



This evening we extend a very warm welcome to good friends of very long-standing—CARDIFF for a 1st Division Heineken League fixture which is being played in mid-week due to Cardiff's traditional engagement with the Barbarians on Saturday next.

It will be interesting to see whether some of the Bridgend "Old Boys"—MIKE GRIFFITHS, MIKE HALL, MIKE BUDD and PAUL KAWULOK will be installed in the Visitors dressing-room for a change. Mike Hall, despite recent injury, has settled well into the role of captain and no doubt would love to be in the action for tonight's encounter.

Heineken League rugby brought Cardiff bittersweet moments. In the inaugural season of 1990/91 Cardiff finished fourth—one place and one point behind Bridgend having won 10 and drawn one of their 18 league fixtures.

Last year was a disaster from start to finish. Cardiff only managed five wins and a draw in 18 league outings and finished with only Maesteg underneath them. The appointment of Aussie

Alex Evans as their senior coach lifted morale at the Arms Park and Cardiff have been championship challengers since they won at Aberavon on the opening day of the season, 15-6. Mr. Evans has already indicated he will stay on at the Arms Park next season—much to the relief of the Club.

This season, Cardiff have won 16 of their 19 league fixtures. Llanelli achieved a seasonal double over them winning 18-13 at Stradey Park and 11-6 at Arms Park while Neath dented Cardiff's championship aspirations last month with a 11-6 win at the Courage Gnoll. After tonight's game Cardiff host Newport on April 17 before moving on to what could be a championship decider at St. Helen's on May 1 with Swansea searching for a 100th win over Cardiff in their 265—match series—Cardiff have won 137.

This season fly half Adrian Davies has already secured two Heineken records. He shattered David Love's league record of 196 points in the 6-3 win at Pontypridd and went on to become the first player to score 200 league points in a season during a 36-7 win over the





Leading try scorer is newly capped Wales' wing Nigel Walker on 14, followed by Adrian Davies (10), Mike Budd and Simon Hill (both 6), Mike Rayer and Stuart Roy (both 4). Since the league began three years ago,

Steve Ford has scored most league tries for Cardiff with 19. Behind Davies on the overall points chart comes the unluckiest player of the season in Welsh rugby Mike Rayer with 198 points, and the forgotten man, David Evans, on

Tonight's game will be the 133rd meeting between the Clubs. Cardiff have won 62, Bridgend 56 with 14 drawn. Cardiff have scored 1,341 points to Bridgend's 1,178. Not only have Bridgend got a superb record at the Arms Park but those set of figures are the best of any Club that regularly features on the Cardiff fixture list. No Club is in credit with Cardiff over victories seven straight wins and Bridgend will hold a unique record!

The advent of Heineken League sees the record between the Clubs standing on Bridgend three wins, Cardiff one with one drawn. Cardiff's lone victory over Bridgend, 39-7, was achieved at the Arms Park on October 31 1992—the day the appointment of Clive Norling as Club director of rugby was announced to the waiting press on the steps of the Cardiff changing rooms.

Previously, Bridgend won 10-9 at Cardiff in 1990/91 before being held to a 15-15 draw at the Brewery Field in the return fixture. Last year Bridgend won 28-9 at home and 18-14 at Cardiff. Despite the League importance of this evening's game to both sides, we hope the occasion will be an enjoyable one, both on and off the field, for officials, players and supporters of both sides.

GREAT YOUTH WIN AND RECORDS

Bridgend Youth recorded their most significant victory of the season when they beat Cardiff at Sophia Gardens, 39-16 on March 27. Their record this season (up to and including Cardiff) reads: played 27, won 14, drawn 2, lost 11. Points for 745, against 510. Tries scored 104.

Leading try scorer is Mark Hopkins, injured in the David Chinn Memorial match at Maesteg on Boxing Day, with 13 to his credit. He is followed by Andrew Richards 12, Larry Bateman 11, Nick Edwards 9, Nathan Thomas 7 (a Wales Senior Group international this season), Anthony Randall 7, Bleddyn Davies 5, Adrian Durston 5, Gareth Edwards 5.

For a second successive season Matthew Pearce has reached 200 points. Having scored 249 points last winter, he is currently on 204 this season. Mark Hopkins has scored 84 points with Adrian Durston on 42.

Coming in respectively for Julian Derrick and Nigel Spender. MARK JONES returns to the bench after injury.






