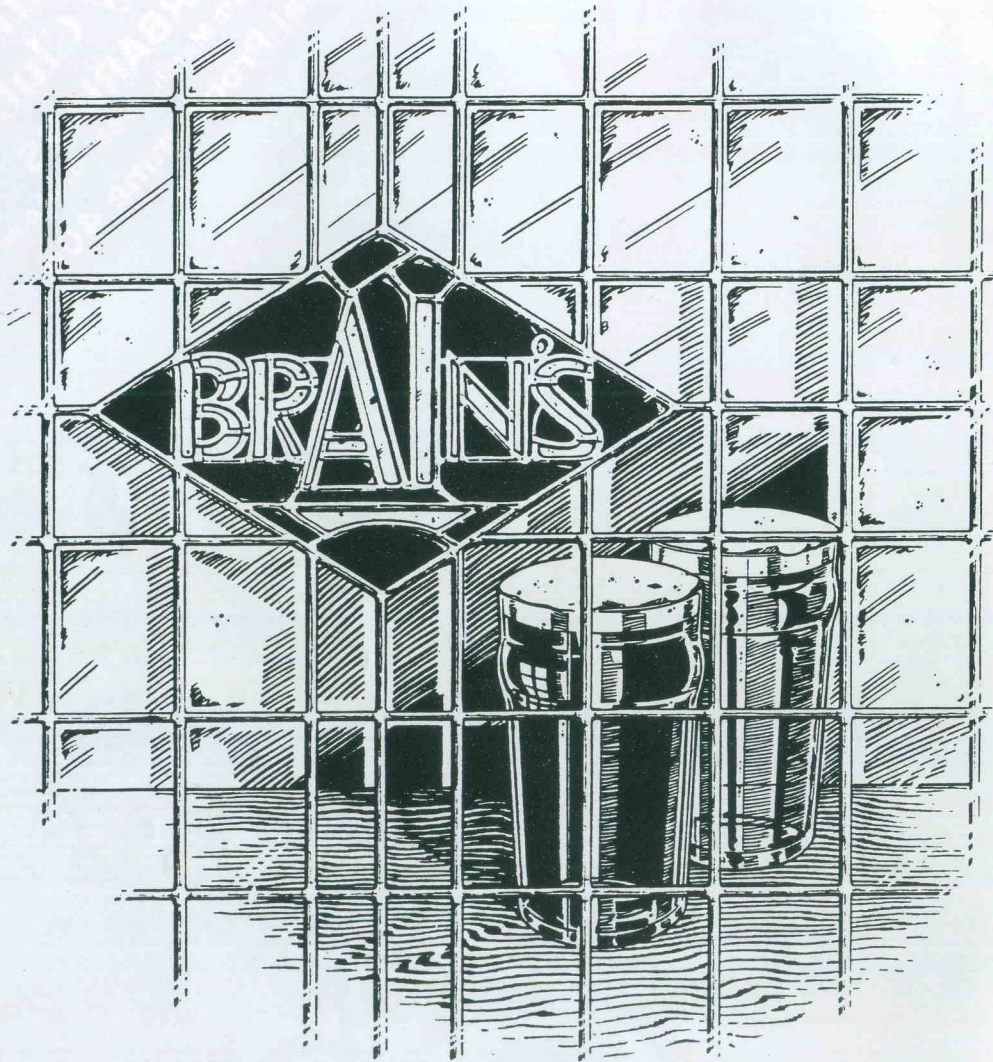

## Cardiff v. Barbarians

SATURDAY, 25th MARCH, 1989

KICK-OFF 3p.m.

Well it may not have been the most classic of games rugby wise but the commitment and determination shown on The Stadium last Saturday could not be faulted. It was fever pitch from beginning to end and certainly not a place for the faint-hearted. Perhaps we can use the word classic for Bob Norster's performance in the art of line-out jumper however. The sheer perfection of his timing in such previously lauded company was the proverbial poetry in motion to witness. It is testimony to his great skill and proves that on his day he must be number one in the world in line-out jumping.

With the Lions selection being done concurrently with the preparation of these notes it is speculation as to whether Bob has done enough to win the captaincy. All will be revealed however by the time these notes see the light of day so lets hope that will be the case because selection itself is mere formality. Furthermore we wish the other candidates from our club all good luck that the pin of selection lands squarely on their names.

