

#### Five Times in Eight Years

Cardiff can be guaranteed to rise to the big occasion, especially when it involves the Schweppes Cup. One sniff of Cup action galvanises them like a gun dog. Despite their dismal playing record this season, they have battled into the semi-final stage yet again.

Not that this achievement means a great deal when their opponents are analysed. That is not to belittle the endeavours of the small teams who have opposed them, but Cardiff have avoided crossing swords with

any of the big guns.

Neath fans, of course, reckon the Arms Park team's luck has run out today, and the objective view by the uncommitted in all probability will endorse that opinion. Form is always an indicator, though it has been known to trap a few along the way, as England, fresh from trouncing the French at Twickenham, found when they came to Cardiff.

Undeniably, the form team today are Neath. The fearsome Black Raiders of Welsh rugby are racing towards the double target of Welsh club champions and Cup winners. It is a burning ambition at the Gnoll and Cardiff

will recognise that they have something special to do in the turmoil of today's contest.

Of course, they did it two years ago, as their supporters are quick to point out. Neath were firm favourites on the same St. Helen's pitch. But Cardiff took it 16-6 — and with Jonathan Davies as Neath's fly half in that season.

So form can be a misleading guide in one-off cup situations — as Neath once found when they slumped at home to Glamorgan Wanderers, and Swansea this season discovered to their cost at Glamorgan Wanderers' ground. Underdogs have a nasty habit of slipping the leash and inflicting a nasty nip to the pride of the giants.

No-one has nipped the Gnoll team on their home patch this season, but they have proved vulnerable on a few ccasions away from their home comforts and this gives Cardiff reason for hope. Robert Norster's team probably have undergone hypnosis to erase from their memories the result of their meeting with Neath last September, when the Gnoll crowd saw their side triumph by a record 49-10 margin against the Blue-and-Blacks.

We can imaging an old campaigner like Alan Phillips, Cardiff through and through, explaining that to the younger members of the team. "That was a cosmetic operation, boys — we let them think they're that good just in case we meet them in the Cup later on!" Anyway, that will be his story . . .

Phillips was the captain when Cardiff shocked Neath out of the Cup two years ago. "Everything went just as we planned," he recalled. "We knew we could do it." This is the confidence necesary for any team to succeed at the top and Cardiff have been doing just that in the Cup for quite a while now.

They have won the Cup five times in the last eight years and only Llanelli have a better record of victories. Neath have had their ups and downs after winning it in its inaugural season of 1971-72, and it slipped away from them in that sensational semi-final in 1987 and then in last year's even more sensational Cup Final.

So the Blacks will be looking for a significant change of fortune while Cardiff give their complete attention to the job of scrummaging their opponents into all sorts of uncomfortable attitudes. Cardiff also have to give attention to the little matter of slowing down those tearaway Neath forwards who all seem to live life on the field at 100mph — and probably do the same off the field.

Cardiff have been delighted to recruit Andrew Booth from the Gnoll team as a young scrum half of outstanding potential to take over from veteran Ray Giles in the natural course of progression. The return of Mark Ring also has been cause for rejoicing in the Cardiff camp, and the prolonged absence of this unpredictable genius has handicapped coach Gwilym Treharne's attacking plans.

The best formula for Cardiff has been to rifle the ball wide and fast to release their wings, with Gerald Cordle and Steve Ford topping 50 tries between them. It might be observed by Gnoll fans that their wings

have done even better than that! Who said comparisons are odious?

But getting to the final is what today's event is all about and tactics generally are directed at reducing

all risks to a minimum, at least until one team can establish an unassailable lead. Even if the ball is not too often wafted in the direction of the running backs, there is seldom any lack of intensive action and incident.

Cardiff's pew vice-captain. Michael Bayer, has established a reputation for consistency in all aspects of

Cardiff's new vice-captain, Michael Rayer, has established a reputation for consistency in all aspects of play, while David Evans, called up by Wales for the first time this season, is an extremely perceptive footballer.

