



Cardiff v. Ebbw Vale

FRIDAY, 8th NOVEMBER, 1985 KICK OFF 7.15 p.m.

With the five nations championship just around the corner, Wales fire a warning into the bank tomorrow in the shape of their game against Fiji. Hopefully, we will see a contest of thrilling rugby to lighten some of the gloom that seems to have been in evidence for most of the season. The occasion severs our strength appreciably as we will be short of Terry Holmes, Adrian Hadley, Ian Eidman, Jeff Whitefoot and Bob Norster. That's quite a quintet for any team to be without, nevertheless we wish them all the very best of luck for tomorrow.

With national appearances plus our injury list, life is being made very difficult for our selectors these days. Still the two games a week silly season comes to a close tonight so things may ease a little from here on in. Gerald Cordle has become the latest injury victim and could be out for up to a month. Our most tragic injury remains Mark Ring however, We are certainly missing his magnificent flair and the unique unpredictability of his game. The rehabilitation process at Talgarth is going well and we look forward to the day when he treads the Arms Park turf once more.

It's welcome tonight however to Ebbw Vale a very popular and happy club in both triumph and adversity and in this respect could teach most of us a lesson. This year they are being coached by a man who is as synonomous with rugby in Ebbw Vale as Michael Foot is with politics. I refer of course to the Silver Fox of Eugene Cross Park, Phil Gardner, A great flanker in his playing days with Ebbw and considered very unlucky by many not to graduate to representative honours, he has already applied the same loyalty and commitment to his new appointment. Previous coaches lan Morgan and David Rees have handed over a far more experienced squad than when they took charge.

Added to this comes the bonus that Clive Burgess, the iron man, is now available regularly again, as is another player of great experience, David Fryer. The latter forms a second row with the very promising up and coming young giant Wayne Matthews. Capped at Youth level in 1983, Ebbw have great hopes for his future development. Behind these comes a back row as good as most in Wales of Clive Burgess, Carl Dennehy and Neil Robinson who is in his second year of captaincy and along with Wayne Matthews played in all the first 16 games this season.

In a pack with such a back five then it is capable on its day of giving anyone a headache and their form this season is now beginning to settle. They started off with two good wins at home against Newbridge and Rhymney but then lost the next five games. Heavy defeats resulted against Pontypool away 47-12, Glamorgan Wanderers home 22-16, Neath at home 37-13 and South Wales Police home 33-4. They picked themselves up however and after going down to Bridgend away by the narrow margin of 9-7, they produced what is probably their best result of the season so far. Aberavon came to Eugene Cross full of confidence after beating Bath and had every reason to think that Ebbw would be their next scalp. That was not to be however and the home side won by a very comprehensive margin of 28-6.

This heralded rather a revival and the following five games were won including very good away wins against Gloucester and centenary celebrating Cross Keys. They went down at home to Swansea by 12-9 but were back on winning ways again last Saturday at Cheltenham when they won by 22-15 with outside half Colin Watkins collecting 14 points.

In all we have played Ebbw Vale 57 times, winning 33 to their 19 with the remaining 5 drawn. We have scored 857 points for to 466 against. So once again we offer a warm welcome this evening to all our good friends from Ebbw Vale.

With the Fijian game out of the way this weekend all interest will focus on the Schweppes Cup first round. As you know we travel to Cyncoed to meed South Glam. Institute; if we win, it will give us a home tie against the winners of Pencoed or Gorseinon. This will be our third cup encounter against S.G.I. in its present form or as it was previously known. In our very first meeting in 1972 we scraped in at home by the narrowest of margins 7-6, but won the other fairly comfortably by 42-16 at home in 1976.

KNOW THE LAWS

THE PENALTY TRY

A penalty try shall be awarded between the posts if — but for foul play by the defending team —

(a) a try would probably have been scored, or

(b) a try would probably have been scored in a more favourable position than that where the ball was grounded.

The important operative word is PROBABLY, i.e., a penalty try is awarded when a try would PROBABLY have been scored but was prevented by an infringement of LAW 26 — Foul Play and Misconduct.

If the referee has any doubt as to the balance or probability, he should give the benefit of the doubt in favour of the non-offending team and award the penalty try.

A good example for the award of the penalty try is when the attacking team, at a 5 metre scrummage, hold the ball in their back row and attempt to push the defending team back over its goal-line.

The defending team may collapse the scrummage deliberately to prevent the push-over, or a defending player may dive into the attacking side of the scrummage to prevent the try. I am sure many readers will remember Dennis Templeton's award of such a penalty try for Cardiff in their victory over Australia last season.

Players are always unsure as to whether they can 'charge' the conversion after a penalty try. The answer is YES.

PAST PLAYERS CORNER W. B. CLEAVER

Bill Cleaver was born in Treorchy and educated at Pentre Grammar School. His academic prowess was soon in evidence and he gained a scholarship in airship engineering at Cardiff University where he was to gain his B.Sc. It was whilst at that seat of learning that he came into prominence with Cardiff where he played at half back with his partner Billy Darch.

He was on hand to resume in official fixtures in season 1945-46 and won his first team cap that year. He soon became known as 'Billy the Kick' because of his lethal feet. He was a tower of strength to his own forwards and a scourge to those of the opposition with kicks that only travelled just over finger tip high for many, many a yard. It wasn't his boots that did that trick either because invariably there was more elastoplast than leather on his feet.

He was one of those who played in the Middlesex Sevens in 1946 in defence of the title we had won in 1939. The tournament is now famous for the fantastic semi-final clash between ourselves and Charlie Saxton's Kiwi. We won as a result of a phenomenal try scored by the one and only Cliff Davies. Alas it took so much out of our team that we fell in the final to St. Mary's Hospital a very experienced outfit.

Season 1947-48 arguably Cardiff's best saw Bill's international career take off when he won the first of his 14 caps. Indeed he was one of eleven Cardiff players to represent Wales that year. He gained further honours in 1950 when he was selected with Bleddyn Williams, Jack Matthews, Rex Willis and Cliff Davies to tour with the 1950 British Lions to The Antipodes. He was actually elected captain of Cardiff for season 1950-51 but opted to retire at the end of the Lions tour. He was not quite finished however as he did valuable service on the committee from 1951 to 1959.

He had a brilliant industrial career and after top management jobs throughout South Wales with the N.C.B. he finally became Deputy Director of the South Wales Coal Field. He was also very instrumental in making Blaenavon 'Big Pit' into a museum. Perhaps his playing colleagues will best remember him however for his fabulous kicking, his elastoplast fortified boots and his rendering of Macushla.