All the excitement of last week will hardly have time to abate however before the activities of the current weekend. Many of the English players involved will be sweating it out again today in the boiling cauldron of their national cup semi finals occasion. Unlike our own competition, first out of the hat in their semis gets home advantage. So Gloucester host Bath while Harlequins receive a visit from Leicester. Now there should be two battle royals for you particularly so that former encounter. The excitement continues for us however because Easter has come around again and that means the visit of the one and only Baa Baas. Easter has come just about as early as it possibly can this year so hence the accumulation of internationals and semi-final cup rounds. It will deprive the Baa Baas from selecting more than half the English side whose commitment will be to their clubs in the cup semis. They still have a vast scope for selection however and now that the Easter tour is restricted to two games, ourselves and Swansea, players are now more able to make the shorter stay.

For ourselves, this year's visit is just about coming at the right time. With David Evans now available regularly and Mark Ring and Roger Bidgood restored to full fitness things are beginning to look as good as they have all season. Prior to last Tuesday's game at Bristol we had put together a sequence of eight consecutive wins during which we scored 46 tries with 20 of them coming from wingmen Gerald Cordle and Steve Ford.

The Bristol game was one we could have well done without. It was a commitment however and on a very wet and windy night, the West Country club were most appreciative of our visit.

So we feel well equipped to pit our wits against the Baa Baas this afternoon. We know only too well that they will be most intent on giving the ball plenty of air and that will be our intention too. Let's hope we can keep up the spectacle of previous meetings especially the really high scoring we have seen over the last 20 years. Since 1969 the 20 games played have resulted in aggregate scores in the 20s on four occasions, 30s on two, 40s on three, 50s on five and 60s on no less than six occasions.

In all we have played the Baa Baas on 104 occasions and our 66 wins to 33 defeats with five games drawn mean we have an exact 2 to 1 winning ratio over the famous nomads. In all we have registered 1,606 points to their 1,029. A study of the statistics shows that consecutive victories for them are few and far between. Their best run ever came between 1931 and 1935 when they won five on the trot. Other than that they have only ever managed two straight wins on six occasions. Our purple patch came between 1905 and 1920 when we won the first nine, lost the 10th but then went on to win the next 11 games. In those days however the Baa Baas also played us on Boxing Day. Points wise too we have the edge with a best total of 52 (1984) whereas theirs stands at 40 (1957).

The Baa Baas will be reaching their glittering 100 years next season. Their first ever game took place on 27th December 1890 against Hartlepool Rovers. In this fixture Cardiff were represented by R. B. Sweet Escott and since those far off days 108 other players from the Cardiff Club have gone on to play for the great Barbarian Club. This constitutes a record for any club in the British Isles. The latest selection was David Young when he played against Australia



last November. It is interesting that of these 109 selections 27 of them were non-internationals when first selected for the Baa Baas. The latest of these is our current vice captain Mike Rayer who made his debut in March 1988 against East Midlands. Cliff Morgan holds the record as most selected player from Cardiff with 18 appearances. Perhaps the most unusual record is held by D. Marsden Jones, a Cardiff and Wales prop who played in all four Easter Tour games of the Baa Baas visit during 1923.

So our links with the famous club are exceptional indeed. This word can also be used for some of the games that we have witnessed over the years. For sheer tension though the 1976 encounter must come out top of the pile. Do you remember that one? Ten minutes into the second half a Baa Baas try made the score 24-0. It began to look like a record score for the visitors, but an absolutely virtuoso performance from Gareth Edwards inspired his team mates to achieve what seemed an impossible result. With minutes to go we had incredibly pulled back to only two points behind 26-28. Fittingly it was left to Gareth to execute the coup de grace on the Baa Baas, by dropping a magnificent goal to give us victory by a solitary point 29-28.

To the 1989 Barbarians then we say welcome to Cardiff once again. Your visits are always eagerly anticipated and we hope you all have a very enjoyable weekend.

Let's hope the weather improves however because today and Monday are very reliant on a good firm pitch. And seeing it's Easter a nice bit of sun on our backs would not go amiss.

Don't forget about Monday, our festival day which should cater for all ages with under 14 and under 19 games followed by the younger members of our playing strength against the students of South Glamorgan Institute.

Finally today it remains to offer our sincere thanks to **STELRAD LTD.**, for their very generous sponsorship of this afternoon's game. We trust Mr Clive Norman and all his guests will have a thoroughly enjoyable time.

## KNOW THE LAWS

### Question

A full back catching a kick ahead a few metres from his goal line and in the field of play, is driven back into In-Goal by an opponent and brought to the ground. He releases the ball without grounding it and **his opponent still on the ground places his hand on the ball to score a try.** What is the correct decision?

### Answer

This has caused a lot of discussion amongst referees. Some feel that the player must be on his feet before he can play the ball, whilst others felt he was also a player who was lying on the ground and preventing an opponent from gaining possession of the ball and, therefore, should be penalised.

