

Cardiff v. Pontypridd

TUESDAY, 26th DECEMBER, 1989 KICK-OFF 3.00 p.m.

It's hard to believe but by the time these notes see the light of day another Christmas will be here and gone. Who ever coined the phrase 'Tempus Fugit' certainly knew his stuff. Having gone however it brings us to Boxing Day and the annual visit of our great friends from Sardis Road. So without further ado we extend to all Pontypridd players, administrators and supporters a very warm and festive welcome.

This day's particular fixture has now by tradition become one of the highlights of our season. The festive spirit is certainly very evident amongst those of us on this side of the touch line who are invariably full of the usual Christmas cheer. And there are plenty of us too because the fixture has now become so popular that after the Barbarian game the occasion draws one of the season's best crowd.

We have also been treated to some right royal rugby too. It never ceases to amaze me how the players come up year after year to perform to such a high state of fitness and skill. Obviously they must take it a little bit easy on the celebrating so we should be duly thankful to them.

This Boxing Day fixture becomes number 17 since the series began on a regular basis in 1972. It has been continuous since then apart from our centenary year when we played a Crawshay's XV. Of the 16 games already played in the era we have won on 12 occasions to Ponty's 3 with one drawn. Ponty's wins came in 1977, 1986 and 1988. In 1977 they won by 13-9, in 1986 by 28-21 but last year they really took us apart to the tune of 41-6. The Sardis Road men took great pleasure from this win because only 2 days earlier we had achieved a very good home victory against our bogey team, Bridgend, by 14-4. We had no answer to Ponty's hundred miles an hour display two days later and their victory was a record score for them since we played our first game back in 1878.

The situation is going to be very similar again this season because we will have played at Bridgend by the time you get to read these notes. It would have been a tough enough game at home but with the goings on of this last week perhaps Bridgend would not have been in a very festive spirit towards us. One thing is for sure and that is the fact that by tonight our players will certainly know that they have been involved in two extremely hard games. For Ponty's part their run up to today's game appears not so exacting as they were not scheduled to play last Saturday so once again they will be coming to us fresh as daisies. We had better be on our guard this year if we have learned the lessons of last year.

At this point in time Ponty are really getting their act together. Injuries and coaching problems were present earlier on in the season but now all these points have been resolved they are really firing on all four cylinders. With star players and captain Ceri Jones back on the scene along with Jonathan Mason they have now put together a very impressive run since their last

defeat by Bridgend at the beginning of November. Their current record reads: Played 23, Won 16, Lost 7, Points For 623, Against 331. In their 'Points For' total their 110 tries put them in 3rd place behind Neath and Pontypool in this particular statistic.

Earlier on this season we suffered defeat at Sardis Road by 27-15 and of the last 6 games played between us we have managed to win only one of them. Of the other 5, 3 have gone Ponty's way and 2 drawn. This no doubt has given Ponty great satisfaction because prior to those 6 games we had won 8 on the trot, 4 at home and 4 away.

Our overall record against Ponty shows we have played 63 games. We have won 43 of them to their 16 with the remaining 4 finishing even. Points-

wise we have collected 952 to Ponty's 506.

Ponty's cup game last Saturday week turned out to be a lot tougher than they expected. The game Llandeilo team put up a very brave showing and had they managed a score in the last few minutes when they were camped on the Ponty line the final 8 point margin would have been very much diminished. Still a one point victory in the cup is enough and the draw has now given them another challenging away encounter against an ever improving Newport side.

Our own cup game against Bridgend Athletic saw us run out comfortable enough winners but the draw has certainly given us an extremely tough encounter against Llanelli. Fortunately we were the first out of the hat so it means that we get home advantage. Mind this seems par for the course because we have met them on 5 previous occasions and none of them have been played at Stradey Park. Two finals have been played on the National Stadium, one semi-final at Swansea and the other two were at the Arms Park. The record stands at 3 wins for us and 2 to the Scarlets. It's certainly going to generate massive interest and no doubt it will be a case of a full house on the day. All this of course assumes that the Scarlets win their re-arranged game at Senghenydd which was washed out on the original date. With the greatest respect to Senghenydd it would be the upset of the century if the result was anything but a Llanelli victory.

On the home front we have great cause for satisfaction by the high skill standards of players wishing to make themselves part and parcel of the Arms Park setup. Stuart Nunnerley's transfer from Abertillery is now completed so we officially welcome him to the club. We hope he enjoys the success that his fellow Abertillerian Bob Norster has achieved whilst wearing the Blue and Black. Hopefully another 2 transfers will be achieved speedily and without any animosity which will give our playing strength a massive boost. It's also congratulations to our players who made the Welsh

Squad and commiserations to Mark Ring on his omission.

The Rags are still missing injured captain Robert Lakin but they nevertheless notched up a very good away win last week against Pontypool United. These days they are a very young side and there are some very promising players amongst them. It will be good to see the captain back again though with all the skill and guidance he has to offer.

Finally as this is our last home appearance before the new decade on behalf of all the players and committee we wish you all the very best for a very happy new year.
