A HUNDRED YEARS OF RUGBY

Do not get confused in your sun-stroked brain about the seniority of today's participants. Both clubs are celebrating their centenaries, but those playing in dark blue and light blue are senior to the Black and Blues by a short head.

Apparently, Llandaff R.F.C. owes much of its early origins to the graduates of Oxbridge, who came to the Theological College at Llandaff. With an act of graciousness and typical British compromise, they adopted the combined colours of those Universities as their club colours. They must have played to a fair standard too, because an L. Watkins of Llandaff was in the first ever Welsh XV.

At their inception they were nick-named (perhaps Nick is not an appropriate word in this context) Dean Vaughans Doves. Apparently this was a very euphemistic title since they were much nearer the Hawks than any Dove. They play of course at the famous Bishop's Field at Llandaff where they have been kicking up daisies for the last hundred years. During this time they have probably nurtured more Cardiff R.F.C. players than any other single club in Wales. Even a quick resumé of the more recent importations gives us names like Hubert Johnson, Les Spence, Gwyn Porter, Rex Willis, Stan Bowes, the Bowcott Brothers and Ken George, our General Secretary. These names are ones that quickly come to mind, there are dozens of others. An interesting observation is that Rex Willis and Derek Iles joined Cardiff from Llandaff together, and before the year was out, Rex, who didn't even play in a Cardiff trial, had made the Cardiff 1st XV, Wales, the Barbarians and the British Lions teams.

Our relationship with them goes back to 1879-80, when we beat them 39-0, and 1927-28 when we won 8-5. Since then the Rags have played them on 35 occasions, winning 27 and losing three. We also played them during the season 1951-52, which was of course our 75th anniversary.

In what is a proud and momentous season for both clubs, may we as the one half of the Cardiff twin centenarians, wish the other another hundred years of successful Rugby.
