



Cardiff v. Pencoed

Schweppes Cup, Second Round SATURDAY, 21st DECEMBER, 1985 KICK OFF 3 p.m.

This may well be the last Saturday before Christmas, but for the good people of Pencoed shopping has been postponed until Monday because as far as they are concerned, there is only one place to be today and that's here at Cardiff Arms Park. They want to share with the Pencoed players and officials the finest moment of the club's 97 years existence. Little did founder members Edward Christie and village blacksmith David Watkins realise that their deliberations would create such enthusiasm.

They had risked their all by bringing rugby to the village in defiance of the local church and chapel dignataries who could see nothing but the devil in this 'ungodly sport'. Established, it became however, and has progressed until today, and is now an integral part of Pencoed life. They had a very nomadic existence between 1888 and 1924 when for various reasons they played in no fewer than 27 different fields. Equally nomadic was their use of hostelries as changing accommodation and watering holes, and The Kings Head, The Britannia, and The Railway figured prominently in those early days. The Local Miners Welfare Association put an end to their wanderings however in 1924 when they allowed the club the use of their new playing field. It remains to this day as their No. 1 pitch although now the responsibility of Ogwr District Council.

A clubhouse was their next priority and this came immediately after the war when The Royal Ordnance Factory handed over the wooden pavilion they had constructed on the ground. This served until 1960 when a joint venture between Pencoed Athletic Club and the local council devised a scheme to produce the present headquarters. The council were short of cash to provide the whole venture but on the suggestion of the then current chairman of the Athletic Club Tom Jones, the council provided the materials and the Pencoed club provided the labour and skill. The building was completed in two years and all Pencoed are rightly proud of this superb community effort in providing such an edifice.

As the village prospered and grew to dormitory town status the rugby club grew accordingly. Today it fields three senior sides, a youth side, mini and under-14 organisations along with some 800 members. Pencoed has also provided its fair share of material to the Cardiff club. This was particularly so at youth level before they formed their own youth team. Gareth Jones obtained his youth cap whilst-with Cardiff Youth and other Pencoed boys who featured prominently were Adrian Jones, Hugh Richards, lan Griffiths and Bleddyn Rees to name but a few. They have also provided some ten schoolboy caps and it is nice to see two of those Julian Fear and Gareth Hiscocks are in today's team.

Lyn (The Leap) Davies was another to figure prominently in Pencoed's past and a bright future was foreseen for him had he not packed up to concentrate on athletics. Also in the 1930 Pencoed side were men such as Ivor Thomas of The Lamb and Flag, Glynneath and Swaddy Watkins of The Coed-y-Mwstwr County Club donned the Blue and Black jersey. In the early 1950's W.E. (Billy) Davies figured at prop, to be followed by Gwyn Hopkins a former captain of Pencoed, who featured at centre. But without doubt Pencoed's best known son to those of us in Cardiff is the inimitable P.L. Jones. What a favourite he was during his Arms Park career with his storming, battering ram runs down the touch line which could have struck fear into a squad of SAS men. Since leaving Cardiff in 1976 he has played a leading role in the affairs at Pencoed. A past captain he is still playing besides assisting chief coach Cliff Richards, who also had a brief spell with Cardiff. In fact P.L. is on the bench today and I'll have a few bob on the fact that if he has to take the field at all it will bring the biggest cheer of the day from the crowd.

Since their entry as a full member of the W.R.U. they have contributed substantially to the administration of Welsh Rugby. Les Watkin a former club secretary for 30 years was also a leading first class referee. The current President Glyn Bedder has been a member of the W.R.U. Executive since 1972 and is also a great friend of the Cardiff Club. Additionally, I am indebted to him for providing the material for these notes. Secretary Roy Giddings is also the Secretary of East District R.U. and current Chairman Howard Jones is a serving member of Glamorgan County R.F.C.

Yes, Pencoed think that their founder members would have been very proud indeed of the achievements since 1887. As the present custodians sit back in their excellent clubhouse overlooking their ground, they can feel 10 feet tall. It will be a very proud moment when Pencoed take the field at 3 o'clock this afternoon. I am also reminded of a brief and final appendage to Glyn Bedder's notes which reads — 13th April, 1918: Pencoed R.F.C. 5 points, Cardiff R.F.C. 0.

It only remains then to offer the warmest of welcomes to Pencoed. Be you a player, administrator or supporter we sincerely hope you enjoy the activities of the day.

Finally, on behalf of the committee and players we would like to extend to you all our very best wishes for Christmas and a prosperous 1986.

KNOW THE LAWS

KICK AT GOAL AFTER A TRY

After a try has been scored, the scoring team has the right to take either a place kick or a drop kick at goal, on a line through the place where the try was scored.

If the scoring team does not take the kick, play shall be restarted by a drop kick from the centre, unless time has expired.

If a kick is taken:-

(a) it must be taken without undue delay. A period of one minute is well inside the zone of 'undue delay', If the delay is clearly a breachof law, the kick should be disallowed and a kick-off ordered.

(b) any player, including the kicker may place the ball. The kick must be taken with the ball which was in play unless the referee decides that the ball is defective. (c) the kicker's team except the placer, must be behind the ball when kicked.

(d) If the kicker kicks the ball from a placer's hands without the ball being on the ground, the kick is void.

(e) The opposing team must be behind the goal line until the kicker begins his run, or offers to kick, when they may charge or jump with a view to preventing a goal.

Neither the kicker nor a placer shall wilfully do anything which may lead the opposing team to charge prematurely. If either does so, the charge shall not be disallowed.

For an infringement by the kicker's team - the kick shall be disallowed. For an infringement by the opposing team - the charge shall be disallowed. If however, the kick has been taken successfully, the goal shall stand. If it was unsuccessful, the kicker may take another kick, under the original conditions, without the charge - and may change the type of kick.

PAST PLAYERS CORNER MALCOLM COLLINS - A TRIBUTE

The news of Malcolm's death absolutely stunned us at The Cardiff Rugby Club. His good recovery from a heart attack over two years ago had left us all with the impression that Mal was indestructible. He was a big man in every sense of the word, big in stature, status, character, personality and most of all in humanity. His playing and administration days with Cardiff are an example to us all. He joined in 1949, made the second row position his own and won his first XV cap in his inaugural year. He played in the 1953 side's epic win over the All Blacks and went on to become captain of the club and then during his administrative days became chairman in season 1977-78. This triple distinction was a feat achieved by only one other of that great side.

Throughout his career as both a player and administrator he worked on the philosophy that only the best was good enough for Cardiff be it on or off the field. This he was still practising as a current season selector and he left no stone unturned in his efforts to make sure that Cardiff were

always on top.

To meet Malcolm was a pleasant experience and to become his friend was a great honour. They don't come much bigger or better in this world and a huge void has been left in the Cardiff Club because of his passing. True testimony of the big man was his funeral when upwards of 400 people congregated to pay tribute to the life of Malcolm Collins. Not one single person was present because they were duty bound. From all walks of life they came to express the massive esteem in which he was held by all. The world is a very much sadder place because of his death oh, that there were more people the like of Malcolm Collins. From all of us in Cardiff who had the particular privilege of playing and working alongside him we can do no better than say farewell with Mal's favourite parting expression, so long old pal.

To Mal's wife Mair, daughters Deborah and Alison and his father Mr. Richard Collins we offer our most sincere condolences during this time of their great sorrow. Please be assured we will be thinking of you along with all those marvellous memories left behind by a wonderful son, husband,

father and friend.




