Programme Notes . . .

We are pleased today to welcome Cardiff as our third Welsh visitors to Twickenham this season. Wins against Llanelli and Swansea mean that the Quins are on target for a noteworthy hat trick. It would also complete a very satisfactory double when linked with the away win at Cardiff on Easter Monday. Unfortunately both sides are below full strength as the fixture clashes with Wales v Japan and another full Saturday of County Championship matches. Cardiff also await the return of their injured Lions. However, their early season form has been very impressive and arrive with a record which reads P15, W13, DO, L2 Pts. For 341 - Against 167. County absentees give the recently joined New Zealander Brett Codlin the opportunity to make his mark and for Terry Claxton to make a rare appearance at tight head.

Last week, the visit of another touring side, Canada, against whom England, gave an unconvincing display, prompted the rearrangement of our merit table game against Rosslyn Park. As it turned out conditions were vastly improved compared with the rain and wind of Saturday. Quins struggled to a 6-4 pts win despite having much of the territorial advantage. Points failed to come despite the pressure and was in part due to the Park's defence but also because the advantage law did not seem to be judiciously applied.

At full strength the quality of the players in the current Quins side is undeniable but an improvement in co-ordination and making the right decision during the game is necessary before the full potential of the team is realised.

The Wanderers received a much needed boost to their confidence with a win last Saturday over a Coventry side which included a number of normally 1st XV players. Let us hope this now sets them on course for a repeat of last season's high quality performances.

The next three weeks bring us a string of merit table games. Success is vital when looking ahead to next year's National Merit Table. But for today may we hope that the match is in keeping with the long tradition of matches between our two clubs.


