THE MAN was exaggerating — but possibly only slightly — when he suggested that there was a danger of being able to predict the outcome of the Heineken League First Division by the end of September.

Certainly, Cardiff have a very tough start; home to Bridgend today, away at Pontypridd next Saturday, home to Neath the following Thursday and then a visit to Swansea on September 24. And there's more: Llanelli at home on October 1.

As you can read deeper into the programme, skipper Mike Hall and coaching organiser Alex Evans are well aware of the problems ahead after last season's magnificent SWALEC Cup success over Llanelli. Quite apart from the opposition strength in those opening matches, public expectation is also high.

In welcoming everyone back for the new season, its early start enforced by World Cup qualifying matches for Wales, we should state also that the players' expectations are high.

While there has been a fair amount of changing between clubs this summer, not a great deal of it has affected Cardiff (you will find an update in the Miscellany column) with the result that team spirit, built so high by the end of last season and encouraged by the training weekend in Jersey, will be worth a point or two.

Off the field, of course, the popular former Cardiff and Wales captain Gareth Davies has been appointed Managing Director of the Cardiff Athletic Club. Following today's chat in the programme between Mike Hall and Alex Evans, Gareth Davies will be writing in the match programme for the Neath game when we will reprint also the special Cup Final souvenir supplement.

We thank **Culver Holdings** for their support of this souvenir and for today's match sponsorship and we also thank the Western Mail for permission to reproduce their photographs.

Finally, in saying hello to our own supporters and to visitors to the Arms Park today, we welcome especially our close friends from Bridgend, the players, committee and followers who will all surely introduce the 1994-95 season with fun, flair and fair play.

EXIT, say the signs behind two of the influential men of Cardiff rugby (photographed opposite), Coaching Organiser Alex Evans and Captain Mike Hall. But that was the exit to season 1993-94, which ended with a satisfying SWALEC Cup victory over Llanelli. Today brings new challenges for the men who have been at the helm of the Cardiff revival over the past two years. What happens next? We eavesdropped on their conversation

WHAT DID THE COACH SAY TO THE CAPTAIN?

ALEX EVANS: We have to look at things realistically. We cannot simply state that we are going to win the League. But we have maintained — and hopefully soon will have strengthened — our squad and we are confident that we will do well. Other teams, on the other hand, will make sure it is even harder for us now.

MIKE HALL: After two years of captaincy, I suppose I would say that we have now achieved six or seven marks out of ten. Runners-up in the league one year, cup winners the next. We now want to challenge for both titles at once.

The biggest difference over that period has been in the growth of confidence among our senior players.

People like Jonathan Humphreys, Derwyn Jones, Andy Moore, Adrian Davies, Mike Rayer, Hemi Taylor, men like Owain Williams and Mike Budd joining to show how good they really are. Nigel, Steve, the front row... and yet there are challengers for every position.

AE: Strength in depth we now have. So much so that it is our players who have been approached by others but only one or two who perhaps could not see a future at Cardiff have actually left.

MH: Looking much further down the line, both development officers, Hemi

Taylor and Jonathan Humphreys, have really found enthusiasm at primary school level which augurs well for the club in the far future. We could really do with a third person in a similar role and I think we will have when we can afford it.

AE: Immediately, though, and starting with Bridgend today, there are going to be many sides who will stretch our skills and resources. We have a difficult start to the season with some tough fixtures and I certainly look forward to the confirmation of men like Emyr Lewis and Mike Voyle that they will join us for squad strengthening.

MH: We do have strength in reserve. Some people have said that they feel we are exposed in certain positions but they are perhaps forgetting that in the Welsh Under 21s — and they have had substantial experience now at club level — there are people like Jason Hewlett, versatility itself, Chris John at No. 10 and Simon Davies at full-back. These are first class young players eager to challenge the established men.

