What with a visit from Cardiff this morning and a tilt at the 'old enemy' this afternoon, it's clearly double rations of leek soup, faggots and peas all round! We are wondering, in fact, if there are any intrepid souls who started out at the Smoker last night, have managed to find their way here this morning, are going on to Twickenham this afternoon, then racing home to dress for this evening's Anglo-Welsh Ball. Now, that would really be a Grand Slam. Only trouble is, we've yet to find anyone who has lasted the course!

Cardiff! Now, there's a name to conjure with. For the most part, they have been bewitching us with their own special brand of blue and black magic pretty well since we first met, 100 years and 24 days ago. Yes, this fixture really comes of age today. The last time Cardiff were here, however, we surprised even ourselves with our impressive victory. For those of us who had been waiting rather a long while for a win at the traditional Twickenham curtain-raiser, that was very warming. So was the splendid game at the Arms Park last month. Cardiff won that one 22 - 17, outscoring us by four tries to three, and we doubt anyone went home without feeling he or she had watched rugby football at its very best.

Talking of curtain-raisers and rugby at its best brings to mind the comments of one wag after one of the several epics we staged here at Old Deer Park in the late 60s and early 70s. He was heard to say, and no-one doubted he was right, that it was a shame the international wasn't switched to the morning, with the London Welsh-Cardiff game holding centre-stage at Twickenham! Playing at such an unearthly hour permits that sort of tongue-in-cheek wisdom, and even if the brilliance is now a little fleeting, it still shows the special feeling for this club classic. 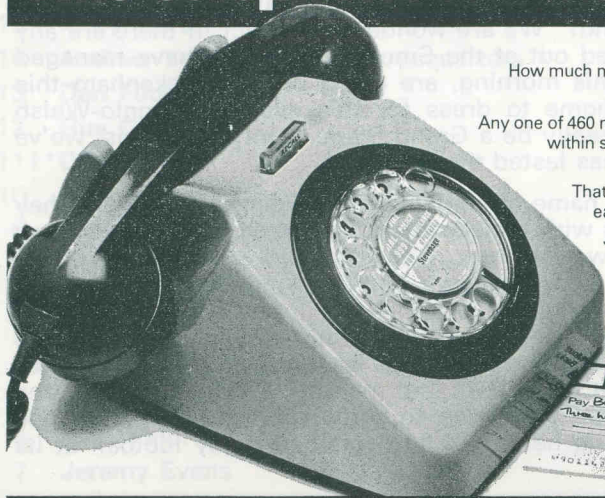

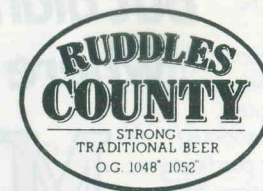
