No hitch of any discription occurred in connection with both outward and return journey's, on which, approximately 1800 miles were travelled to play the match.

All meals were good, and adequate, Hotels were First Class, Sleeping arrangements, including Sleeping berths were excellent, whilst travelling was made in comfort.


