Cardiff v. Bath

WEDNESDAY, 1st JANUARY, 1986

KICK OFF 3 p.m.

It may be half way through the season but what a splendid way to see a brand new calendar year in with a visit to The Arms Park by probably the top English Club at present – Bath. Let's hope also that the brand new 1986 will work more favourably on us than did either 1984 or 1985. 1984 New Year's Day you may well remember (especially if you were one of the many who stayed in the club all the afternoon, hic) was called off with the Bath team already at the ground but the pitch froze solid virtually in front of our eyes. Then last year the away game became involved in the web of postponement which proved impossible to rearrange.

Bath who are some eleven years older than ourselves, having been founded in 1865, have only appeared on our fixture list on 33 occasions. Indeed during the late 1800's and early 1900's they played eight games against our Athletic XV. We first played in 1924 and those 33 games played have peppered our fixture list over the ensuing 62 years without any sort of pattern. Hopefully this situation is now in the process of being put to right and the fixture will be a regular feature of our list.

Of the 33 games played we have won 25 to Bath's 7 with the remaining game drawn. We have amassed a total of 451 points to their 239. All seven of their wins have been on their own patch and in fact we have lost on our last four visits to The Recreation Ground. Those defeats came in 1975-76 which incidentally halted a sequence of 15 straight wins we had achieved, 1980-81, 1982-83 and finally earlier on this season when the Westcountry men won by 16 points to 13. This is a good indication of the way that Bath have grown in strength over the 1970's and 80's. It has consistently been the bone-yard for visiting Welsh clubs and few come away with a victory beneath their belts. Indeed on our last visit in October the interest the game created was absolutely overwhelming and it led to the gates being closed for the first time ever for a club match at Bath. Their victory that night gives them a tremendous incentive today to chalk up their first ever win on Cardiff soil, and it would also herald the landmark of winning two consecutive games for the first time ever.

Bath began this season where they left off last. They retained the John Player Cup which they had won the previous season in their first ever final. They also won The South and South West Merit Table with a 100% record and in winning 29 of their 37 games played they scored a total of 860 points. Roger Spurrell handed over the reins of captaincy to John Palmer for this season and big wins by 30, 40 and 50 point margins resulted until they were held to a draw at Newport 16 all. A good win at Llanelli soon put them back on the winning trail however before a shock defeat at Aberavon halted their progress. Their victory over us boosted their morale however and rather flatteringly for us, HTV West claimed they were the best team in the county because they had beaten Cardiff.

Their overall strength and power as a club indicated that perhaps they would be the power base for the English selectors to concentrate their team building on. As is always the case in rugby however, never count your chickens before they are hatched because although looking firm favourites at the start, South and South West lost all three games against London, Midlands and The North to finish up bottom of the pile. This must have been a great disappointment to them especially coming on top of losing their ground record to Neath and then losing to London Scottish and Harlequins with sides sadly depleted by the Divisional calls. So on the basis that a wounded lion is most dangerous, Alan Phillips and his boys will have to give of their best today. Both sides had a bit of a breather last Saturday due to cancellations so again let's hope the weather treats us fine today. To Bath then once again welcome to Cardiff Arms Park and we hope you have an enjoyable day.

Matthew Hadley and his Rags side are also enjoying a successful season and of the 24 games played 18 have been won. They have scored 550 points for to 231 against. They are always worth watching when the First XV are away and their faithful band of supporters are always ensured of good entertainment. The Youth are also having their usual good season under the captaincy of flanker Paul Evans. They have reached the semi final of the W.Y.R.U. Cup of which they are the current holders. They play Cwmbran away and a win there could lead to a repeat of last years final as Llanelli are engaged in the other semi.

