Iextend a very warm 'Stradey welcome' not only to Mervyn John, the Cardiff Chairman, his players, committee and supporters but also to one of Wales's sporting heroes - Mr. Wilfred Wooller - who has been invited today as a guest of the club at what I hope will be a match of distinction to honour his visit. Last September there was a special luncheon in the Marriott Hotel, Cardiff to celebrate 'Wilfred Wooller's 60 years in sport' at which the main speakers were Tony Lewis and Cliff Morgan while among the distinguished guests were Vivian Jenkins and Ronnie Boon who along with Wilf, helped to break the 'Twickenham Bogey' in 1933.

Talking of heroes, let us note here the names of **Ieuan Evans, (captain), Nigel Davies, Rupert Moon, Emyr Lewis, Scott Quinnell, Mark Perego, Phil Davies and Ricky Evans**, the eight Scarlets who all distinguished themselves in the notable victory over Scotland, achieved with considerable style in atrocious conditions. Eight players in the side equalled the club record achieved last season against France, but, this time, we also, originally, had three players on the replacements bench in Anthony Copey, Hugh Williams-Jones and Andrew Lamerton who had to withdraw because of ill health. We are anxiously awaiting his medical report and wish him a very speedy recovery.

To date the season has not gone as well as we had expected. Only twice have we played anywhere near our capabilities; the first occasion was the notable win at

Cardiff in October with a timely revival against 'the Jacks' in December being the second. In discussing the problem and our lack of style with the Coaches and the Team Manager it seemed that a great part of the problem hinged on the fact that Wales wanted to play a different type of game to the Scarlets - very much a 'hands on', rolling maul, staccato game compared with the quick-ball, quick-tempo, keep the ball alive and support game which we pioneered under the new rules so successfully last season. Certainly our management team had got to grips with that problem before the Swansea game and providing we continue to play in that vein there is no reason why we cannot equal the feat of that great side of the seventies and win a fourth cup in a row.

I said at the beginning of the season that the 'management of change' would be difficult, but do not forget either, the many fine young players who have been 'blooded' in the first team nor the contribution from our Under 21's who continue to play highly entertaining winning rugby. The average age of our squad is 25.

The season is still far from over. Much can yet happen in the league and we have a home draw, at last, against Llandovery in the next round of the Cup.

The fact is that once you get yourself a label it is difficult to get rid of it. True, I have watched Cardiff teams play more than most, but my job in television changed all that.

Last season, when Llanelli were winning everything in sight and were appearing virtually every weekend on our BBC Wales rugby programmes, I was accused of being a Llanelli supporter. I was even advised in no uncertain terms that our 'Wales on Saturday'

programme should be renamed 'Llanelli on Saturday!' The gentleman who offered me the advice is still an Abertillery supporter, who simply wouldn't accept the explanation from me that the rugby-viewing public would rather watch the magic of the Scarlets than the heroic efforts of the Gwent club.

One thing is for certain; you can't please everyone all of the time. So now I don't really support anyone. Watching Llanelli last season was just the same as watching Manchester United with the other shaped ball. It was like watching Glamorgan Cricket winning the Sunday League. How encouraging it was to

witness the valiant efforts of the Welsh team against Scotland in the Cardiff Arms Park monsoon. The Welsh players tried to play rugby and we were all grateful for that. It didn't matter that a Cardiff man scored two tries, or that a Pontypridd man played his best match for Wales. We all loved the way it was done.

My fondest memories go back to my season with the 'Rags'. We didn't lose a match all season and I can remember Wayne Lewis running in spectacular tries. I also recall a Snelling Sevens appearance for Glamorgan Wanderers when unfortunately we met Llanelli and

lost by an avalanche. 'JJ' was on the park, but I cannot remember seeing him, and there was a ghost called Phil Bennett who we felt but never touched.

Loughborough Colleges days followed. Bridgend Sevens. We won those a

couple of times when the Welsh clubs boasted great players who enjoyed their rugby as much as the crowd enjoyed watching them.

So, when I consider the prospects of a Llanelli-Cardiff clash I tend to become a rugby romantic, far removed from the realism of the modern game. I want to see things happen that in all probability won't. It will not matter to me who wins the contest. My days of being a real 'Blue and Black' have gone. Not that I won't be wishing them to win. After all my Dad is President!

Welcome TO THE PARK

CAERDYDD

The club's story goes back to 1873 when the Glamorgan Football Club was started. They used Cardiff Arms Park and played Cheltenham College rules, 20 players a side using a round ball. A year later, they had 66 members and rival clubs in Tredegarville and the Wanderers.