Norster's lineout skill obviously plays a vital part in Cardiff's game plan, and their srummage is expected to demand respect. They used their forward power to overcome the Cup challenges of Pyle 25-9, Amman United 54-0, Aberavon Quins 24-15 and then those renowned village cup-fighters Llanharan 25-13 in their earlier rounds.

Now it is the Big One. Neath again — and Cardiff fans are keeping their fingers crossed that the old 'hypnosis treatment' won't wear off too soon!

#### Pressure, Speed & Commitment

Pressure, Speed and Commitment are the key words in Neath's triumphant march through this season. And those words have taken them to a world club try scoring record and the position as one of the top sides in Britain.

The players are given plenty of freedom in every game, freedom to roam the field and pick up on every mistake made by the opposition. And errors are frequent in opposing teams who find themselves unable to cope with all the engulfing approach of the Welsh All Blacks.

In the last quarter of most games fitness takes over as teams wilt under the Neath pressure and there is often a flood of tries in this period. When one considers that Neath averages almost seven tries a game you can see the importance of those three words.

A visit to the Gnoll can be a sobering experience for any side as two recent visitors, Newbridge and Maesteg, discovered to their cost. Newbridge in particular came as one of only three Welsh club sides to beat the Gnoll team this season, albeit by just one point.

The game ended with a 70 point margin and a scoreline that read 13 tries to nil. Just four days later Maesteg walked into a 13 try onslaught as they were ruthlessly dismissed 64 to nil.

And the clear message from manager Ron Waldron is simple, "we have not seen the best of these players vet."

Waldron was the man given the task of stepping into the outsize shoes of Brian Thomas who had dragged the team from the doldrums of the start of the eighties and turned it into one of the most efficient rugby machines in British Rugby.

In the six seasons since Thomas took the helm the drive to develop the best club in Britain has never paused. The management team has put together one of the most talented young squads in Wales with an average age of just 22.

Many of the players are still teenagers but they have shown skills which have given a lie to the claims that Wales is a desert for talent at the moment.

Early in his reign Brian Thomas said Neath would never face the situation of having to rebuild a side after mass retirements. He made it clear that no squad member was guaranteed a place the following season and the club has lived up to this philosophy with only a handful of the current squad on the books five years ago.

Men like Barry Clegg who had a new lease of life at the Gnoll and Mike Richards, the backbone of the pack for years, have gone but in their place are players of tremendous potential including 19 year old lock Gareth Llewellyn already knocking on the Welsh door, Hooker Lloyd Isaac, in the Under 21 squad, and prop John Davies, a Cardiganshire farmer who is one of the fastest men in the Squad.

And there is Chris Bridges a dynamic scrum half who has developed into a fine talent and must be another future Welsh player.

It is the young pack which has laid the foundation of the teams success this season and any side which can boast a front row which is as fast as the back row will take some handling.

At the heart of it all has been skipper Kevin Phillips. He has been playing inspired rugby this season and has proved to be an outstanding captain. He has generated such a head of steam among his team at times that their authority has been staggering.

He has also brought a new confidence to the side, demonstrated many times recently when penalty kicks have been ignored in favour of a forward drive. Phillips also knows his way to the try line with seven under his belt so far. In fact forty per cent of Neath's tries have come from the forwards and what other Welsh club can boast of having every member of the squad with tries to his name.

The cup is an important competition to Neath. They were the first winners way back in 1972 and their supporters, players and management believe it is time the trophy was back at the Gnoll. In recent seasons the club has come close and they know that todays opponents have twice been their stumbling block in recent seasons.

It was Cardiff who beat them in the 1984 final and Cardiff again who put them out in the semi-final in 1987 by 16 points to 6. The Capital city club has a tremendous reputation in the cup and Neath know they will have a tough fight and recent massive victories over Cardiff have no bearing on the game.

Last season Neath reached the final only to be convincingly beaten by Llanelli 28 points to 13. A replay of that final is the aim of the Welsh All Blacks but they will take nothing for granted today.
