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



Mr. Chivers - Chairman of Penarth - stated that Penarth were anxious to retain the status quo and were desirous for a frank and open discussion to try and prevent the threatened discontinuance of fixtures.

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Dr. Lindsay reiterated what Mr. Chivers had said and emphasised the desire to put all the cards on the table as far as Penarth were concerned.

Mr. Thorne. simply added that Penarth were desirous of maintaining a friendship which had been of such long standing.

At this point, Mr. Douglas asked for and defined himself what he considered PRIENDSHIP meant, viz: the working together of parties for their mutual good. He pointed out that for at least six years there had been growing up a spirit of animosity between the two Clubs which had reached its climax over the question of the transfers of keardon & Welsh last Season. Ar. Thorne interposed here and explained that he had no power to grant the transfers in question but showed that Penarth by granting Reardon's transfer acted in accordance with custom and by refusing that of Welsh, was merely acceding to a letter received from Welsh in which he stated that he wished to play for Penarth.

stated that what the Cardiff Club considered a most unsporting action on Penarth's part was the refusal of Penarth in not loaning meardon & Welsh to Cardiff on the occasion of the London-Welsh game in London last season when Penarth had no match.

Dr. Lindsay replied stating that Penarth refused because the transfers were still being debated and it was feared that if the two players in question were loaned, went to London and had a desire to leave Penarth.

Mr. Thorne was anxious that we come to some arrangement with regard to the transfer of players between the two Clubs.

Mr. Cornish. replied that Cardiff's players, being amateurs, were more or less free to select their own Clubs. Cardiff objected to the worried any players of Cardiff who had been rested or dropped and offered them places in the Penarth team.

Mr. Thorne immediately the select their places in the Penarth team.

immediately took this up and stated that the chief culprit was Mr. E. Pawley. From what they said it would appear

that E. Pawley ran the Penarth team on his own and in this the Penarth deputation more or less agreed. Mr. Douglas pointed out that such a state of affairs would not be tolerated by Cardiff.

pointed out that when he received a letter from any Newport player asking for a game in the Penarth XV. his custom was to ring up the Newport Club to ascertain the reason for his not playing. If the reply was that the player had been dropped, then Penarth simply did not consider him.

interposed here and asked whether in similar circumstances Mr. Thorne rang up the Cardiff Club and pointed out that if a Mr. Thorne rang up the Cardiff Club and pointed out that if a friendly spirit existed it would be natural to ring up Cardiff but it was obvious that Penarth showed friendship to Newport. Mr. Thorne was self-condemned when he said that he would ring up Newport and he had no reply for Mr. Cornish other than an up Newport and he had no reply for Mr. Cornish other than an attempt to evade the question. At this state, Mr. Cornish emphasised the fact that the friendship which Penarth had once had towards Cardiff had now been passed on to Newport.

now mentioned that another circumstance which had led to an inimical feeling was the back-biting which went on in the East Division. Experience gained by the Cardiff Committee had shown that the Penarth Committee on the journeying round the District, had done everything possible to jeopardise the chances of a Cardiff Delegate.

The Penarth Delegates had no reply to this.

Pursuing the question of the 'friendly spirit' shown by Penarth

asked Mr. Thorne "How many votes had Penarth given a Cardiff candidate at any Election in recent years for the seat on the Welsh Rugby Union?" No answer was forthcoming from Penarth and Mr. Cornish answered "No votes had been given to Cardiff, but Newport's candidate received the full support of Penarth. The only way to keep friendship was for Penarth to support Cardiff in every way."

evaded a direct answer but sought refuge by stating that he and Mr. Packer had always supported the Cardiff Club in matters relating to the Cardiff Club when they arose at any meetings of the Welsh Rugby Union.

summed up the discussion by stating that if any good were to come of this meeting, to dement friendship and goodwill, then it must not be a one-sided business, Cardiff must not be expected to give all and receive nothing. Penarth must expect
