

BATH v. CARDIFF

Few things in rugby will more readily bring throngs to the turnstiles than the news that Cardiff are in town.

Recall that night of nights three seasons back on The Rec? Well, our Boys captured a

treasured victory and to witness it all was a crowd of nine thousand!

How nice therefore to welcome again this prince of Clubs to Bath, Interesting, too. that it was a son of Somerset - one Frank Hancock - who actually inspired this same Club in their formative days back in the 1880's. Hancock was Wiveliscombe born and bred, one of some six brothers whose mark upon the game was - putting it mildly - remarkable. His 6' 6" brother Frouden would commute weekly by train to London, there to play for Blackheath and subsequently England. Frank it was who headed for Cardiff, there to expand the family brewing business and there to join up with the Cardiff side.

While in Cardiff ranks he inspired the 'four-threequarter' formation in the Club's back division. And Boyo . . . it worked! Goodbye to ten-man packs and five men outside. Now it was hello to eight-man packs and seven men outside. And it was another hello to successive generations of magical Welsh running backs . . . just ask England.

Yet what is there to say of fortunes over in the Principality at this very moment. A season of puzzlement no less; a time of unexpected and disappointing results; perhaps even moments of self-doubt. And in Wales?

Yet consider this: prior to Christmas and Llanelli did much mischief to an albeit weakened Bristol, Newport clinched victory last weekend against 1st division Nottingham, and recently we at Bath had to pull out all the stops to get the result at Newbridge. In other words Welsh fortunes may have just bottomed out and a new era of talent may be waiting to move up onto the starting grid. After fifteen years at the top of the tree the Welsh game may have temporarily suffered from the unavoidable 'tiredness' factor (remember the strain at Bath of four successive cup final wins?) and perhaps a time for re-charging the batteries was needed. It is only a thought.

Of course, we must not (nor could we) forget our own deeds of recent weeks. We have, as you may have noted, found three new budding captains in our ranks, and 'Barnsie' would be the first to revel in the fact. First Paul Simmo' led the Boys to success at London Scottish; then Gareth Chilcott inspired our 'reserves' to that marvellous 21 - 21 result at Newport; and what an excellent job our Jon Hall made of things last Saturday against Northampton. Yes, captains of men appearing from everywhere and Club results attained during the Divisional month which showed so clearly the superb character and spirit among our players and coaching staff.

At a wider level the Australians found a new England, while the Varsity match revealed two teams re-born, doubtless encouragement for those commentators who maintain that our great game is capable of setting standards which few other sports can match. May we take those beliefs with us into the year that is 1989.

And finally we return to our visitors today, and in so doing say to Cardiff-the Club of legend - that we delight once again in your visit to Bath.





The star prize in today's Raffle will be a ball autographed by the players taking part in the Public School Wanderers game on October 12th last.




