Know the Laws - No. 33 by FRED CROSTER

With Trials, special coaching squads and all the build up prior to the forthcoming tour of New Zealand very much in all rugby people's minds, a little time devoted to the refereeing aspects thereof will I feel sure, be timely.

Some supporters may have spoken to Derek Robinson of Fiji, who is over here.

He is a well known referee in Fiji, refereed the torrid Fiji v. New Zealand encounter and since he has been in South Wales, has controlled a number of games at Junior level; under the system of administration he is precluded from officiating at W.R.U. games.

Of one important aspect he is absolutely adamant. 'Lying on the ball'. If our players insist upon holding on to the ball and not releasing it when they have been tackled, they will in no uncertain manner be heeled with that very ball. There will be no mercy shown and they have only

themselves to blame.

Law 16 states: and I quote:—

Section 2(c)

"The tackled player, if lying on the ground, must release the ball immediately without playing it in any way and get up or move away from it.

He must not play the ball until he has got up on to his feet."

Our own Ken Jones has vivid recollections of the New Zealand

method of dealing with those who do not comply.

He will never forget, on the last Lion's Tour when he hung on just that shade too long and before he knew what had hit him, their forwards were in, a loose scrum was formed and out he came ball and all.

The stud marks have faded but the memory never will.