**However, the W.R.U. Laws Committee has ruled that "A try should be awarded" on the basis that a tackle cannot occur in In-Goal.**

### Question

A defending player, a few metres from his goal line and in the field of play, has his kick charged down by an attacking player. The ball travels into In-Goal where another attacking player already ahead of the 'charger' touches the ball down and claims a 'try'. What is the correct decision?

### Answer

**No try, this latter player is offside and should be penalised.**

The penalty kick should be awarded 5 metres from the goal line opposite him, with an option of a scrummage at the place of the 'charger'.

## QUIDNUNC'S COLUMN

A CERTAIN former English soccer international of consummate ball skills and impish humour – Len Shackleton for those who may be interested in these things – devoted a chapter of his autobiography “The Clown Prince of Soccer” to the subject of “What the average director knows about association football”. The pages were blank.

With sinking feeling in stomach, Quidnunc was reminded of this during these past few days as he set out to explore the background to the chairman of Cardiff Rugby Football Club, Mr. Garry Davies. For the past few seasons, on this festive and so often magnificent occasion of the visit of the Barbarians, Quidnunc has attempted to let you know a little more about the activities of the man currently at our helm. And, wherever inquiries were made, people were tumbling over themselves to tell tales about such as the late Stan Bowes, about Dai Hayward or C. D. Williams, about Mervyn John and so on.

But chairman Garry defied most of the attempts at exposure. Perhaps the reason is summed up in the laconic heading in Danny Davies' history of the Cardiff Club, The Greatest. Above the report on the season 1973-74, it says bluntly, “Customs Officer Captain”. Which may go part of the way to explaining why Quidnunc had almost to resort to using “dead-letter” boxes and other spying techniques to avoid emulating the aforementioned Mr Shackleton and, under an empty page, writing the heading “What Quidnunc knows about the chairman”.

Garry Davies is, in fact, a man of the Rhondda, a native of Treherbert who on leaving school became a customs officer in the Inland Revenue. This did not, however, prevent him from becoming a popular person, any more than has his activity as a specialist in various areas of contraband.

He did, indeed, have a spell at Heathrow Airport – helping out London Welsh and playing for the Civil Service at the time – before returning to South Wales to assist in the apprehension of villains of one kind and another – with a particular expertise, would you believe, in furs?

But it was in other directions that he also became famous. Garry was a hooker of no mean skill: clearly no one who plays the better part of 300 games for the Cardiff senior team, culminating in the captaincy, can get by merely on his knowledge of smuggling or fiddling. Even so, when you see his somewhat lugubrious face behind the omnipresent pipe nowadays, it is not easy to visualise him as a member of the C.M. Club.

“Lucky” Davies, as he was known, and other worthies such as Roger Beard, Lyn Baxter, Gary Samuel and P. L. Jones formed the club – or so I am reliably told – because they used to drink in a certain public house called the Castell Mynach after training. Others were certainly invited to join but, apart from Mr Gerry Wallace, no one else appears to have been able to qualify by passing the initiation test, so much were they required to drink. “Garry was a real Guinness wallah,” says one former colleague with awe. “And it appeared,” he added, “that neither Garry nor Roger Beard ever ate anything either.” And I will not even mention the qualifications of Mr Davies to belong to the Windmill Club.

It might also be unfair to hint at the activities of the C.M. Club – also, I understand known as the Black Hand Club at one stage – on tour to Rhodesia (as it then was) in the early 1970's. Sufficient to say, perhaps, that P. L. Jones was barred from training on one occasion because of high blood pressure, that Gary Samuel was only narrowly prevented from spending one night asleep on the floor of the swimming pool at the Niagara Falls Hotel (which in itself may not have been a problem had the pool not been full at the time) and that Gareth Edwards is perhaps fortunate still to have a younger brother in Gethin.

But seriously, as they say, chairman Garry Davies has given great service to the Cardiff club. He won his cap in 1964-65, went on to become a Barbarian, and has been involved in most areas of the Cardiff club's activities. Some measure, perhaps, of the respect in which he is held in the game, can be gleaned from a short anecdote concerning a match with Aberavon. The visitors had an ailing hooker who, by half-time, decided that he could no longer stay on the pitch. Two substantial members of the Aberavon pack – allegedly Messrs Richardson and Mainwaring – told their colleague that he could leave the field only if “we can sort out that Garry Davies first”. Garry later had to go off. Now, as an official and if you can find him, he carries that same aura of solidity and responsibility.
