





A FOOT IN BOTH CAMPS

Mr. Bill Davies, that venerable collator of articles for these match programmes kindly asked me to prepare a note setting out the differences in full-back play from my playing days (some 20-30 years ago) and the present time. Apart from the greater involvement which the modern day full-back is expected to undertake in the attacking dimension, the change from the traditional boots of yesteryear to the present day "slippers" resulting in round the corner goalkicking (Ray Cheney, Barry John and others have a lot to answer for!) there is precious little difference that has taken place in a generation or so in the role of this position. I accept however that there might have been a dramatic change since the time of, for example, Frank Trott of Cardiff, and Des Jones of Pontypridd. I understand that these two gentlemen in their day graced the full-back position but since those days are shrouded in the mists of time I am not qualified to comment further. I thus set pen to paper on something completely differ-

One of the last games I played for Cardiff was in January 1970 at Ynysangharad Park, Pontypridd. Little did I know at that time that only a few years later I would be working and eventually living in Pontypridd and have happily been here for 18 years or so. The Pontypridd side on that distant day was as follows:- John Groves; G. Rees, Joe Smith, W. Davies, A. Ashcroft; A. Paul, Dennis John; J. Hale, W. Evans, B. Davey, Bob Pemberthy, Colin Owen, Tommy David, D. Morgan and J. Pope.

Several of that side have subsequently contributed to the well-being of Pontypridd in different ways - Joe Smith, Bob Pemberthy and Dennis John have played their part on the coaching scene. Whilst, to quote Owen Monev. a certain Tom David at that time could not even spell Pontypridd - nowadays he owns half of it. Many of that Pontypridd side were friends of mine then and continue to be so. One was always quaranteed a warm welcome in Pontypridd both on and off the field and fortunately the same applies at the present time. In truth, the welcome in Pontypridd is probably among the best in Welsh rugby and players, committee and supporters are to be complimented for this croeso. The "clubhouse" then used by Pontypridd was quite unique - once you had entered it was virtually impossible to leave as a long-suffering girlfriend of mine at that time would doubtless testify. Much has changed over those years

not least the transfer in 1974 from Ynysangharad Park to Sardis Road and the stadium is now one of the finest in Wales. It is pleasing to record that Pontypridd have recently struck good form and with these improved results there is a strong rumour circulating in South Wales that the club's hardworking and inimitable Secretary, Cenydd Thomas, might one of these fine days break into a smile.

What of my old club, Cardiff? Most rugby lovers in Wales are surely saddened by their recent traumas but it is heartening that things now seem to be improving and that the good times again are just round the corner. That old Neath guru, Rees Stephens, was always of the View that if Cardiff were strong then Wales were strong. I admit that rugby has changed dramatically since Rees made that statement - however I am sure that there is still much to be said for his adage. I owe a lot to Cardiff and am proud of my association with this great club. Tremendous players have worn the blue and black colours over the years - many of them legends in Welsh rugby. Of all these stars however the one that epitomised what was best in Cardiff and rugby in particular was the late lamented Stan Bowes. What a man - what memories.

Having a foot in both camps causes no embarrassment or division in loyalty although I am often subject to some friendly leg-pulling. What is of paramount importance is the health and well-being of rugby football — a game which is, as Hubert Johnson often said the greatest freemasonry in the world. I do hope that present day players stay loyal to their club's and not, as a few do change clubs more often than a chameleon changes colours. Why not follow the example set by Pontypridd's President, Sam Simon and always wear the same jacket — it may do little for the world of high fashion but at least it has continuity and stability on its side.

Let us hope that today will witness a game of rugby which will be a credit to the great traditions of Pontypridd and Cardiff and that both clubs will contribute to the further development of Welsh rugby. Their contribution thus far has been immense – even more is expected in the future.

By the way, that game I mentioned between the two clubs in 1970 resulted in a Cardiff win by 15 points to 5. For the sake of diplomacy I will today probably wear a Neath tie!

WHAT DO YOU THINK? WRITE IN AND TELL US

A development which appears to be gaining ground, if not acceptance, is the substitution of players rather than the replacement of an injured player. Both in the Grand Slam game against England last season and in their match against Wales, French players have appeared to leave the field on a tactical basis rather than an injured basis. Before our readers in France point to another plot against their team, the same issue was raised in the Heineken League game between Newport and Llanelli, when the replacement warmed-up on the touchline before replacing an "injured" player.

There are points of view on both sides on substitution or replacement, but it would be better for the image of the game as a whole if sham injuries were removed by allowing teams to substitute players if they so wished. As with replacements, there would be a maximum number allowed and, unlike rugby league, once a player has left the field he cannot return. Players can always fake injuries to be replaced so why not remove this sham before it gets out of control and causes real problems for the games administrators?

Mike Morgan was top points scorer with 67 while Roy Hope topped 100 points for the youth.

The Youth had their best ever season winning 26 of 30 games. Total gate money for the season was £406.

Then it is true, in spite of Euclid's vehement denials, that the whole is shown to be greater than the sum of its parts.

BRISTOL BOUNTY

The fact that success does not come by accident was amply illustrated in two recent instances, against Tondu and Bristol, both

here at Sardis Road. One of the less desirable spin-offs of the Heineken League is, as we all know, the devaluation of the once-soimportant friendly fixtures, especially with teams from across the border. We Welsh sides seem to 'switch off' completely in these games, although the English sides, with some years more experience of the transition between League and friendly rugby, seem to cope much better. Anyway, Bristol gave us a proper run-around the other evening, the final 26-10 scoreline in their favour being distinctly unflattering to them, as the final try count 5-1 in Bristol's favour would indicate. 
ABOLISH GIANT-KILLERS!