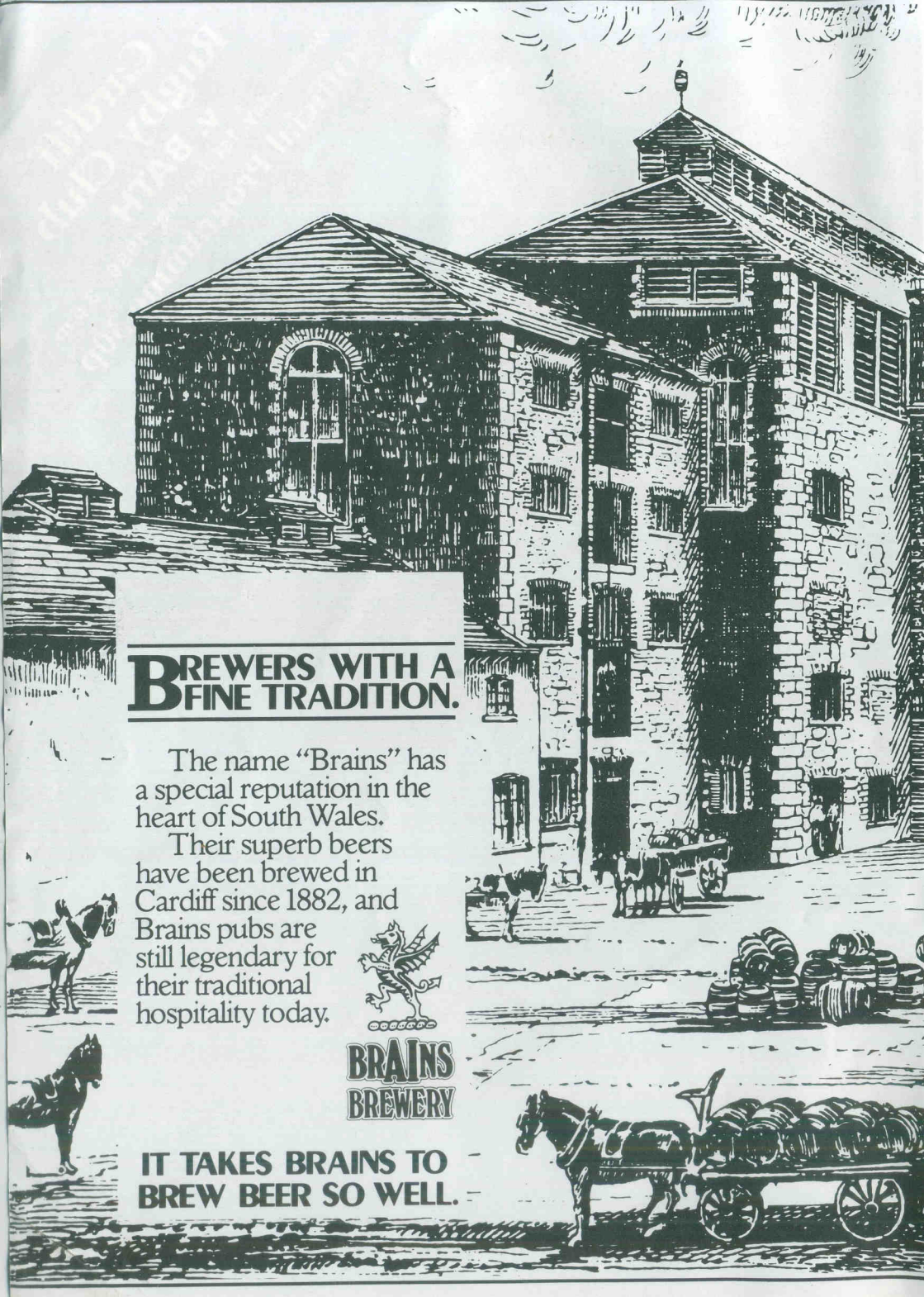

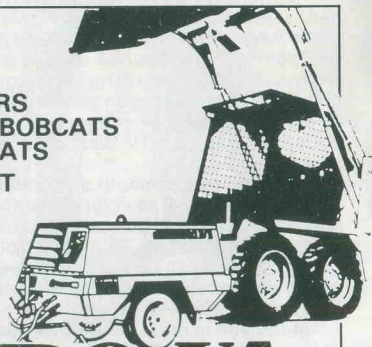
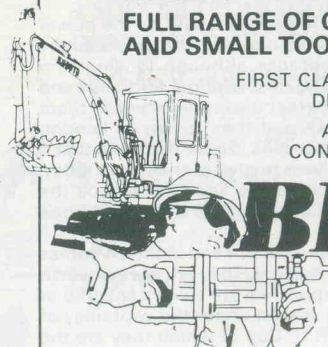

KNOW THE LAWS

BLWYDDYN NEWYDD DDA – A HAPPY NEW YEAR

QUESTION 1. When does the Line-out begin and when does it end?

The line-out **begins** when the ball leaves the hands of the player throwing it in.