AE: Jason is equally good at centre or half-back. As for the "Rags", they will be rather more important than perhaps they were last season. They will be men this season who want to play in the top squad, who are perhaps recovering from injury, a bit

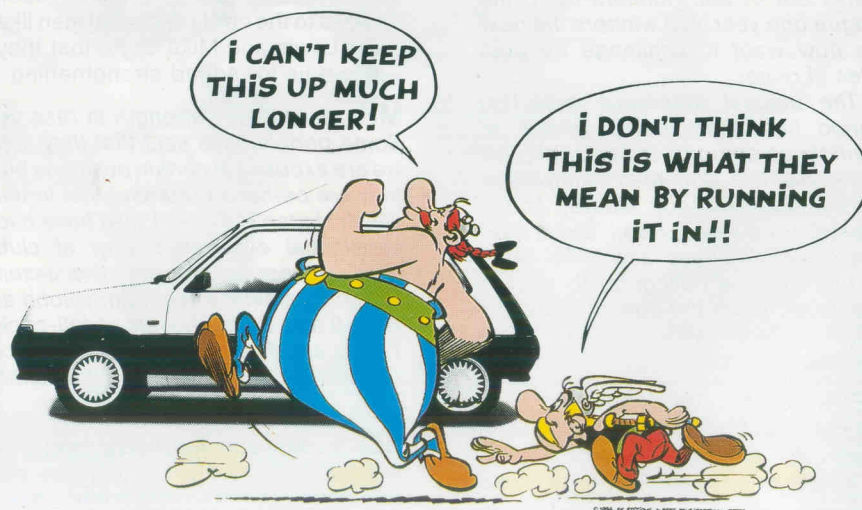

tougher than the Under 21s, maybe, but with a commitment that they wish to belong to the best club in Wales, and not just the social junketing limb of a top club.

MH: Yes, for example, if Nigel Walker had to regain confidence to score tries

AE: as if Colin Jackson was having a couple of trial hurdle races before the European Championships or Commonwealth Games.

MH: We were able to see during the squad get-together in Jersey that our spirit was excellent but there are other things that we gained from that weekend. It was primarily a fitness and skill weekend and while there were a lot of laughs to build up the spirit and it was socially successful in that the team

got on well together, they were also three-and-a-half days of intense effort.

AE: Financially, we were unable to undertake a tour like last year's to Australia but many of the senior players had had tours with representative Welsh sides and were largely fit, ready to be tuned up.

MH: There certainly one or two fitness problems. I am suffering from both Achilles tendon and wrist injuries but both are looking better now. Nigel is looking fit for rugby and Colin Laity is recovering from operations to both knees. Up front, Kevin Matthews looks like being out for the first half of the season, I fear, and Andrew Lewis has also had shoulder problems along with Chris Mills who should be ready by the end of November. 'Sedge' came

through the Jersey weekend with minimum pain and is looking better.

AE: I was encouraged by the support of our followers we had built up by the end of the season and, if we are to win anything this year, we could do with it from the start.

MH: Yes, for a time we seemed only to hear their criticism but, backed by the Junior Blue and Blacks being so well developed by Steve Cannon and his men, Cardiff followers make a fair noise nowadays.

AE. But they must not expect every match to be a running spectacular. The experience of our senior squad now allows us to play wide, up the middle or just 10 men, depending on the opposition.