On 22 September, 1876, in the Swiss Hall, Queen Street, several people met to set up a Cardiff club to rival Newport and Swansea. The Glamorgan and Wanderers clubs merged into the Cardiff Football Club and Donaldson Selby was appointed captain.

They played on the Arms Park and their playing colours were black with a white skull and crossbones. These colours, not surprisingly, lasted only one season and were replaced by Cambridge blue and black.

Four Cardiff players appeared for Wales in their first international. Cardiff regularly attracted good crowds and then came Frank Hancock. Hancock changed the course of the game. A Somerset man, like many of his West Country contemporaries, he took advantage of the industrialisation of South Wales to further his job prospects and he joined Cardiff.

In those days, there was no strict player formation and against England in 1881 and 1882, Wales pitted one forward less than England, with the backs deployed as two full-backs, three three-quarters and two half-backs. Hancock saw the choice was putting one of the full-backs in the scrum or the three-quarters. Hancock had come into the Cardiff side as a reserve threequarter, played well and rather than drop him, the selectors played one of the full-backs alongside him.

Under Hancock in 1885-86, Cardiff almost enjoyed an invincible season; they had won 26 games out of 26 when Moseley arrived at the Arms Park for the final game; the English side won!

In 1892, Cardiff began their first golden era. Tom Pearson was captain and Cardiff's conveyor belt of talent rolled: Norman Biggs, Gwyn Nicholls, Selwyn Biggs, H. B. Winfield, Percy Bush, Jack Brown, Rhys Gabe and several more.

In 1898, they picked up their first unofficial championship, and the golden era lasted until 1909.

The inter-war years probably saw Cardiff at their quietest, at least until the 1970s. They continued to produce outstanding players, Clem Lewis, Tom Wallace, Arthur Cornish, Danny Davies, Ronnie Boon, Harry Bowcott, Codger Johnson, Les Spence, Cliff Jones and Wilf Wooller to name a few but it was not until 1936 that they asserted themselves as a team. At the end of the 1920s, they had decided to run two first fifteens and this led to a period of inconsistency.

They won three consecutive championships before the war and resumed after it in style taking it again in 1948 and 1949. In 1948, they created a world record by providing 10 players for the Welsh team against Scotland. Cardiff could field 11, Maldwyn James, Jack Matthews, Bleddyn Williams, Haydn Tanner, Billy Cleaver, Les Williams, Cliff Davies, Les Manfield and Gwyn Evans, not forgetting Billy Tamplin and Frank Trott.

Cardiff beat the All Blacks in 1953, 48,500 piled into the Arms Park on 17 February, 1951 to see Cardiff lose to Newport, Cliff Morgan and Rex Willis started to delight crowds, Stan Bowes captained the Rags and Sid Judd captained the first team.

This second golden era lasted until 1958 and the club did not see success like it until the 1980s. There were individual stars as usual, six Cardiff players toured South Africa with the British Lions in 1968, and great players like Barry John, Gareth Edwards, D. K. Jones, Maurice Richards, Gerald Davies and Keri Jones stalked the field.

But individual success detracted from the team performance and in the 1970s, lack of reserve strength pushed Cardiff back in the rankings. Then came John Scott; he helped rediscover Cardiff's desire for silverware, aided by players such as Gareth Davies, Terry Holmes, Alan Phillips, Bob Norster and Mark Ring. Now they are coached by Australian Alan Evans as they endeavour to win the Heineken League.

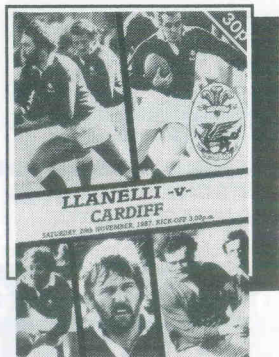
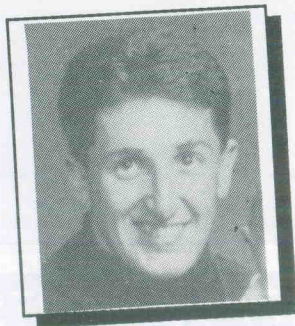
**BARRY

Today, I deviate from the normal try scoring achievements of a former "hero" to recall an unique feat by a former Scarlet and Cardiff rugby legend. I refer to BARRY JOHN, born Cefneithin 6/1/45. Played for Gwendraeth Grammar, Trinity College, Carmarthen, Pontyberem, Llanelli, Cardiff, Barbarians and British Lions.