The line-out **ends** when one of the following applies:—

- a) a ruck or maul is taking place and all feet of players in the ruck or maul have moved beyond the line-of-touch, or;
- b) a player carrying the ball leaves the line-out, or;
- c) the ball has been passed, knocked back or kicked from the line-out, or;
- d) the ball is thrown beyond a position 15 metres from the touch-line, or;
- e) the ball becomes unplayable.

QUESTION 2. What is a 'Quick throw-in'?

A quick throw-in from touch without waiting for the players to form a line-out is permissible **provided (1) the ball that went into touch is used, (2) it has been handled ONLY BY THE PLAYERS, and (3) it is thrown in correctly.**

At a quick throw-in the 'position of 15 metres from touch' requirement does not apply.

QUESTION 3. What is 'Peeling off'?

'Peeling off' occurs when a player (or players) moves from his position in the line-out for the purpose of catching the ball when it has been passed or knocked back by another of his team in the line-out.

A player must not begin to peel off until the ball has left the hands of the player throwing it in. In a peeling off movement a player must move parallel and close to the line-out. If the line out does not end he must rejoin it. He must keep moving until a ruck or maul is formed and he rejoins it or the line-out ends. Otherwise he should be penalised.

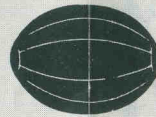

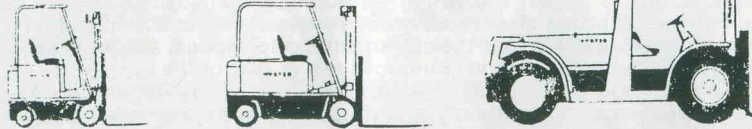

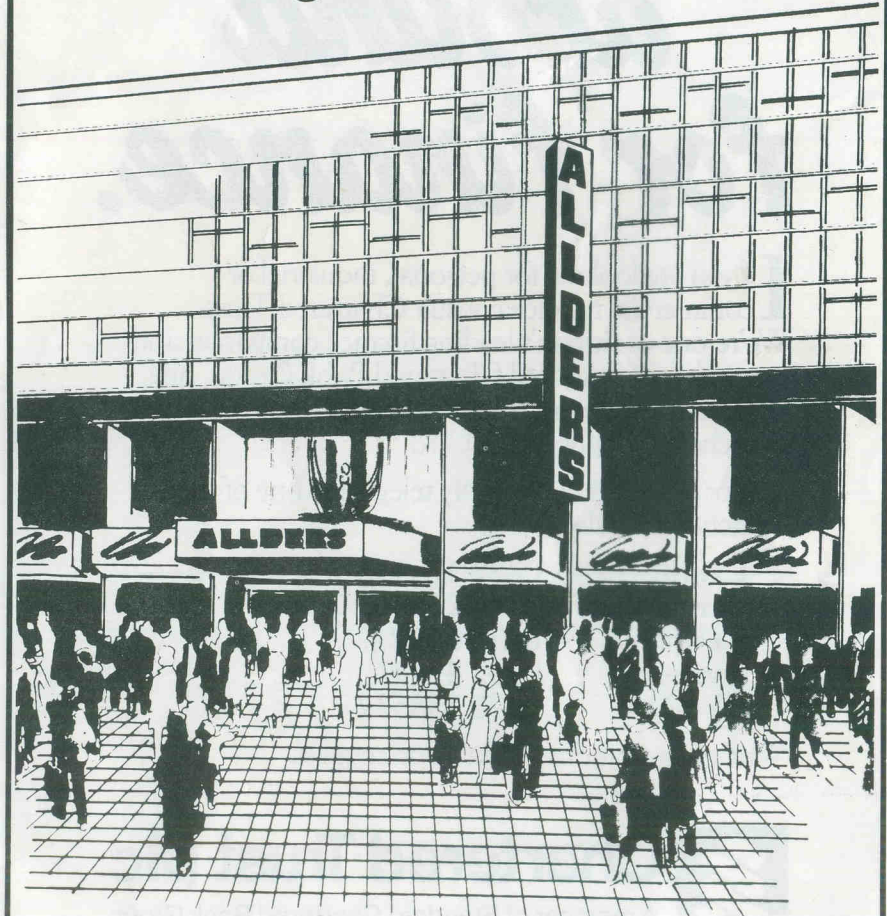
