We bring you at enormous expense Santa Dawes and his Merry Men, all the way from Old Reindeer Park. (John has to be Santa because his name rhymes and Freddie Williams couldn't make it.) The Supporting cast in this Nativity play is quite impressive. At Full Back they have John Williams as the Star that Shines in the East. They have Three very Wise Men in the back row in John Taylor, Mervyn Davies, and Skipper Tony Gray. Know the Laws by FRED CROSTER
