MOSELEY NEW

We are very pleased to start the New Year at The Reddings by welcoming those always popular visitors, Cardiff, a great club by any standards.

Much has been written of their great feats in the past so on this occasion just a few names to stir the memory. Billy Cleaver and Bladdyn Williams, those great centres of the late forties, the immortal Wilfred Wooller who was capped eighteen times and captain of Wales in 1938-39. While still at Cambridge he played on the wing in the Welsh team that beat the All Blacks 13-12 in 1935. He played cricket for Glamorgan, captain in their 1948 championship year, squash rackets for Wales and soccer for Cardiff City, Lock Eddie Watkins who also played in the 1935 match and of course Gareth Edwards winner of fifty-three Welsh caps and Gerald Davies forty-six.

Last season high standards were maintained under the captaincy of Terry Holmes now of course with Bradford Northern. Cardiff won thirty-two games, drew two and lost only six scoring 1,058 points with 478 against.

They were unbeaten at home including a victory over the touring Australians 16-12 and reached the final of the Schweppes Challenge Cup only to lose to Llanelli by one point 14-15, a dropped goal by Gary Pearce in injury time deciding the issue. On that day Cardiff fielded ten internationals. They came second in the Welsh Cup Championship behind Pontypool drawing with them at home 9-9, losing comprehensively at Pontypool but gaining revenge in the Semi Final of the Cup beating them 24-3 at their own ten man rugby game.

Gareth Davies scoring twenty points. He scored 365 points in all in the season and international winger Adrian Hadley scored twenty tries and Terry Holmes seventeen.

This season to date Cardiff have won twenty-four games and lost four. They have beaten Neath 30-27 and Fiji 31-15 but lost at home to Bridgend, and Bath are the only English team to beat them.

Hadley, Ackerman who has recently moved from London Welsh, and the two props, Whitefoot and Eidman are in the current Welsh international squad.

At the time of writing, the teams have not definitely been selected as Cardiff have the chance to avenge their defeat by Bath and Moselev play at Gloucester on New Year's Day.

The provisional Cardiff side includes nine internationals totalling some 130 caps between them amongst whom is John Scott, thirty-four caps for England, and Bob Ackerman and Gareth Davies twenty-one caps each for Wales. The captain is hooker Alan Phillips (fifteen caps) one of a very formidable

Moseley hope to see the return of Steve Boyle but are likely to lack the services of Carl Arntzen who has not recovered from the hamstring injury suffered against Headingley. It is hoped that Steve Cookson who has not played for the first team this season will be on the bench—with superstar Julian Swain.

An interesting game is in prospect which will also be entertaining and hopefully close—just the fare to get down to the realities of the New Year.

• PREVIOUS MATCHES...

In 1965-66 Cardiff were our guests at the 'turning on' of our floodlights and won 13-0. Fixtures began on a regular basis in the 1973-74 season since then Moseley have won four matches and Cardiff twelve. Last season's game at Cardiff was frozen off. Moseley last beat Cardiff 11-7 in the 1980-81 season.:







• MOSELEY UNDER-11's 14 BARKERS BUTTS 0...


Played on Sunday, 15th December, 1985