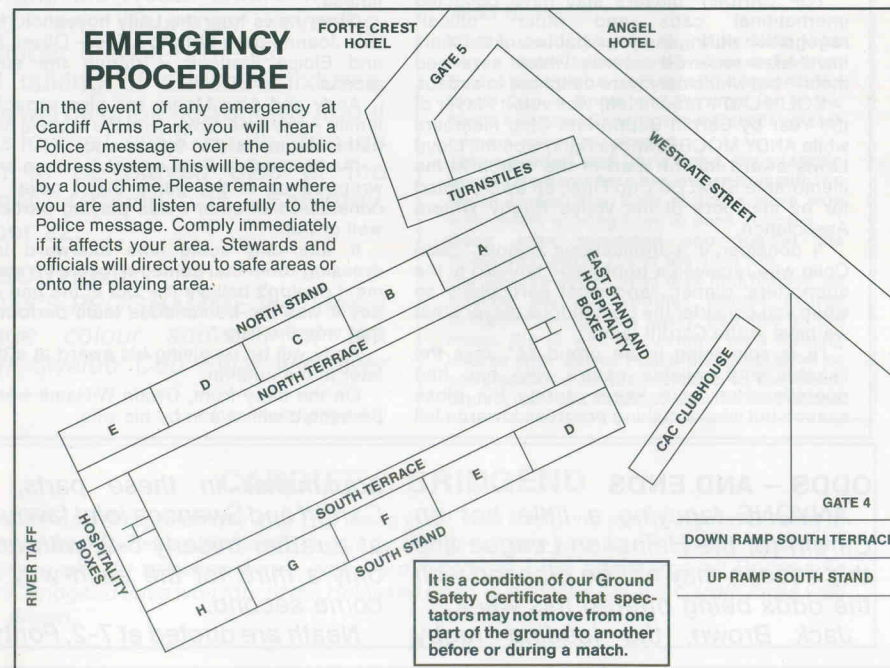
MH: The boys like to play expansively but oppositions tend to close us down because they know this with the result that we sometimes also have to tighten things up for a time.

AE: In some of the important games we won last season, it was not always through what spectators may call attractive rugby but it was largely winning rugby – and our followers like to see that, too.

I do not say categorically that we will win anything this season – but; if not, it certainly won't be for the want of trying.

It was only some time afterward in the dressing room that someone came up and told me. I couldn't believe it – but at the end of the day it was the tremendous team performance that won the Cup."

Andy will be receiving his award at a dinner later in the autumn.

ODDS – AND ENDS

ANYONE fancying a little bet on Cardiff for the Heineken League title this season may not be pleased with the odds being offered this week.

Jack Brown, the leading rugby

bookmaker in these parts, make Cardiff and Swansea joint favourites – at a rather miserly 5-2, with odds of only a third for the each-way bet to come second.

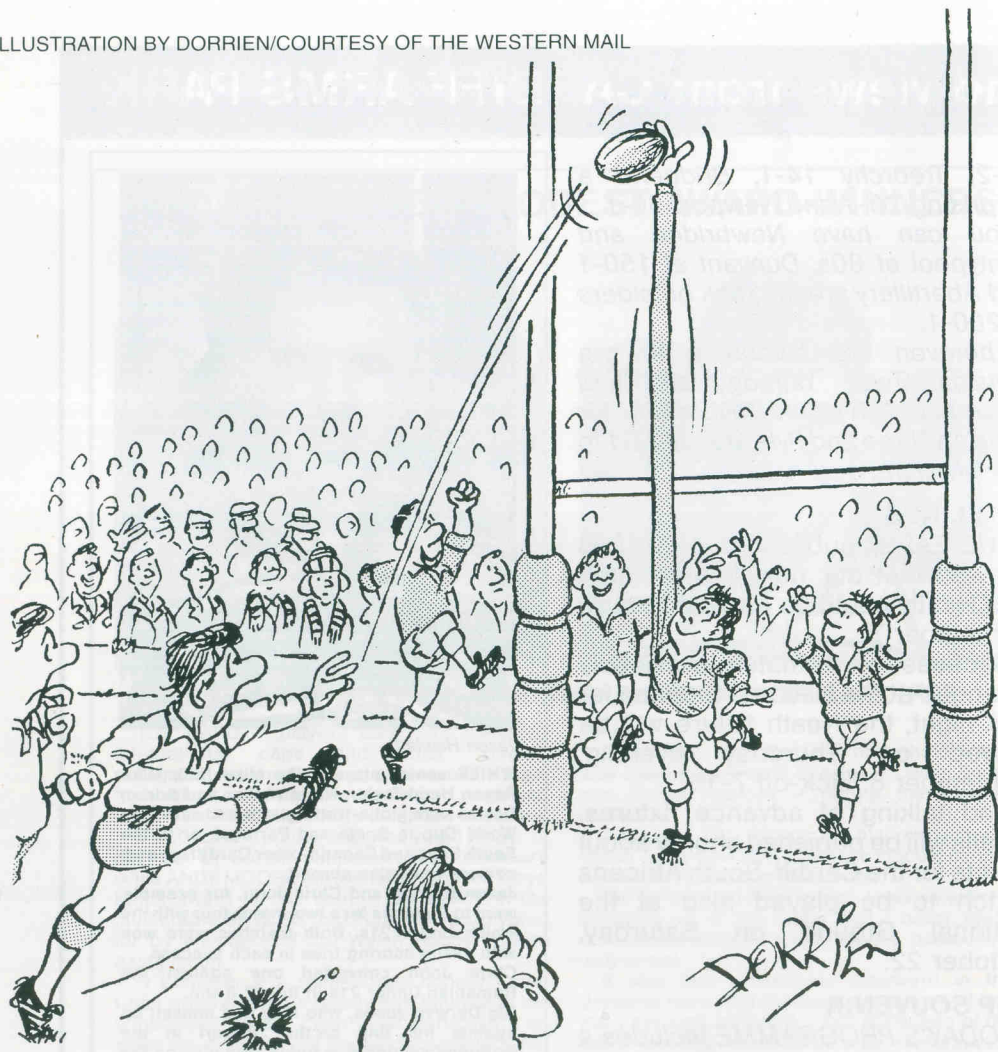
WHILE senior players like Mike Hall, Mike Rayer, Hemi Taylor, Nigel Walker and Adrian Davies were globe-trotting, either towards the World Cup in Spain and Portugal, or to the South Seas and Canada, other Cardiff up-and-comers were also abroad.