On Saturday, 28th November, 1970 at Cardiff Arms Park, Barry successfully dropped FOUR goals to win the club fixture against the Scarlets by 12 points to 9. Barry had Gareth Edwards at inside half and the team was skippered by John Hickey. The Scarlets 9 points came from a Phil Bennett penalty goal from full back, a Geoff Roberts penalty goal and a Hefin Jenkins try. The Scarlets were captained that day by another member of the John family - Clive.

Remarkably 17 years later to the day, on Saturday, 28th November, 1987, Scarlets gained sweet revenge when another world class outside half was "doing the business". Jonathan Davies dropped three goals and scored a try as the Scarlets completely outplayed Cardiff at Stradey by 41 points to 6. The Scarlets that day were captained by Phil Davies. Incidentally the referee that day was the present Scarlets secretary, Mr. Ken Parfitt!

Dublin, how to get there

The hospitality hits you like a hurricane and just when you think it is safe to go to bed at 4.30 in the morning someone else suggests there's a place open that serves breakfast and Guinness and on the way, you're bound to find another drinking hole.

Like Edinburgh, Dublin is a manageable size with myriad places to visit and enjoy. A rugby international weekend is a time when you test your liver to its extreme and on your return home, you will try and recall how 48 hours has passed so quickly.

There are two ways to reach Dublin - the quick way and the other way. The quick way is by plane and you can do this from every main airport. Cardiff Air Travel (owned by Cardiff-Wales Airport Ltd) have laid on some charter flights for the Irish match. The slow way is by train, car, coach and ferry.

For those flush and flying, you'll need a bus or a cab, alas no train or tube, from Dublin airport because it's seven miles north of the city and though you will not need a passport you will need to change money for the Irish pound (punt) is no longer tied to the pound sterling.

Ferries arrive from Holyhead to Dun Laoghaire and Dublin. For the creative amongst you, you can also go from Swansea to Cork. It's about a five hour drive (160 miles) from Cork to Dublin. Ferries are booked solid for the rugby weekends in Dublin, so if you haven't bought your ticket you're too late!

How to get to the Ground

Lansdowne Road is south-east of the centre. It is possible to walk but if you are in a hurry, you can catch the DART (Dublin Area Rapid Transport) train from Connolly Station, Tara Street or Pearse Station.

For those of you travelling to the emerald isle, Good Luck. Enjoy yourself and bring back a Welsh win. Remember Wales were successful there last time, winning by 16 points to 15, which included a Colin Stephens drop goal. Four other Scarlets were in the team that day, namely Ieuan (captain), Laurance, Tony and Emyr.

Joe informs me that the most programmes sold for one club match at Stradey was the fixture with Graham Mourie's New Zealand All Blacks on a Tuesday afternoon on 21st October, 1980 when 12,000 were sold during the day, followed by a further 1,000 as a result of a re-print due to public demand.

During this period Joe has had the good fortune or otherwise of having only three programme editors, namely Mr. Glyn Walters, who is the present public address announcer, Mr. Gareth Hughes present chief rugby correspondent of the independent radio station Swansea Sound and yours truly.

Did you know that Joe had a secret ambition to follow in the footsteps of Jerry Guscott and become a male model? Well just look at this photograph taken in 1975!

Over the years Joe has made many friends through rugby and has sent programmes to almost all corners of the world. One programme enthusiast Paul Sykes became very friendly and so grateful to Joe for his mail order service, that he invited Joe and his wife to his wedding a few years ago. Also the management committee of Aviron Bayonne club in the South West of France where Joe has visited on four occasions.

It was a big thrill for Joe and myself to be asked to be involved with the 1991 Rugby World Cup and in particular the Argentina v Australia pool match played at Stradey on October 4th, 1991.

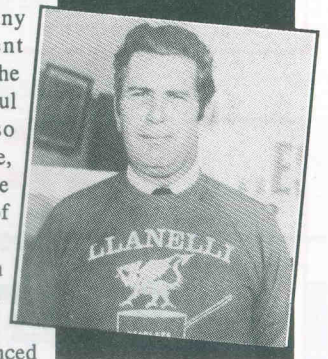
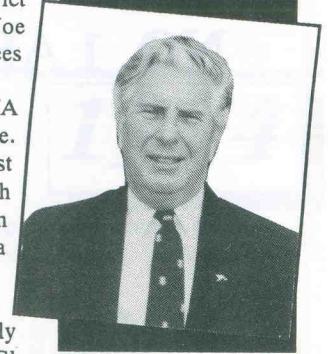
Although rugby is now big business and budgets having to be balanced carefully I am sure that programme sales are

in the safest of hands, as Joe maintains records of sales of each and every match and is able to tell at a glance the number of programmes required for each match. I understand that his rule of thumb is one programme for every four spectators for a club match and one programme for every two spectators for a major touring match.

