



I have a confession. I once had a Cardiff season ticket. Howard Norris was the prototype running prop and in the club afterwards there was

No, boys, it's not that bad a sin honestly. It was free.

I don't know if they still do, but in the early sixties Cardiff gave the schools rugby union a bundle of free junior seasons to distribute.

Dai Metalwork, who ran our Under 13s decided to hold a sports quiz, winners to receive the free pass to the old Arms Park.

I was on the panel and the boys fired in the usual underarms: Which boot did Bleddyn Williams lace up first? (I have since checked with the great man and he can't be sure so heaven knows how our twelve year old second row insisted it was his left).

Who is the only man to play for all the Home Countries at The Arms Park. (Peasy. The conductor of the St Albans Band). Who had two first caps for England in 1958 and

59? (M.K.J. Smith, for rugby in 58 and cricket in 59) and so on.

I had arranged with my mate John Davey that if I was in the running towards the end he should put the

killer question. "The 1946 New Zealand forces touring team lost to two teams on tour. One was Scotland, which was the other." I swooped in triumph: "Monmouthshire at Pontypool Park". Game set and match and pass the season ticket. Still I should have known. My father played that day and was carried off shoulder high at the end. He says they chaired him off because he played a blinder. Others reckon that at five feet five inches it was to protect him from the burly New Zealanders whose passes he had a habit of intercepting.

Anyway, I feel I owe my friend John a lot. Thirty years on he is my accountant, so he makes sure I owe him a lot regularly.

And so the winter of the 63-4 season saw me at the Arms Park a lot.

I've still got the programmes. And the memories of the flying crewcut-Stevie Hughes on the wing. With willowy Maurice Richards making his way in the centre. There was Lloyd Williams at scrum half linking with brother Elwyn at flanker, Keith Rowlands a gentle ginger giant played in the second row

Howard Norris was the prototype running prop and in the club afterwards there was Dai Hayward to re-run the game for you from the captain's chair.

All those names have one thing in common, they were Cardiff stars but not Cardiff boys. Rhondda mostly. And that is what stands out in the minds of the followers of the game, that Cardiff have always been able to pull in the players under the tag line of "The greatest rugby club in the world."

To play for Cardiff was to travel stay and play first class, and that image has lasted through the modern era. Alec Evans team is still one you want to beat to show the city slickers that the rest of us know a bit about this game too.

Mind you looking back at the 63-64 fixture list it would have been nice to have a chance. The name of Pontypridd does not appear, but since the more regular meetings

began in the seventies there have been some great moments.

In fact Cardiff RFC can take part of the credit for my switch from

newspapers to broadcast journalism in 1977. The home match early in the season was a stunning display under the Sardis lights on a Wednesday night.

We won and I adjourned to the bar with my neighbour. There we fell in with a ghastly crew. Professor Dai Smith, Kim Howells PHD, added an intellectual gloss to the theories of why the upstarts had stuffed the toffs, more practical rugby reasons were supplied by Tom David and Chris Seldon. It was such a good night I clean forgot that I had promised to be in bed early because of a job interview at BBC Wales. I didn't get much sleep but I got the job despite the muddiest shoes ever seen at a BBC interview. I'm sure the clinching moment came when the London based chairman asked what television I had watched the night before. None sir, I replied there was something far more important to do. Truly Cardiff at Sardis is always an occasion. Anyone got a free season ticket handy?

Close seasons, far from being the sterile few months of nothingness that they used to be. have become even more exciting in many ways than the season itself. Since the last game here at Sardis Road we have become embroiled in plot and counter-plot, intrigue in high (and low!) places, and rumour spreading from East to West, as predicted by Shakespeare himself. All culminated in a shattering Palace revolution, as far-reaching I suppose, in its own way, as that archetypal uprising of the masses, the French Revolution itself. I hope that all the numbing inertia of the old set-up is gone for ever, though of course the new regime has yet to prove itself in the field of battle. Yet all the right noises are being made. Let us not forget though that revolutions often turn out to be not quite the new way forward promised when they are spawned. The French people stormed the Bastille in 1789, overthrowing what was the hated symbol of despotism, and this act has been seen and hailed ever since as the ultimate in decisive action at the point of impact. Yet the Bastille turned out to be no more than an outmoded symbol of where the power really lay, inhabited by a few old retainers who had been there so long that they didn't want to move when the mob invited them to lusher pastures as heroes of the Republic. It is so important for the new meritocracy to identify the right targets, and then they will carry the whole Rugby population of Wales with them as they go about their appointed task of clearing away the detritus from our rugby fields and committee-rooms.

IT'S A MAD MAD MARKET!

Then again of course, we have had the usual scramble for 'new signings', frantic every year but this year with an added element of Marx Brothers surrealism that has had me rubbing my eyes with disbelief. Club after Club, in strict order of precedence, cry out proudly that they have signed Dai Jones, or Will Evans, from one of their rivals. Not to be out-done, the depleted Clubs must then sign up some new name, or more often some old name, to even up the pre-season scoreline. Not a suggestion of money here! All is sweetness and light and love of the game, purely and active in this regard than others - Llanelli for example appear to have had a quiet time of it, making only three or four signings, and Cardiff have contented themselves with about a naphand - presumably these Clubs, as I

suggested last season, are experiencing difficulty in finding places in the stand for all these surplus-to-requirement players to sit during the game! The upshot of it all is much the same as it always is - a gentle reshuffle of the available talent achieving nothing in real terms. This, apparently is to be done with the blessing of the other Rhondda Clubs, all of whom will gladly see their own identities submerged in the name of Greater Rhondda. I wonder if Penygraig and Treherbert and Ystrad have actually been asked what their views are about this? I speak as a long-time admirer of Treorchy and one who has suffered on many occasions from a surfeit of their hospitality, but if they are indeed about to shake the world, I suspect they shall have to do it on their own!

ONLY ONES IN STEP!

Let me be true to form however, and state at once that while other Clubs have been tumbling round the transfer market like demented clowns our own Pontypridd have made some highly advantageous and farsighted decisions and have speculated wisely and well (who said I was biased?) New arrivals will find us a friendly and progressive lot - hence the numbers of ex-players who have tasted the grass next door and come home to the non-grass of Sardis (although the crop of greenery looks particularly lush this year, let me say). Some of our signings were much needed, and it is a great relief to see them, for it proves that the Committee thinking is in line with 'bob-bank' opinion, and that the Club and its supporters can see what we lacked and apparently have cured. We even reached the final of the Sevens, for what that is worth, and this must be hopeful since our track record at this particular game is something below absolute zero. All at once the season is on us, just as the sun comes out for the cricketers who have been looking in vain all season for it, the Printer demands a 'Chit-Chat' about a week before I am ready for it, the players are in place, Mr Dennis John and his staff have done their homework and the future is a blank space ready to be filled in simply! Some clubs seem to have been less by anyone who has the skill and guts and initiative to write history as they what it to be. May tonight's televised match be something that will give the game - and the season - the kick-start it wants and needs.