Jason Hewlett and Chris John, for example, went to Rumania for a two-match tour with the Welsh Under 21s. Both matches were won with Jason scoring tries in each success. Chris John converted one against the Rumanian Under 21s in the 12-8 win.

Big Derwyn Jones, who may find himself up against his tiny brother Rhodri in the Bridgend second-row today, was also on the move: Big D, who is currently on a training course with Gwent Police and who is to be congratulated on his elevation to the Welsh Squad, went to Zimbabwe with the Barbarians.

CARDIFF v. BRIDGEND

CARDIFF and Bridgend have met 136 times in all, with Bridgend achieving the closest to parity of all clubs who play Cardiff regularly. Bridgend have won on 57 occasions, Cardiff 65 times with 14 matches drawn, with Cardiff scoring 1425 points against Bridgend's 1229. Bridgend have won four of the Heineken League matches played, Cardiff three with one drawn.

STORY for full-back Mike Rayer to tell his grandchildren: the day he partnered Ian Woosnam to victory.

It happened during the squad's training weekend on Jersey when Mike was paired with Woosie — skipper Mike Hall being unable to play with a wrist injury — in a needle match with Gareth Davies and Peter Thomas.

Playing the La Mye championship course, Woosnam and Rayer won 4 and 3 with Mike, handicap 28 playing to a realistic 18.

KNOW THE LAWS

J. E. MALCOLM THOMAS discusses a crucial change for this season in which a new rucking law replaces the previous experimental version.



A CHANGE AT THE RUCK

An important change in Law for this season governs the refereeing of the **Ruck** (Law 21). A new section replaces the previous experimental variation.

Now, **when the ball in a ruck becomes unplayable** a scrummage shall be ordered and the ball put in by the team moving forward immediately prior to the formation of the ruck. When neither team was moving forward, or where the referee is unable to determine which team was moving forward, the ball shall be put in by the attacking team.

Before whistling for a scrummage, the referee should allow a reasonable time for the ball to emerge from the ruck, particularly if either team is moving forward. If the ruck becomes stationary, or in the opinion of the referee the ball will probably not emerge from the ruck without delay, he should order a scrummage.

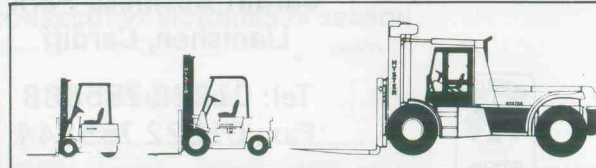
Therefore, the Ruck Law now reverts back to the original Law, before the experimental variation. The put in at the scrummage will go to the side moving forward prior to the commencement of the ruck. When neither team is moving forward the scrummage is awarded to the attacking side.