It is often said that behind every good man is a good woman. Well that is certainly the case here as for all matches Joe is ably supported by his wife Dorothy and she can be seen busily selling programmes and organising the loyal band of programme sellers from the portacabin in the car park.

In November 1823, an English public schoolboy cheated at football. William Webb Ellis, with a fine disregard for the rules of football as played in his time, first took the ball in his arms and ran with it, thus originating the distinctive feature of the rugby game...

If there is a Sporting Valhalla up there, and the past heroes and illustrious legends of our game were watching Wales and Scotland the other Saturday, then William Webb Ellis would have smiled knowingly at around 2.28 that afternoon. Indeed, if William Webb Ellis runs a Heaven's Gate Rugby Football Club, then Mark Angelo Perego's place in the firsts is assured.

You see, Pegs has a fine disregard for the rules of "the game" as played in his time. Note that I have deliberately accentuated "the game".

Mark Perego has an uncompromising attitude on the field. Last season he rightly reminded us that anything the Western Samoans can do, he can do even better. Yet, in all the time I have watched Mark play, I have never once seen him step outside the spirit of the game and its laws.

As a bonus, the day before the game I read that Mark, with the exception of Turnbull, couldn't possibly name the Scotland team. Wonderful stuff. Even if it wasn't true, I wanted to believe it.

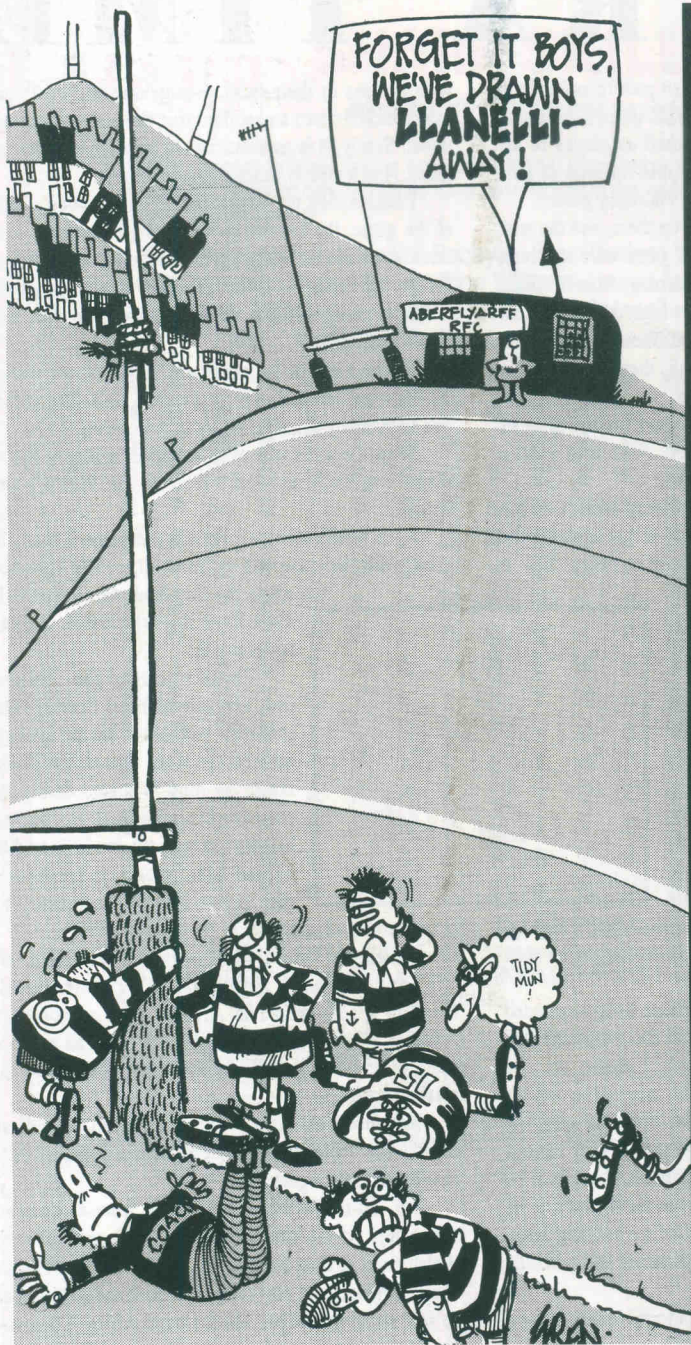
