time" all round the world if required.

But most of all, perhaps, he likes to relax over an Italian meal. It appears that just about every Italian waiter in Cardiff recognises him - not because of his rugby but through his appearances on Sgorio, introducing Italian soccer action. But he's never had a free meal