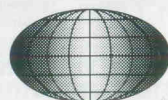

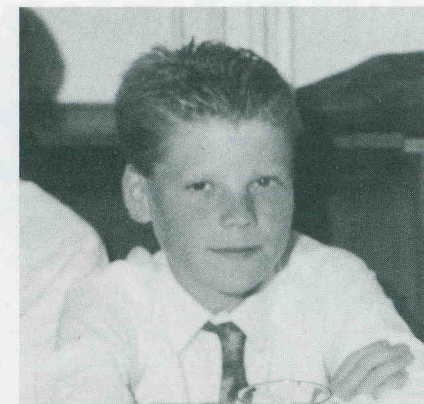

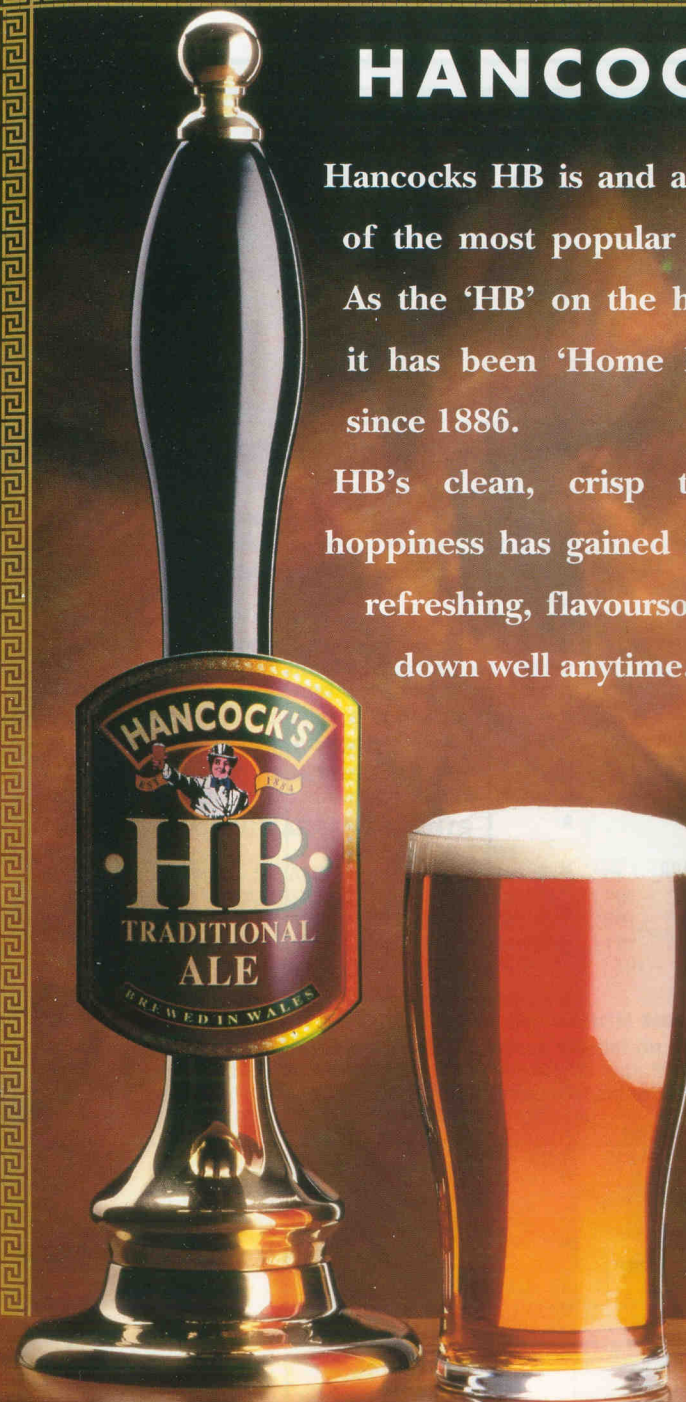
