

Last season Neath won the inaugural Heineken League Premier Division Championship with something to spare and Cardiff finished fourth, below both Llanelli and Bridgend. Since then we have had a World Cup, a Five Nations Championship, a General Election, a Christmas and an Easter, not to mention a birthday, and in my case even more memorable, a pint or two with Colin Howe.

How things change, this season, Neath have lost seven games, and at best can achieve only a joint fourth place, whilst Cardiff are going to stay second from the bottom, even if they win today. Such are the vagaries of League Rugby. Neverthless Neath have won the last five league games, and Cardiff their last two, and should the season be starting now, not finishing, I am sure that the positions in the 1st Division would be looking very different.

We last entertained Neath at the Arms Park on December 8th 1990. On that occasion our visitors were not imbued with the Christmas spirit, and decided against making us a present of that match. As a matter of fact it could be said that they were somewhat churlish in beating us 24 points to 3, which is not the way guests should behave, so we reciprocated by beating them 18 points to 3 at the Gnoll later in the season. Since then we have drawn with them again the the Gnoll, in January this year.

We have been playing Neath since 1878, and apart from the very earliest of days, probably some time before Brian Thomas joined them, there has never been an easy game against the All Blacks, and in recent years we have found success singularly difficult to achieve. During the last five or six years they have been the outstanding Club side in Wales winning either the Championship or the Cup, and both of them on a couple of occasions. Whether you liked their style or not, it is impossible to argue against their record, they certainly gave the rugby people in Wales a winning side on which to focus their thoughts, whilst the National team were experiencing a torrid time.

CARDIFF YOUTH - SEASON 1991-92

The Youth team, captained by Howard Merrett finished the 15-a-side season with impressive wins in the ESSO and District Cups to retain both trophies.

Coaches Jack Lewis and Gareth Jones and Chairman/Team Manager, Jim O'Donnell were delighted with the tremendous commitment and strength of character of this year's squad. In the ESSO Final against Maesteg, they scored 7 tries in their 34-9 victory. Huw Harries stepped in for the injured Matthew Brant to score 2 tries with others from Chris John, Martyn Madden, Stephen Rouch, Lawrence Dovey and Andrew Lewis.

In the bruising encounter with the merged Rumney Utd-Cardiff Harlequins team in the Cardiff & District Cup, a disciplined 2nd half saw Chris Mills, Paul Hennessy and Simeon Brunker outstanding. Stephen John and Chris John scored tries with Chris converting one, kicking two penalties and a drop goal with no reply from the opposition.

The 1000 points barrier was reached in their last game in a Season which saw 6 defeats in 36 games. There were notable victories over Coventry, Neath, Nuneaton, Glam. Wanderers, Newport, Northampton and Cheltenham. On their highly successful Irish Tour, they drew with Highfield and won at Cork Constitutional.

International caps at Youth and School level were won by Chris John, Andrew Lewis, Jason Hewlett, Stephen John, James Savastano with Chris Wilkins and Paul Douglas playing for Wales in non-capped games.

Top scorer was Jason Hewlett with 111 points, followed closely by Chris John with 109 in only 10 games.

Stephen Rouch was Top Try Scorer with 20 and Prop Paul Douglas was second with 14. A total of 280 tries were scored during the campaign.

Two Seven Competitions by the Youth where they retained the District and Mitre trophies concluded the Season.

At U16's level, the Club side coached by David Williams and Andy Moore won all but one of their 19 games.

Major successes include the double over Bath and victories against Neath, Llanelli, Newport, Cross Keys and Marseille. Andrew Fowler was capped at U16's level against England with Jason Kemble sitting the game out on the bench.







KNOW THE LAWS

RUGBY'S RULE CHANGES FOR SEPTEMBER 1992

A. THE SCRUM

- 1. In scrummages, front rows must advance to one arm's length of opponents and may not form scrummage until the referee has marked the place of engagement.
- 2. In a set scrummage the hooker may raise his foot when the ball leaves the hands of the player putting it in.
- 3. It will be illegal intentionally to lift an opponent off his feet or force him upwards out of a
- 4. When a five metre scrum is awarded it will be opposite the place where the ball became dead and not where it crossed the goal line.
- 5. The half back may not take any action while the ball is still in the scrummage to convey to opponents that the ball is out.

B. THE MAUL

An EXPERIMENTAL VARIATION, to be reviewed in one year's time states that:

"In a maul when the ball becomes unplayable, the team not in possession at the start of the maul will put the ball into the ensuing scrum."

To meet the requirements of this particular law, which, incidentally, is already part of Under 19 rugby, the players in possession must take the initiative and be more positive. Of all the law changes, this is the real challenge to players and coaches.



"The new potatoes looked superb so I asked for more as they were put on my plate," he recalls. "Ah," said the Master of the College, "I see you like water chestnuts".

And so another season passed. Summer well... and you may hear from me next September.
